They may not always be able to get into your phone (if you keep a list there).

The mission of Courtesy Patrol is to provide a secure, quick and pleasant entry experience into Cypress
Lakes Village for our residents, guests, visitors and contractors, with accuracy and accountability and an
emphasis on safety with our Rover Patrol.

This month we would like to ask, "Did you know there are many Courtesy Patrol forms to help communicate your needs?" Courtesy Patrol utilizes several forms to organize your information to serve many different needs for residents and homeowners: Multi Day Form, Vacation & Absentee Form, and Preferred List Form. These can all be obtained from the Gatehouse.

WHAT IS THE MULTI DAY FORM?

The Multi Day Form is submitted to Courtesy Patrol for your guest who will be visiting for more than 3 days. There is space on the form to mark your information and the guest's name, arrival date, departure date with space for additional comments. A special pass is issued for your guest for up to a 29 day stay and will allow them to move through the entrance at the gate in the resident lane without stopping. We ask that the form be submitted 48 hours prior to your guest's arrival. If you have a guest staying longer than 29 days, you must go to the Sales Office and obtain a Renter's Pass for them. A background check will be done and there is no expiration date on the pass. Cypress Lakes expressly prohibits overnight and short-term Bed and Breakfast rental stays – Rentals must be no shorter than 3 months.

WHAT IS THE VACATION & ABSENTEE FORM?

The Vacation & Absentee Form is submitted to Courtesy Patrol when you are going to be away from your home for an extended length of time. This is particularly helpful for our Snowbirds. Important information can be included on the form such as your contact information while residing away. There is space to name a key holder for emergency access to your home and vendors such as lawncare and pest control that can be permitted access as necessary while you are away. There is space on the form for Big Cypress Golf Club Members to complete a section if you want your statement mailed to your residing address.

WHAT IS THE PREFERRED LIST & THE PREFERRED LIST FORM?

The Preferred List is a confidential database of names of your family and friends who visit frequently and an emergency contact that is stored on our computer at the Gatehouse. The Preferred List Form is initially completed to name 3 individuals or families per resident/homeowner who visit frequently. This form is also used for updates and deletions to your list. There is also space to name a person you trust as a key holder, who lives in proximity to your home in case of an emergency. This list is a real convenience for residents as you won't have to call in those named on the Preferred List and we can pass them quickly. You can obtain all these forms from the Gatehouse. Questions regarding completion of the forms can be called to 863-859-7275 and a Courtesy Patrol Team Member will be happy to assist you.



<u>Living with Alligators – Information from Florida Wildlife</u> <u>Conservation Commission (FWC)</u>

Alligators are an important part of Florida's landscape and play a valuable role in the ecology of our state's wetlands. Alligators are predators and help keep other aquatic animal populations in balance. A better understanding of the facts and information regarding these creatures will help ensure that people and alligators can continue to coexist.

Alligators & People

Alligators are a fundamental part of Florida's wetlands, swamps, rivers, and lakes, and they are found in all 67 counties. Florida continues to experience human population growth. Many new residents seek waterfront homes, resulting in increased interactions between people and alligators. Although most Floridians understand that we have alligators living in our state, the potential for conflict exists. Because of their predatory nature, alligators may target pets and livestock as prey.

**PLEASE KEEP YOUR PET ON A LEASH AND NEVER LEAVE PETS UNATTENDED

[**Note from CL Management per the Community Rules and Regulations]

In the past 10 years, the Florida FWC has received an average of nearly 16,000 alligator-related complaints per year. Most of these complaints deal with alligators occurring in places such as backyard ponds, canals, ditches and streams, but other conflicts occur when alligators wander into garages, swimming pools and golf course ponds. Sometimes, alligators come out of the water to bask in the sun or move between wetlands. In many cases, if left alone, these alligators will eventually move on to areas away from people.

Generally, alligators less than four feet in length are not large enough to be dangerous unless handled.

**One of the best things about Cypress Lakes is the wildlife... However, SAFETY FIRST, Always! Residents should educate their guests.

If you feel an alligator is aggressive or has lost its fear of humans, please call the Cypress Lakes office and Management will address this.

[**Note from CL Management]

Please be aware that "nuisance" alligators are destroyed, not relocated. Visit MyFWC.com/Gators for more information.






