Leesburg is fortunate to be one of the safest cities in Florida, but that does not mean we should let our guard down. Hurricane Season is active until December so stay aware and prepared. I know we are all counting the days until we are past Hurricane Season. Please remember to check on your neighbors and lend a helping hand when possible.



As the season quickly approaches, just some reminders:



There is no solicitation on HRV property. If you have someone knock on your door, please contact the office. They will be escorted off the property. Solicitation by residents is also prohibited.



Slips may not be sublet. If you sell your boat the slip assignment does not go with the boat. There is a wait list for boat slips and new assignments will be made based on the list and availability.



The speed limit is 10mph, please, observe it. Stop signs mean STOP.



Overnight visitors are to be registered with the Office and obtain a pass.



Once someone sells their home at HRV, they are no longer entitled to come in to use HRV Amenities.



Improvements to your home/site require park approval prior to the project start. Contact the office to request a review. Lake County permits are REQUIRED for most projects, be sure you are compliant. You can be fined as well as HRV.



Resident October 24/25 Car Stickers are available. When you check in, please obtain your 24/25 car sticker, update your information, provide a copy of your homes title/registration if you have not already done so, and have a copy of the registration for boat/trailer going into Storage. Stickers/gate code are for Annual Residents use only.



Projects Update. Shuffleboard canopies are complete. The shuffleboard courts have developed an issue with the white line paint. Nidy will be sending a representative out to address this. The Leisure Center flooring is complete. It is so nice not to have carpeting in the building. Reminder – food and drink are not allowed in the Leisure Center. The Outdoor Pool panic bars have arrived and are scheduled for installation. Once completed we anticipate receiving the final CO instead of the temporary CO.

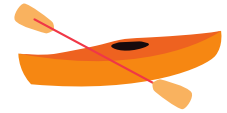
Helping Hands

Our weekly outings will resume with launches from the Marina on Wednesday, October 23rd at 10 am & October 30th at 10 am. Lunch is planned at Poolside Café both days after our paddle. If you are interested in joining us, please be at Marina kayak launch area before 10 am with your gear.

We are planning to continue paddling every Wednesday in search of birds, turtles, fish, manatees & yes, monkeys. We also hope to plan some pop-up paddles, if weather permits & people are interested. All dates & times will be posted on Facebook under "Happy Holiday Kayakers" & on the Yacht Club Board. Our adventures are open to everyone (kayaks, canoes, paddle boards, etc.). Never tried it, we can assist you. If you would like to join us but do not have a kayak, please let us know, as we may have loaners in the Park. Paddlers are encouraged to participate at their own level & at their own risk. We recommend locations & request everyone to stay with the group while paddling. If you are planning a paddle & would like some company, please post your plans with time & location on our Facebook page. Let us know of locations you think we might be able to explore. Cancellation due to inclement weather will be posted at least ½ hour prior to departure time.

When our adventures go outside the Park, we encourage ride & transportation shares to decrease the vehicles as well as to assist those with transportation needs for persons &/or crafts. If you plan to join us &/or require transportation assistance of person &/or craft, you must notify us by 5 pm the day before the scheduled paddle. We try to schedule some locations where rentals® are available for those interested, but your reservations will need to be made individually. The trips normally involve a 2 to 3-hour paddle, & we usually stop for lunch afterwards at a local restaurant. We need headcount for restaurant reservations.

All crafts must have a life jacket, paddle & whistle. We strongly encourage dressing in layers, sunscreen, water & snacks in reusable containers. A dry change of clothes is also a good idea to keep in transport vehicle. We do request emergency contact information for anyone paddling with us, just in case.

If you are not using a kayak & might be interested in loaning &/or selling, please give us your details. We would like to remind everyone they can join the Holiday Yacht Club, if you own a kayak, which is another great group of people in our HRV community. Happy Holidays.

HRVV SMOKELESS CAMPFIRE GROUP

We have been fortunate to have so many talented musicians in the Park, who also visit the Campfires to play &/or sing a tune or two. As is the nature of Campfires, people walking (or golf carting) around the Park stop to meet those at the fire & stay to hang with new friends. Some of these new friends wanted to host Campfires at their own site.

We thought it would be a great idea to try to organize weekly Campfires to just hang out & socialize together around a fire, weather permitting. As this idea started to take off, we opted to start a "HRVV Smokeless Campfire Group" on Facebook so more people could plan to join in the fun & know where the Campfires were going to be. Everyone is welcome to join our Facebook page and post the dates & times of their Campfires if they are open to the Park folks.

We heard some people never come to Campfires due to breathing problems &/or issues with smoke. To address these issues, most of our Campfires use Smokeless Firepits, so most people enjoy the fire & leave the Campfire without smoke being an issue.

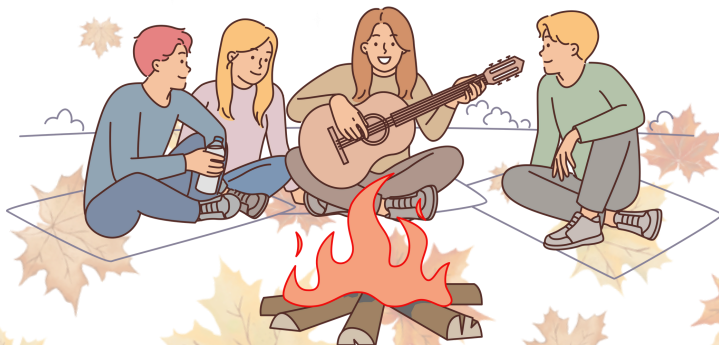
What happened next was our friend circles grew as we met new people who joined our fires & wanted to host campfires. Unfortunately, everyone does not have a site large enough to safely host a Campfire & park vehicles, safely within Park rules. We have also heard some neighbors did not appreciate having these Campfires next door, although we try to be respectful of those surrounding us but not participating.

To address this location issue, we have worked with HRVV to find a location in the Park which would meet all our needs for a Community Campfire on a regular basis. Our location will be the area around the Outdoor Stage, next to the Indoor Pool. This plan does not stop individuals from having their own Campfires at their sites, & we welcome them sharing of these Campfires on our FB Page, if they are open to the Park.

As of this writing, our first Community Smokeless Campfire of the Season will be Saturday, October 26th 7-9 pm, & we are delighted to be joined by the Jam Session Crew. Due to the busy schedule the Lifestyle Coordinator has planned for the Activity Center Area, we will only be hosting one Community Smokeless Campfire a month at the Outdoor Stage.

People are asked to bring a chair & beverage. There are picnic tables provided and plenty of room for golf cart parking. We do not provide food or beverage, but you are welcome to bring snacks. We do ask everyone to pick up after yourselves before leaving the area. All dates are subject to weather permitting. Hope to see you across the Campfire!
