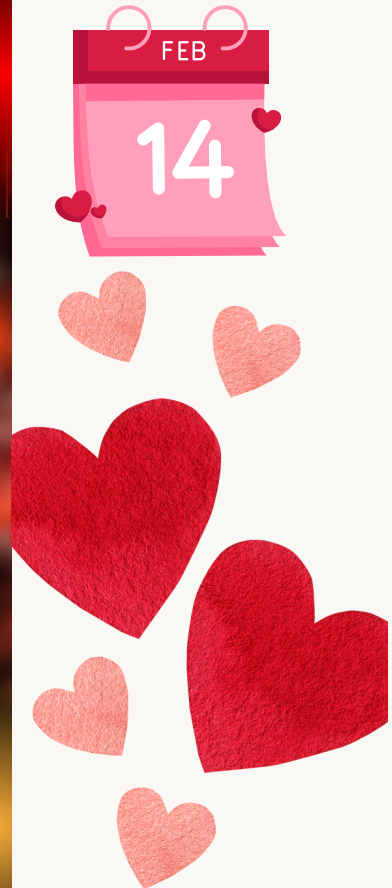

A few items that are consistently brought up in the Manager's meeting; speeding and not stopping at stop signs, parking in front of Ken Jones Building (aka mail room), dogs barking and/or not on a leash, laundry machines used to wash dog blankets and beds then left full of hair and Fast Wave internet. Fast Wave utilizes Comcast lines. During the off season a new fiber optic line was run to replace the existing line. To date that line has not gone live but we continue to push for that to happen. I hope the New Year finds everyone healthy. Due to personal illness myself I was unable to meet and interview with a veteran this month.

I thought I would take this opportunity to share about the veterans in my life. I personally was not in the military. My dad was in the Naval Reserves in the late fifties/early sixties. He passed away in 2008 therefore I have no specifics.

My great uncle was the 2nd Chief Master Sergeant of the Air Force Donald L. Harlow from 8/1/1969 to 10/1/1971. CMSAF is a unique non-commissioned rank in the USAF. The holder of this rank and position of office represents the highest enlisted level of leadership in the Air Force.

My husband, Edward, worked for the naval shipyard Bath Iron Works in Bath, Me. He was a Marine Designer, working in the planning yard on designs on Naval Ships already in service. When any new changes came about, he would be sent on "ship checks" for future installs of new designs to the ships in their home ports or abroad. Bath Iron Works builds FFGs - Frigate Guided Missile Class, CGs - Cruiser Guided Missile Class and Arleigh Burke Class Destroyers - DDGs - Guided Missile Destroyer.

Thank you for letting me share a little about my family. I have been blessed with the opportunity to meet and talk with Veterans. Kentuckian Reminiscing

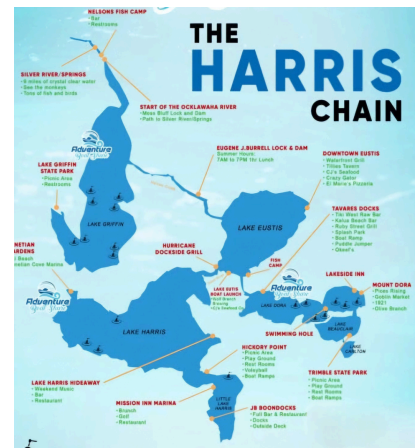

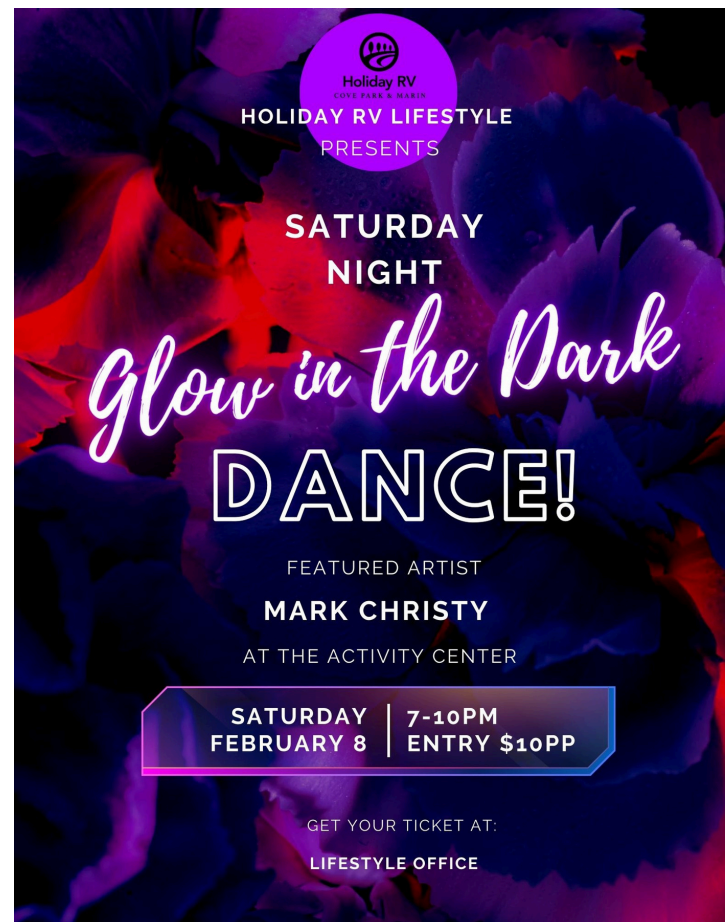
2025 Holiday RV Olympic Schedule of Events

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS:

Q. I am new to the park. When can I use the shuffleboard courts?

A. The shuffleboard courts are available to all residents at all times. Rare exceptions are tournaments and special events. The courts may be lit for night play.

Q. Do I have to have my own equipment?

A. No, all equipment (cues, disks and beads) is available in the clubhouse next to the courts.

Q. When is organized play?

A. Tuesday and Friday is regular shuffleboard play. Saturday is Build-A-House and Sunday is Pin Shuffle. Sign in each of these days is at 12:30. Play starts at 1:00 and normally ends around 3:30 4:00.

Q. I have not played much. How do you recommend that I get started?

A. Lessons or refreshers are given each Saturday at 9:30 am. I recommend that you start there and then possibly join the club to play a game of Build-A-House that afternoon. That is a good game to practice your shot execution.

Q. Can anybody join the shuffleboard club?

A. Yes, after 3 free days of play, annual dues of \$15 are required.

Q. What does the club membership give me?

A. It allows members to participate in club events on an ongoing basis.; It also allows participation in District and State Tournaments which are sanctioned by the Florida Shuffleboard Association that may be played anywhere in the State.

Q. If I join, do I have to play all the time?

A. No, you can play as much or as little as you wish. The only thing that we ask is that once you sign up for daily play that you play until the end of that session.

Q. Do Holiday Shufflers play outside the park?

A. Yes, we play regularly at other clubs and parks.

Q. I am not a very good player. Will I have to play against really good players?

A. Yes, by playing against a mix of players from different skill levels this will improve your own level of play. We have a very supportive group that strives to advance players to the best of their abilities. Lessons are given every Saturday morning at 9:30. Why not give it a try?

- The rest of the floor, called the middle or inside, is open for line dancers, swing, cha cha, rumba, freestyle, slow dancing – any type of dance that doesn't progress around the floor.
- Please don't carry drinks onto the dance floor. This is a safety issue, just a little moisture on the floor can cause people to slip.
- If you are not dancing, please don't stand on the dance floor.

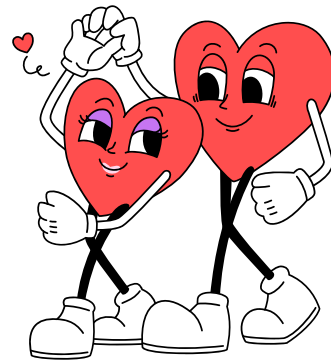

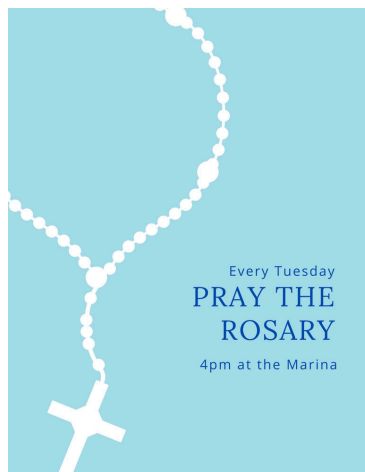

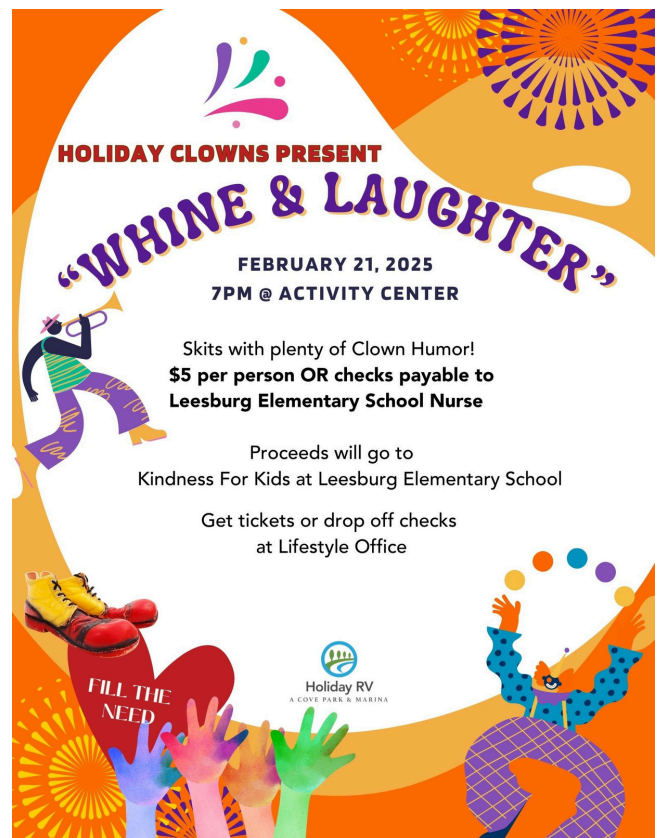
