### Washer/Dryer

To avoid tripping and keep tidy, please do <u>not leave your laundry baskets, hangers, soap detergent on the floor.</u>

Site Improvements: Any site improvement/repairs cannot be completed without a signature from management. You will be asked to remove or undo the change(s) if result is not approved or acceptable.

### **Storage Yard**

Ignore the numbers along the fence inside the storage yard. Spot assignment will be conducted this fall/winter. Work still in progress.

### **Gym Room**

You must be 18 and over to use the workout equipment. No exceptions.

### **Parking**

Parking your vehicle in front of the clubhouse long-term/daily is not permitted.

Parking boat/trailer in the overflow by boat ramp for a long period of time is prohibited. It is a simple call to the office to avoid violation citation.

Parking on the street is not allowed per 911. No parking on grass or empty lots.

If you need to park your vehicle or boat for longer than 12 hours in the overflow parking, please let the office know so we do not bother you to move it or call towing service.

Parking vehicle on driveway must be nose in or out, not parallel.

### **MANAGER'S CORNER - Myra Carroll**

Lee County Manager Dave Harner asked communities to forward this to all homeowners (approximately 67,000) that may live in what has recently been labeled as Flood Hazard Area in Lee County post Hurricane Ian. A letter from FEMA will be forthcoming as well. In a nutshell, if the county is on probation by FEMA, it will lose five CRS rating, which includes up to a 25% discount on flood insurance.

### IMPORTANT UPDATE

### Supplemental Information about FEMA compliance letter sent to National Flood Insurance Program policy holders





The Village is aware that National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) policy holders have now received a letter from FEMA regarding their flood insurance policies.

Village staff wants residents to know they are diligently working to respond to FEMA in order to avoid probation and maintain the Community Rating System (CRS) which provides residents up to a 20% discount on their flood insurance. Any change to the 20% discount will not happen during the hurricane season and will not be effective until at least April 1, 2025.

Staff has been meeting weekly with FEMA and fully intends to provide all required documentation in order to meet FEMA's deadlines of September 16<sup>th</sup> and November 18<sup>th</sup>.

IT IS <u>EXTREMELY IMPORTANT</u> FOR ANYONE THAT HAS HAD ANY DAMAGE OR REPAIR WORK PERFORMED AS A RESULT OF HURRICANE IAN, TO OBTAIN PERMITS FOR ALL WORK DONE. ONE OF THE ITEMS THAT FEMA HAS FOUND DEFICIENT IN THE VILLAGE IS THAT SOME RESIDENTS HAVE NOT OBTAINED PERMITS FOR REPAIRS.

THIS IS JEOPARDIZING THE VILLAGE'S PARTICIPATION IN THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM (NFIP) FOR EVERYONE IN THE VILLAGE.

AFTER THE FACT PERMITS CAN BE OBTAINED. IT'S IMPERATIVE THAT ALL HURRICANE-RELATED WORK BE DOCUMENTED IN ORDER FOR RESIDENTS TO RECEIVE THE CRS DISCOUNT.
