




"Love Redesigned" by Lauren Asher

Chani Horowitz is a writer in her 20s struggling to make ends meet, until she meets Gabe Parker. When she's hired to write a profile of her longtime celebrity crush, her career transforms. 10 years later, his PR team requests that the two reunite for an interview and she decides it's time for closure.

Throughout the book, readers get to delve into Chani and Gabe's relationship through flashbacks, articles, interviews and blog posts in Sussman's unique writing style. Readers will be immersed into Chani's media-induced life and stories. Whether or not the audience are aspiring journalists, they will appreciate the beauty of this story from start to finish.


"One True Loves" by Taylor Jenkins Reid


Acknowledged for her works of historical fiction, the author of "Daisy Jones & the Six" explores finding love in this stand-alone novel.

Though everything seems to be going well, things take a turn once again when Jesse is found alive. It turns out that he's been trying to reconnect with Emma for years, and for the remainder of the novel, Emma is left to grapple with whether she wants her husband, or her fiancé.

This work of fiction poses the question of whether you can only have one true love. Reid has steadily mastered the art of creating a heartbreaking and simultaneously bittersweet tale of what it means to give love and to receive it.






"Seven Days in June" by Tia Williams





Three Ingredient Carrot Cake

Ingredients

- 1 20oz can of crushed pineapple in its own juice
- 1 box of Duncan Hines Decadent Carrot Cake Mix
- ³⁄₄ cup plain fat-free, Greek yogurt
- butter

Instructions

1. Pour the entire can of pineapple (fruit and juice) into a 4 cup mixing bowl. Add the contents of the carrot and raisin pouch, stir, and let sit for 5 minutes (or longer).

2. Meanwhile, set your oven rack to the vertical center and preheat the oven to 350F. Coat the inside of a 13x9 cake pan with a thin, even, layer of butter or non-stick spray. Dust the inside of the pan with flour, tap the sides to cover the entire surface, shake out any excess flour.

3. In a large mixing bowl add the contents dry cake batter pouch, the pineapple mixture, and the yogurt. Fold the ingredients together until they are fully combined with no pockets of dry mix. The batter will be very thick.

4. Spread the batter in an even layer in the cake pan and bake for 35 minutes. When baked the center should be sticky but firm to the touch. Let the cake cool completely before decorating and serving.

Notes

This cake is very moist and sticky. When serving use a sharp knife and wipe the blade clean between each cut.









Valentine Cake Recipe

CARROT CAKE

What is carrot cake?

A carrot cake is cake that contains carrots which have been mixed into the batter. Most modern carrot cake recipes have a white cream cheese frosting but there are lots of options and varieties out there.

Carrot cakes can now be made gluten free, vegan, Paleo and there are many other options that fit into most diet plans.

The carrots add more nutrition value, fiber and texture than a normal cake recipe has.

FOR CARROT CAKE

- 2 cups (260g) all-purpose flour, spooned and leveled
- 2 teaspoons baking soda, important to level the teaspoon, see tips
- 1/2 teaspoon fine sea salt
- 1 ½ teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1 ¼ cups (295ml) vegetable oil
- 1 cup (200g) granulated sugar
- 1 cup (190g) lightly packed brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 4 large eggs, at room temperature
- 3 cups (300g) grated peeled carrots, 5 to 6 medium carrots
- 1 cup (120g) coarsely chopped pecans
- 1/2 cup (70g) raisins

FOR CREAMY FROSTING

8 ounces (225g) cream cheese, at room temperature

- 2 teaspoons cornstarch, optional
- 1 ¼ cups (140g) powdered sugar
- 1/3 cup (80ml) cold heavy cream, not plain whipping cream, see tips 1/2 cup (50g) coarsely chopped pecans, for topping cake





Directions

. BAKE CAKE

Position a rack in the middle of the oven. Preheat the oven to **350°F** (176°C).

Grease two 9-inch round cake pans, line the bottom with parchment paper, and then grease the top. Or grease and flour the bottom and sides of both pans.

Whisk flour, baking soda, salt, and cinnamon in a medium bowl until very well blended.

In a separate bowl, whisk the oil, granulated sugar, brown sugar, and vanilla.

Add the eggs, one at a time, whisking after each one. Switch to a large rubber spatula. Scrape the sides and bottom of the bowl, then add the dry ingredients in three parts, gently stirring until they disappear and the batter is smooth. Stir in the carrots, nuts, and raisins.

Divide the cake batter between the prepared cake pans. Bake until the tops of the cake layers are springy when touched and when a toothpick inserted into the center of the cake comes out

clean, 35 to 45 minutes.

Cool the cakes in the pans for 15 minutes, then carefully turn the cake layers out onto cooling racks. Remove the parchment paper and cool completely. If you find that a cake layer is sticking to the bottom of the pan, leave the cake pan upside down and allow gravity to do its thing.

FROST CAKE

In a large bowl, beat the cream cheese with a handheld mixer on medium speed until smooth and creamy, about 1 minute. Beat in the powdered sugar and cornstarch. I like sifting the powdered sugar and cornstarch over the cream cheese to remove lumps. If you do not have a fine mesh sieve, beat in the cornstarch and powdered sugar a 1/4 cup at a time until combined.

Pour in the heavy cream. Beat on medium speed for 2 to 3 minutes or until the frosting is whipped and creamy. This frosting resembles the texture of whipped cream. Chill covered until ready to frost the cake.



When the cake layers are completely cool, frost the top of one cake layer and place the second cake layer on top.

Add the remaining frosting to the top of the carrot cake and use a butter knife or small spatula to swirl the frosting around. Leave the sides of the cake unfrosted. Finish with a handful of nuts on top.

STORING

Frosted carrot cake lasts in the refrigerator for up to 1 week. I keep it covered with plastic wrap or use a cake keeper, or large bowl turned upside down to cover the cake. I do not recommend freezing frosted carrot cake (the frosting does not thaw well). You can refrigerate unfrosted cake layers for up 5 days or freeze them for up to 3 months. Thaw overnight in the fridge before adding your frosting.

- Measuring the flour: Either weigh it or use the "spoon and level" method: Fluff the flour, spoon it into the measuring cup, then level off the top with a flat edge. See our video for a demonstration.
- Baking soda: When measuring, dip your spoon into the container, then level it off using the straight edge of one of your other spoons. For the best results, use fresh baking soda (it loses its potency after being opened for 6 months).
- Traditional cream cheese frosting: In a large bowl, beat 16 ounces of cream cheese and 1/2 cup of softened butter together for a minute or two until smooth. Add 4 ½ cups of powdered sugar, 1 ¼ teaspoons of vanilla extract, and a pinch of salt. Beat for 2 to 3 minutes until extra creamy. If it is too thick, add 1 tablespoon of cream or milk.
- How to make carrot cake cupcakes: This recipe makes 24 cupcakes. Bake them for 14 to 18 minutes and allow to cool in the cupcake pan before cooling completely on a wire rack. You may also like this recipe for carrot cake cupcakes.
- To make a large single-layer cake, add all the batter to a 9 x 13-inch rectangular pan and bake. The bake time may be slightly longer. A 10-cup or 12-cup bundt pan should also work, but expect the bake time to increase by 30%.
- Adding pineapple: I like fresh chopped pineapple or drained canned pineapple. Do not add more than 1 cup.









- Heavy cream (US bakers): Heavy cream has more milk fat (about 36%), while whipping cream has less (around 30%). Use "heavy cream" or "heavy whipping cream." Plain "whipping cream" does not whip as well and can cause your frosting to be too soft. If you only have whipping cream or cream with less than 35% fat content: If you only have whipping cream or are unsure what you have in your kitchen, whisk it in a separate bowl until soft peaks. Add a couple of spoonfuls of the whipped cream to the beaten cream cheese mixture and combine to loosen. Then, fold in the remaining whipped cream.



No one controls the event and activities calendar. Ideas are shared, a consensus reached, and many successful events and activities have been the product of such meetings. A win-win! The May calendar had many new, original events thanks to residents coming forward, making the suggestion, then taking the lead in the planning.

Presently, we have 41 ambassadors, who not only plan events and activities, but also volunteer to set up, shop, and clean up from activities. That's teamwork!

It's not a control issue, but rather consideration for both parties and accommodating both landlord and residents, to avoid conflicts.

I do hope that this has clarified some misconceptions about holding events, planning activities, so we might all come together for the betterment of the park and residents. So please, if you have an idea for an event, please come see me, and you can lead the event to fruition, with help from Cove and other ambassadors!




