VOTE REQUIRED FOR BY-LAW AMENDMENTS



All that we ask is that when returning borrowed items or donating items please ensure that all items have been cleaned and are fully operational. The volunteer staff does not have the ability to clean or repair any items. Presently, the Lending Closet is in short supply of Rollator Walkers. Any donation of or return of one no longer needed would be appreciated.



More Strategies for a Stress-Free Life at Strawberry Ridge Village

Basic Power Outage Preparedness: We must accept the fact that power outages will occur and it's up to us to be prepared and not rely on the Cove office or Government Agency. It's also a reality that during the non-hurricane season power outages may be short but will be long enough to be a definite inconvenience, but if you are ready for One then you'll be prepared for anything that comes your way! So, in any power outage, you need to focus on your basic needs AND have a proactive action plan:

<u>Lights:</u> Place battery operated lights in every room in a known location so they can be easily obtained in the dark.

Water: Have 10-15 gallons of drinking water and the same amount of water for flushing and handwashing.

Food: To be best prepared you should have 3-5 days' worth of food ready to go in emergencies. In general, you should focus on having non-perishable foods like canned vegetables, soups, nuts, and meats. A Small propane stove to heat canned goods could be helpful if you think you can manage one.

<u>AC:</u> If you don't have a generator then small battery-operated fans will help a lot. Lights and fans powered by a small generator, if you have one, will greatly reduce the stress of a power outage as well.

<u>First aid</u>: If something is going to happen the most likely time is when you least expect it like during a power outage. So, a first aid kit can be important in an outage in case there is an injury.

<u>Cold Storage</u>: Make sure your freezer is full and it'll stay frozen for many hours but even so only open your freezer/refrigerator only if you have to.

Personal: Call your friends or family to let them know you are ok.

<u>Safety:</u> Try to avoid using candles as they are a great fire hazard. If you do have to use them, make sure to keep them well away from flammable items.






