Mexican Street Corn—Elote

6-8 ears of corn, husked

Mexican Crema, or mayonnaise (we mixed lime juice with sour cream and used this)

Cotija Cheese

Chili Powder or Smoked Paprika

2 limes

Fresh cilantro, chopped

Heat a grill to medium high and grill corn until slightly charred, just a few minutes per side. You can grill in a grill pan inside.

Remove from grill and brush with the "creama".

Sprinkle lightly with the cotija cheese, chili powder or smoked paprika (we used both) and squeeze a lime over.

Top with cilantro, and enjoy!

(I couldn't find Cotija cheese so substituted crumbled Queso Fresco.
