<u> Managers Hot Topics</u>

<u>Communication</u> If you want to receive the latest news, you can come to the office and fill out the request form, and we will add you to the list. When I first came to RGV, we only had 400 users, now it is 829 users. For your information, Facebook, Robocalls, email blasts, and Campers APP, are how we communicate with our residents. Robocalls show up on your cell phone as CALLMULTIPLIER 877-357-3575. Many residents block that number and want us to re-enter them into the system. At this point, you will need to unblock that number to receive these calls. I hope that helps.

<u>What is a guest?</u> A guest is visiting for 2 weeks and plans on leaving at the end of their visit. If you have someone living in your home for more than 2 weeks, they will fill out an application and get approved to live in the community. It is a simple process and is necessary to keep everyone safe and it is our rule. We are finding more and more people not seeking approval to live here at Rolling Greens. Please remember this is your responsibility as a homeowner to report this to the office and do the right thing. If you do not, we will send you a letter indicating you have an unauthorized occupant living in your home. This could lead to an eviction. Please follow this rule. Thank you!

<u>Pools</u> Please make sure you shower before entering the pools. Also, when you use another pool, lake, or ocean, please wash your suit before entering our pools. That is a great way to contaminate our pools. Also please ask your guests to use the pool bands. If you need guest bands, please go to the concierge desk and they will provide you with them. We will be enforcing the pool bands this summer. Enjoy and have a great summer.

<u>Maintenance Concerns</u> Please call the office at 352-624-0140 or after-hours # 352-456-9280 if you have an emergency. If you have a maintenance issue and think it is our responsibility, please call the numbers above. We find way too many residents calling vendors without calling us first and then wanting us to pay the bill. That goes against our policy, and we will not reimburse anyone who calls a vendor first. It is our policy to send maintenance out to address your concerns. If it is our responsibility, we will fix it, or call a vendor to repair it at our expense. If the maintenance team comes out and finds it's your issue, they will tell you directly before leaving your home. Then you may call whatever vendor you wish. Moving forward no invoice will be reimbursed to a resident. This is our policy, and we will be enforcing this policy.

Maintenance Corner

Hello, I hope everyone is enjoying their summer and is ready for cooler weather! Thank you in advance for your cooperation on the matters addressed below.

<u>Yard Waste</u>

Yard Waste MUST be put out before 7:00 a.m. each Tuesday and Friday. With the wind picking up, having yard waste out the night before pickup has helped keep the community a whole lot cleaner. Thank you all who have been putting your yard waste in bags and containers. It helps us tremendously. Please trim all branches to 3 feet or less and stack them neatly so that we can pick them up without hurting ourselves. Thank you.

Sewer issues and water leaks

Please make it a point to locate your water main shutoff. If you do not know where it is or cannot find it, please call the office and one of my maintenance men will help you locate it. I am asking that if you experience a sewer backup or see a leak, please report it right away. I have received quite a few after-hours calls in the last few months about these issues only to find out the resident knew about it earlier in the day. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. Thank you.

After Hours Calls

A friendly reminder that after hours calls are only for maintenance issues. If you need other emergency assistance, please call 911. Thank you.

<u>Water Usage</u>

I have been noticing for quite some time that folks are running their irrigation way too long and way too frequently. The County has tight restrictions on when we can water our lawns. Please abide by these rules. I am currently working with St. John River Water Management regarding our community water usage. Please be mindful and adhere to the following:

- 1) Water on appropriate days as per local regulations
- 2) Water for no more than 15 minutes.
- 3) DO NOT WATER DURING RAINFALL.

Install a rain sensor on your irrigation system if you do not have one.

Ocala Irrigation Schedule

Water wisely with an irrigation schedule!

IRRIGATION DAYS

Do you adjust your irrigation days throughout the year? If not, now is the time to start. Irrigation restrictions in the City of Ocala change based on the time of year.

DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME



When Daylight Savings Time is in effect, landscape irrigation shall occur only in accordance with the following irrigation schedule and limitations:

- Odd or not numbered addresses: Wednesdays and Saturdays
- Even-numbered addresses: Thursdays and Sundays
- Non-residential properties: Tuesdays and Fridays

EASTERN STANDARD TIME



- Odd or not numbered addresses: Saturdays
- Even-numbered address: Sundays
- Non-residential properties: Tuesdays

IRRIGATION TIMES

- Residential and non-residential irrigation should not occur between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- No more than three-fourths inches of water may be applied per irrigation zone on each day that irrigation occurs, and in no event shall irrigation occur for more than one hour per irrigation zone on each day that irrigation occurs.

IRRIGATION EXCEPTIONS

- Irrigation using a micro-spray, micro-jet, drip or bubbler irrigation system is allowed anytime.
- Irrigation of new landscape is allowed at any time of day on any day for the initial 30 days after the landscape is planted, and every other day for the next 30 days for a total of one 60-day period, provided that the irrigation is limited to the minimum amount necessary for landscape establishment.
- Watering in of chemicals, including insecticides, pesticides, fertilizers, fungicides, and herbicides, when required by law, the manufacturer, or best management practices, is allowed at any time of day on any day within 24 hours of application. Watering in of chemicals shall not exceed one-fourth inch of water per application except as otherwise required by law, the manufacturer, or best management practices.
- Irrigation systems may be operated at any time of day on any day for maintenance and repair purposes not to exceed 20 minutes per hour per irrigation zone.
- Irrigation using a hand-held hose equipped with an automatic shut-off nozzle is allowed at any time of day on any day.
- Discharge of water from a water-to-air air conditioning unit or other water-dependent cooling system is not limited.
- The use of water from a reclaimed water system is allowed anytime. For the purpose of this subsection, a reclaimed water system includes systems in which the primary source is reclaimed water, which may or may not be supplemented from another source during peak demand periods.
- The use of recycled water from wet detention treatment ponds for irrigation is allowed anytime, provided the ponds are not augmented from any ground or off-site surface water, or public supply sources.

All of Marion County, including the City of Ocala, is to follow the St. Johns River Water Management District (SJRWMD) restrictions. The only exceptions are The Villages and the City of Dunnellon, which should follow restrictions of the Southwest Florida Water Management District. 
