LENDING CLOSET

Before you purchase any necessary Durable Medical Equipment:

Check with the Strawberry Ridge Village Lending Closet, located at the Clubhouse, which provides medical equipment to our residents upon request. Call us and one of our volunteers will be happy to assist you by providing many of your needs on an available basis. This service is at no cost to our residents, is a great cost-saving measure, and the loan of the equipment has no time limit. You may keep the equipment if it is necessary.

We have wheelchairs, transfer chairs, crutches, canes, walkers, bed rails, potty chairs, and shower chairs. These items are available for all our residents to borrow. Donations of the mentioned items are also accepted. There are limits on the type of supplies we can accept. We cannot accept respiratory items, diapers, walking boots, medications, stability belts or other disposable items. All that we ask is that when returning borrowed items or donating items please ensure that all items have been cleaned and are fully operational. The volunteer staff does not have the ability to clean or repair any items. Presently, the Lending Closet is in short supply of Rollator Walkers. Any donation of or return of one no longer needed would be appreciated.

She was a 1996 Olympic torchbearer. She has competed in local, national and international competitions. She continues to compete in Masters Swimming competitions on occasion.

Strategies for a Stress Free Life at Strawberry Ridge!

These days and one the greatest problems during water outages is not having water for Flushing and drinking, right? Did You know that the internet thingy says it takes approximately 2 gallons or less of water to flush most toilets and the average person needs 1 gallon of drinking water per day? So what if I told you that you could solve BOTH problems for 15 bucks. The first thing you have to do is ACCEPT that Water outages will occur AND that the only person who can mitigate the situation is YOU not the Office or the Government. The second thing you must do is to be prepared. To buy a gallon of bottled water in Valrico starts at \$1.25 (Dollar Tree) so for \$15 you can get 10 gallons of water to use as an emergency drinking water supply. Also, if you drink milk or other drinks that use one gallon plastic bottles you can rinse the container out and refill with tap water to use for non-drinking purposes, like flushing or hand washing. Keep all the water in a temperature controlled location like a hall or bedroom closet for best results. 10+ gallons of non-drinking water and 10+ gallons of Drinking water will go a long way in reducing the stress of a water outage and that's the Key. Start prepping now, Kids!

Suggestion: Ask your neighbors or family members for any of their extra clean milk or water Jugs to quickly stock your emergency non-drinking water supply. When you borrow empty jugs from your neighbors you can let them know what you are doing and why so they can also be better prepared for the next outage as well! In addition, It's better to buy drinking water because it's in sealed containers, and If you prefer to buy smaller water bottles in cases that's fine too!

10+ gallons of Drinking water On hand plus 10+ gallons of Non-Drinking water On hand

= LESS STRESS DURING WATER OUTAGES






