


Hello all,

Cypress Lakes Village- Rental Guidelines for Homeowners:

All renters must complete a Residency Application and be approved prior to arrival. *Fill out application, pay the fee (\$50 US Citizen/\$150 non-US Citizen) and provide required income verification. *All renters must be at least 55 years old. Per the community rules and regulations there are no rentals allowed within the community for less than 30 days. Upon arrival your renter will need to stop at the Sales & Administration Office to obtain a car pass for the length of their stay. It is the homeowner's responsibility to call the front gate with the renter's information to gain access to the community. Renters do not get issued north gate cards. Renters are required to follow all the community rules and regulations. A copy can be picked up at the Sales & Administration Office.







PRACTICE LIKE YOU PLAY

Let's stop that old practice routine of banging hundreds of 7 irons and hoping to find that one key that works today. That is not working so let's look at a different approach. After a good stretch and a couple loosen up swings, grab your driver and let's practice that first hole tee shot. Go ahead and hit 4 or 5 or 12. Get good at that shot. Then move to another memorable shot that you encounter each round. Maybe it's the tee shot on #15 over the water. Let's get good at that shot. You know the club. You know that short and right is bad. Long and left is bad. Play "Shots" not "Swings".

REMINDER

Golf cart paths on both North and South Courses are for golfers playing a round of golf. To ensure everyone's safety, the following non-golfing activities are not allowed during daylight hours on the course: walking, jogging, bicycling, dog walking, fishing, or non-playing golf cart rides. Daylight hours are defined as ½ hour before sunrise and ½ hour BEFORE sunset. The course will be closed to all activities 1 hour after sunset. [Dog walking is not permitted on the golf course at any time].



BCMGA

This is the fourth commandment of golf.

4. Gimmies and Mulligans. Never give a shot that matters unless it is beyond the realm of remote possibility that the player could miss it. A one-foot putt takes about as long to putt as to pick it up. The essence of the game is putting the ball into the hole, and it is a courtesy to allow that to happen whenever possible. Mulligans are never allowed. Strategy in match play sometimes requires a give-putt situation, but in reality, these "gamesmanship" maneuvers should be kept to a minimum and play allowed to take its normal course where skill and proficiency prevail over tactical machinations.

When in the sand, please rake your footprints as well as the other person who didn't. We can't make someone do what is right, but we can keep trying. When you walk from the bunker, knock the sand from your shoes. This prevents tracks on the green.





- Gear up. Reflective vests, bands, belts and sashes will help you be seen, and a whistle will help you be heard in case of an emergency. Make sure you also have your mobile phone with you in case you need to get in touch with someone for any reason
- Wear bright colors. Dark colors and dim light just don't mix. Instead, put on some brighter colors that might stand out to any oncoming traffic that might not see you if you blend into your surroundings.
- Walk against traffic. Just as important as it is for oncoming traffic to see you, it's important for you to also see oncoming traffic. It helps you make sure you stay in the clear in case others on the street aren't aware of your presence.
- Be aware. Keeping your head up and ears open while walking will help keep you safe from surprises, like other pedestrians, animals or traffic that might come out of nowhere

This month Courtesy Patrol would like to address questions you might ask when communicating with our Courtesy Patrol Team...

"How do I notify the Gatehouse I have a visitor or delivery coming to my home?"

The Gatehouse phone number is <u>863-859-7275</u>. Please call and notify us as soon as you know there is someone from the outside public coming to your home or the clubhouse to attend your meeting/function/event. We have Daily Logs to note this information plus a Pre-logbook to note your contractors, deliveries, guest list for your future meeting/function/event, guests, and visitors as far away as 3 months.

"Why doesn't someone answer my call?"

The Courtesy Patrol Team will make every effort to answer your phone call "with a smile in welcoming style" but sometimes if they are issuing a pass for your contractor, vendor, or guest in the Visitor Lane, this is impossible. Please leave a complete message with the name of your contractor, vendor, or guest and your address so we can be prepared to note this on our Daily Logs or in the Pre-logbook

"What do I do if my visitor is staying longer than 24 hours?"

The 24-hour pass can extend for 3 days. The Multi-Day Pass encompasses a visit from 3 to 29 days. A Multi-Day Form must be obtained from the Gatehouse to be completed and signed by the Homeowner for these passes. The pass does take some time to prepare, so the Courtesy Patrol Team asks that you request the pass at least 3 days prior to their arrival. The pass will be completed and waiting for them in the Gatehouse.

"What do I do when the phones are down, and I cannot get through to the Gatehouse to call in my visitor or contractor?"

Sometimes the internet goes down and when this happens, the phones go down. You may call me, Bonnie, on my cell phone at <u>863-209-2887</u> and be assured that I will pass your guest and vendor information to the Gatehouse immediately.

"What do I do if my guest wants to extend their stay past 29 days?"

Contact me, Bonnie, on my cell phone at <u>863-209-2887</u> to evaluate the circumstances. A lengthy stay may require qualification for a Renter's Pass or application for Additional Occupancy.

"What if my guest loves it here and want to rent my home?"

Homeowners who want to rent their home need to give Community Management notice of such intention prior to the intended start of the rental. An Application for Residency, eviction history, and background check must be completed and approved by Community Management with applicable fees paid and upon approval, a prospectus and a copy of the Rules and Regulations delivered with a Rental Agreement signed prior to the renter residing in your home within Cypress Lakes Village.

"What if I want to rent out my home for short term stays such as an Air B&B?"

The rental of your home in the community must be for a minimum period of 30 days and this is strictly enforced. Homeowners are prohibited from advertising in any media, including web-based media with offers to rent their home (for periods of less than 30 days).






