Bob graduated from Belding High School in Michigan in 1958 then attended Ferris State College for 4 terms or semesters. On September 5, 1963 Bob was drafted into the Army. Even though he was married he was still drafted. Shortly after being drafted a law was passed not to draft married men so men were lining up to marry so they wouldn't be drafted while others went north to Canada. Bob went through Basic Training in Fort Knox, Kentucky then was sent to Fort Polk in Louisiana. There he was put through training for marching in a parade on November 22, 1963. Bob said they didn't know what happened and were marched back to the barracks. That was the day that President John F. Kennedy was shot so everything was put on hold.

Bob was assigned to the Land Navigation Committee and ended up being an instructor teaching the use of Map and Compass. Bob was on the Rifle Team, ran in one track meet in San Antonio, TX and drove a water truck and watered down trainees while in training. Bob was also a gunner in a Tank on Patrol stating that this was very dangerous.

Bob tried out for the EIB Award, the Expert Infantry Badge. He explained that it involved numerous challenges but he did it and succeeded. Out of approximately 160-170 that tried out only 6-7 made it. Quite an achievement Bob!

Later Bob worked at the Officers Club as a bar waiter, the pay being \$0.75 per hour and he walked one mile to and from work. Bob attended Mardi Gras saying it was dangerous even at that time. He made Sargent and became a squad leader. Bob was discharged on September 4, 1965 as an E5.

Bob mentioned that after discharge he joined the American Motorcycle Association and the Michigan Hill Climbers Association, becoming the President of the motorcycle club. Every Sunday approximately 125 cycles of all classes, men and women, would race cycles up hillsides with trophies for winners. Bob said he was competitive and semiprofessional. He raced with Triumphs and Yamahas. He did this from 1966-1968. Bob still owns a 1969 500cc Kawasaki, bought brand new, he doesn't ride it just talks about it. He also has 1972 175cc Kawasaki and a 1984 400cc Suzuki that he gave to his grandsons.

Bob went to 2 summer camps, one at St. Cloud, Minn and the one at Camp Graling in Michigan. He worked as an Ironworker out of Local 25 in Detroit, Michigan and retired in 1995. He was a trustee and on the Examining Board. Bob also attended the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, Georgia.

Bob has one son and one daughter, 6 grandchildren and 5 great grandchildren. He and partner Donna Sutton have been together for 11 years and live at Holiday RVV year round.

It has been a long October already with a week to go. I would like to share with you a picture of the last few weeks through my experience and eyes. Prepare, prepare, prepare – how do you truly prepare for a Hurricane? No matter how much you prepare a Hurricane is a force like no other. It is a double-edged sword. You pray that your people and community will be spared, but you know someone else will be hit. As the storm approaches, each hour seems like a day. Why is it that hurricanes hit in the dark of night? Oh, it gives you time to prepare for what you will see in the light of day. You keep telling yourself you need to sleep to prepare for recovery. Who sleeps as the king of destruction is headed toward our community? You start to hear the wind ripping across the roof and trees cracking and falling. The minutes seem like hours and the hours like days as you wait for the light of day to see the destruction left in its path. Prepare??? for what I would find? I prayed that everyone was okay, but my heart grew heavy as I assessed the property. It was difficult making my way around as so many streets were closed due to downed trees or metal carports/debris that you were not even sure where it came from. As I made my way slowly through the community, my greatest fears were realized when I came upon several homes with uprooted trees resting on them. Fortunately, the residents were not home. They say a picture is worth a thousand words. Not in this case. The pictures do not even begin to provide a true picture of what I saw during those first hours of driving around the park. Recovery started immediately and it made for many long hard days. I am so grateful for our HRV Team and am proud of their determination to recover from the effects of Milton. The outpouring of support from residents, relatives, and vendors giving of their own time and expense was amazing. I cannot express my gratitude for your caring and support. As I look back, the most comforting thing I can focus on is that we did not have a loss of life. Looking forward, we are still working at total recovery, but it will come. Please be patient as the vendors secure equipment and can address the outstanding issues. The power surges were rough on electronic equipment and the tree limb could not have fallen 2 feet in the other direction away from the Activity Center a/c condenser. We are also waiting on a contractor to come to address the Comfort Station Roof issues.

As we head back into season......


