The community encountered some minor flooding and minimal damage, as we persevered through



the storm and got the community back on track. Many thanks to our stormwater and wastewater vendor, Novak Environmental Solutions for ensuring our sewage and freshwater were in fact working with very minimal issues. Other areas of Sarasota were not as lucky and experienced major flooding. Another "Special" thank you to our lifestyle department and to our own Arlene Kretzmer for assisting with notifications through our social media page and the HOA media page to keep our residents updated. As we are in the primary peak month for Hurricanes, please remain vigilant and ensure that you have a plan in place in the event a major storm comes our way.

I WANT TO BRING TO YOUR ATTENTION THAT AUTOMATED GARBAGE COLLECTION SERVICE IS COMING TO UNINCORPORATED SARASOTA COUNTY IN MARCH 2025. THIS PROCESS IS USED BY WASTE HAULERS TO COLLECT MATERIAL MORE EFFICIENTLY AND SAFELY FOR DISPOSAL BY USING MECHANICAL ARMS TO EMPTY THE CONTENTS FROM THE CONTAINERS. SARASOTA COUNTY HAS ADVISED THAT RESIDENTS CAN SELECT THEIR PREFERRED GARBAGE CART SIZE BETWEEN NOVEMBER 11, 2024, THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2024. EACH RESIDENCE WILL RECEIVE ONE GARBAGE CART WITH THE OPTION TO SELECT A 95-GALLON, 65 GALLON OR 35 GALLON CART. THIS IS INCLUDED AS PART OF THE ANNUAL NON-AD VALOREM TAX ASSESSMENT COLLECTED THROUGH THE PROPERTY TAX BILL. SAMPLE CARTS WILL BE ON DISPLAY BETWEEN NOVEMBER 8, 2024 TO DECEMBER 31, 2024, AT THE FOLLOWING LOCATIONS:

- Elsie Quirk Library, 100 W Dearborn St., Englewood
- Fruitville Library, 100 Apex Road, Sarasota
- Robert L. Anderson Administration Center, 4000 S Tamiami Trail., Sarasota
- Sarasota County Administration Center, 1660 Ringling Blvd., Sarasota

Continue to follow current disposal guidelines for collection service through March 28, 2025. Manager's Corner - Cont'd

Beginning September 3, 2024, we will begin 360 notices for All homes in the community. You will either receive a letter thanking you for the upkeep of your home, or a notice advising you of the areas of concern that require attention. Letters will begin with the homes that require the most attention and will be completed with those homes that are immaculate. The areas of concern that we will be reviewing are as follows:

- Mold on home
- Gutters not cleaned
- Faded driveway that require painting
- Items not properly stored under the carport/driveway/around the home
- Weeds in planters or around the home
- Overgrown landscaping
- Missing siding
- Dirty driveway
- Overall condition of home

Lot fee collection for the month of August decreased with only thirteen letters sent. Four notices of eviction were sent, and those amounts have been addressed or payment plans have been setup. Please remember that we cannot assist you if you do not reach out to request assistance. We want to make sure we understand your situation and provide a solution if needed. In addition, please remember that you can make your payment through the Resident Portal, EFT, drop of box (located at the front of the clubhouse) or in person. Please ensure that your account is paid up to date as it will incur additional fees. Late fee notices are sent out on the 12th of each month. If you are unsure of what your monthly amount is, please do not hesitate to contact the office. If you are having hardships, please contact the office to discuss your account. Failure to pay the monthly amount required can result in eviction.







Fun Facts About September

- The name "September" comes from an old Roman word, "septem," which actually means 7. That's right – September was the seventh month of the year on the Roman calendar – It did not become the ninth month until the advent of the Gregorian calendar.
- The Romans believed that September was looked after by the god of fire. So they always expected fires and volcanic eruptions to occur during this month.
- Out of all 12 months of the year, September is spelled with the most letters. It contains nine letters, and it happens to be the ninth month of the year. No other months have the same amount of letters as their number in the calendar year.
- This September "Harvest Moon" is the fullest moon of the year. When you gaze at it, it looks very large and gives a lot of light throughout the entire night. No other lunar spectacle is as awesome as the Harvest Moon.
- The first day of fall is typically on September 22 or September 23 in North America. This is when the hours in the day are almost equal to the hours in the night. This occurs at the same time as the Spring Equinox does in Australia.
- A little-known, but highly significant holiday falls in September. September 17th is Constitution Day, which marks the day that the U.S. Constitution was adopted.
- There are more pop and classic songs with "September" in the title than any other month.

- September is known as Harvest Month. It's a great month to harvest in preparation for the coming winter months. In fact, in Old England, it was called "Haervest-monath", meaning Harvest Month. Some of the best crops to harvest are onions, apples, raspberries, and tomatoes.
- Zodiac signs in September are split between Virgo (August 23 September 22) and Libra (September 23 – October 22).
- Virgos are known for being loyal, practical, thoughtful, analytical people who sometimes come off as cold, but it's only because they're taking a methodical approach to friendship (like most aspects of their lives).
