Housekeeping Notes

The FWC does not recommend the feeding of any wildlife. Feeding wildlife is rarely in the best interest the animals or humans in the area and can cause animals to lose their natural fear of humans, increase chances of a negative or aggressive wildlife encounter, create health issues, and alters their natural foraging and migratory behaviors. This sentiment is shared by the <u>US</u> <u>Fish and Wildlife Service</u>, the <u>US Department of Agriculture</u>, and the <u>National Park Service</u>, just to name a few.

According to Florida Statute 68A-4.001: General Prohibitions it is illegal to feed or leave food or garbage in a manner that attracts bears, foxes, coyotes, raccoons, alligators, sandhill cranes, or pelicans. If you believe someone to be committing a feeding violation, call the Wildlife Alert Hotline at 888-404-3922.

Bear in mind, feeding does not have to be intended for one of the prohibited species for a violation to occur. For example, someone leaving out bowls of cat food for stray or feral cats may still be in violation if they have knowledge that a raccoon or other prohibited species is eating from that food source and make no attempts to modify feeding to prevent the raccoon from accessing it.

The hotline is monitored 24/7 and the best time to call is while the feeding is occurring, so that officers have the best chance of responding and seeing the violation while it is occurring. Although it can be frustrating for people experiencing nuisance issues due to feeding, please remember that officers need evidence a violation has occurred, just like they would for violations of any other law. Taking a picture or video of the suspected feeding violation may help an officer build their case, but in many cases may not be sufficient evidence in and of itself. If you do have pictures or videos, be sure to notify officers of that when you call to report.

For the Holidays, come see us at the Holiday Tree Lighting where we will once again entertain the community with Dave Hansen's 12 Days take off.



Tips for Clearing Water on Hole #15:

You can see the green but there's a water obstacle between you and your goal, making for a challenging swing. Learn how to handle this tough shot with four simple tips.

The shot is relatively short — you should be able to reach the green in a single swing, but it's Hole 15 and there's a water hazard in your way. It might be a pond or a small body of water, but whatever it is could really muck up what is supposed to be an easy hole. To overcome this, keep the following tips in mind:

- Don't focus on the water, focus on the green in the distance.
- Relax! Accept that you may hit the water and decide to deal with that, if and when it happens.
- Don't watch the ball's trajectory. If you lift your head, you may lift your entire body, opening the face of the iron and popping up the ball. This will shorten your ball's distance.
- Swing smooth and stay in your swing. Commit to it. These four tips will allow you to get the most out of your swing and can help you overcome Hole #15.

BCMGA

This is the third commandment of golf:

3. Cart use. Golf carts should speed up play, not slow it down. After the tee shot, proceed to the first ball and drop off the player, then proceed, safely, to the other ball. The dropped-off player should take extra clubs, if there is any doubt. As a general rule, don't wait while the other person disembarks, hits, and re-embarks before proceeding to the next ball. Enter the cart with your club in hand and then exit the cart to your bag before hitting the next shot. No need to go the bag twice for every shot.

One of the games that BCMGA is playing this month is the team shamble game.

This is a 4-man team in which all golfers hit their own

tee shot and selects the one best tee shot among them. Then all four play their own golf balls from that best position into the hole. Total net scores for all 4 players are used. Living with Alligators - Information from Florida Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC)

Alligators are an important part of Florida's landscape and play a valuable role in the ecology of our state's wetlands. Alligators are predators and help keep other aquatic animal populations in balance. A better understanding of the facts and information regarding these creatures will help ensure that people and alligators can continue to coexist.

Alligators & People

Alligators are a fundamental part of Florida's wetlands, swamps, rivers, and lakes, and they are found in all 67 counties. Florida continues to experience human population growth. Many new residents seek waterfront homes, resulting in increased interactions between people and alligators. Although most Floridians understand that we have alligators living in our state, the potential for conflict exists. Because of their predatory nature, alligators may target pets and livestock as prey.

**PLEASE KEEP YOUR PET ON A LEASH AND NEVER LEAVE PETS UNATTENDED

[**Note from CL Management per the Community Rules and Regulations]

In the past 10 years, the Florida FWC has received an average of nearly 16,000 alligator-related complaints per year. Most of these complaints deal with alligators occurring in places such as backyard ponds, canals, ditches and streams, but other conflicts occur when alligators wander into garages, swimming pools and golf course ponds. Sometimes, alligators come out of the water to bask in the sun or move between wetlands. In many cases, if left alone, these alligators will eventually move on to areas away from people.

Generally, alligators less than four feet in length are not




Resident News

<u>CERT</u>

We have reached September. Though these next few weeks mark the peak of Hurricane Season, we have already seen our share of weather. Tropical Storm Debby produced significant flooding in the Village, and this took us all by surprise. With that much rain in that short timeframe, we could not have avoided flooding. Equally surprising was how fast the waters receded! It was evident that drainage was prepped and did its job. We wanted to provide some safety tips around flooding that we hope will be helpful:

- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention report that over half of all flood-related drownings occur when a vehicle is driven into hazardous flood water. The next highest percentage of flood-related deaths is due to walking into or near flood waters. People underestimate the force and power of water. Many of the deaths occur in cars swept downstream. Many of these drownings are preventable. Never drive around the barriers blocking a flooded road. The road may have collapsed under that water. A mere 6 inches of fastmoving flood water can knock over an adult. It takes just 12 inches of rushing water to carry away most cars and just 2 feet of rushing water can carry away SUVs and trucks. It is NEVER safe to drive or walk into flood waters.
- Flash floods are exactly what the name suggests: floods that happen in a flash! Flash floods generally develop within 6 hours of the immediate cause. Causes of flash flooding include heavy rain, ice or debris jams, and levee or dam failure. These floods exhibit a rapid rise of water over low-lying areas.
- There are many reasons that flash floods occur, but one of the most common is the result of copious amounts of rainfall from thunderstorms that cause flash flooding. This can also occur when slow-moving or multiple thunderstorms move over the same area. These sudden downpours can rapidly change the water levels in a stream or creek and turn small waterways into violent, raging rivers.



- It's best to never drive through a flash flood! You are setting yourself up to run into a downed tree or even a downed power line. Not to mention you could potentially ruin your car! Flood waters are almost impossible to tell how deep they may actually be and when you risk driving through them you are potentially causing a rescue mission if you get stuck putting more lives at risk.
- Never use electricity in a flooded home, or leave electrical items plugged in or utilities on after evacuation.
- Never go in or walk around flood water
 - You're subjecting yourself to disease, sewage and dangerous animals that may be in the murky water
- Never try to handle or help wildlife. They could become aggressive.
- Never be improperly dressed. Waders are great; shorts and t-shirts are not.

SAFETY & SECURITY


Each month that goes by during hurricane season with nothing more than some extra rain and a little wind is a blessing. Let's take the next few months in stride. In the meantime, be prepared and have a plan if a strong system comes to visit. Shelter maps cab be found in the HOA office, if you have special needs, please fill out a special needs form so the department of health can figure out what the community needs will be. Special needs can be any medical condition including being on oxygen which may need electricity.

Did you know there is a non-emergency number you can call to help with people who have fallen but are not hurt. If you or a family member needs help getting up don't hurt yourself, call 863-298-6200 and tell them you need help getting up.

Are you aware that Lakeland Electric can install a whole house surge protector? These surge protectors can save money by protecting your electrical appliances and may even help prevent fires. Installation is \$34.95 and then \$6.01/mo. Our house has been protected since 2006 when the compressor blew out due to a lightning strike. Robert Parody is trying to get a date set up for the electric company to come to CLV for a talk about surge protectors. If interested call Lakeland Electric. Another meeting being worked on is for Sunshine water to come in and talk about a few things including the new water meters that are supposed to eliminate the need for technicians to come out and read the meters. Also, if you notice that the black cover over the water shut off is broken or missing, please give Sunshine water a call and they will come out and fix it.

Lastly, please stop at stop signs and keep the speed limit of 15mph please. Also remember that the speed limit on 98 is now 45MPH.

CITIZENS ASSISTED PATROL (CAP)

When patrolling the community, it is apparent that a number of homes are empty. If it's obvious to CAP patrols that nobody is living there, then it obvious to others also.Please make sure that someone is keeping an eye on your property and knows how to contact you. We provide House Checks for residents who have requested them while they are away from Cypress Lakes. However, it's advisable to have someone pick up papers or trash from your property and check inside on a regular basis.

CAP is the eyes and ears of Cypress Lakes, but we are not law enforcement. We observe and report. Our cell phones can be used if we see something suspicious or if help is needed. We are all volunteers who reside in Cypress Lakes, full or part-time, and help is always needed. Applications to join are available in the Oak Room and may be returned to the Activities Office. FEDERATION OF MANUFACTURED HOME OWNERS (FMO)

Florida manufactured homeowners who own their homes but lease the land the house is on will get more rights with a new law which went into effect July 1st. This was part of a recently issued press release by the FMO. The bill they are referring to will assist homeowners and park owners in dispute resolution through mediation by streamlining the process in current law by avoiding some of the bureaucracy of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation. It will also clarify that a live-in assistant for health care purposes will have a background screening (as current residents must have) and not have a right of tenancy if the assistance is no longer required. FMO members wrote over 1,100 letters to legislators throughout the state in support of this bill. This is just one example of how the FMO works tirelessly in the interests of those of us living in manufactured homes on leased land.

It is vital for the FMO to build up its membership numbers as the more voters that are members of the FMO, the more our voices will be heard in Tallahassee. Please consider going to www.fmo.org and joining the FMO. \$30.00 well spent to help protect the rights of all of us living in manufactured homes in the state of Florida. The mission of Courtesy Patrol is to provide a secure, quick and pleasant entry experience into Cypress Lakes Village for our residents, guests and contractors, through accuracy and accountability with an emphasis on safety with our Rover Patrol.

This month we would like to ask, "Did you know there are many Courtesy Patrol forms to help communicate your needs?"

Courtesy Patrol utilizes several forms to organize your information to serve many different needs for residents and homeowners: Multi Day Form, Vacation & Absentee Form, and Preferred List Form. These can all be obtained from the Gatehouse.

WHAT IS THE MULTI DAY FORM?

The Multi Day Form is submitted to Courtesy Patrol for your guest who will be visiting for more than 3 days. There is space on the form to mark your information and the guest's name, arrival date, departure date with space for additional comments. A special pass is issued for your guests for up to a 29 day stay and will allow them to move through the entrance at the gate in the resident lane without stopping. We ask that the form be submitted 48 hours prior to your guest's arrival. If you have a guest staying longer than 29 days, you must go to the Sales Office and obtain a Renter's Pass for them. A background check will be done and there is no expiration date on the pass. Cypress Lakes expressly prohibits short term and one night Bed and Breakfast rental stays.

WHAT IS THE VACATION & ABSENTEE FORM?

The Vacation & Absentee Form is submitted to Courtesy Patrol when you are going to be away from your home for an extended period of time. This is particularly helpful for our Snowbirds. Important information can be included on the form such as your contact information while residing away. There is space to name a key holder for emergency access to your home and vendors such as lawncare and pest control that can be permitted access as necessary while you are away. There is space on the form for Big Cypress Golf Club Members to complete a section if you want your statement mailed to your residing address.

WHAT IS THE PREFERRED LIST & THE PREFERRED LIST FORM?

The Preferred List is a confidential database of your guests' names and your emergency contact that is stored on our computer at the Gatehouse. The Preferred List Form is initially completed to name 3 individuals or families per resident or homeowner who visit frequently. This form is also used for updates and deletions you might want from your list. There is also space to name a contact who lives in a close proximity to your home in case of an emergency. This is a real convenience for residents as you won't have to call in guests named on the Preferred List and we can pass them quickly. You can obtain all of these forms from the Gatehouse. Questions regarding completion of the forms can be called to 863-859-7275 and a Courtesy Patrol Team Member will be happy to assist you.

As we head into the Fall, your Courtesy Patrol Team would like to wish everyone a safe season "Between the Lanes".
