Wally is originally from Streator, Illinois After high school he enlisted in the Air Force and in July 1960 went to San Antonio, Tx for his Basic Training. After two months he, and a group of about 30 other airmen were sent to the Dental Office one day, all believing to themselves that they were going to get some dental care. Once there, they were told all the schools for training were closed. They were then all given a 30 day leave before being sent to Thule, Greenland for an isolated tour of 365 days for Crash Rescue Training and other job training.

Once Wally's tour in Greenland was completed, he returned to the states and he and Barbara got married. He was then assigned to Lincoln AFB in Lincoln, Nebraska. He worked Crash Rescue on the Flight Line. He finished out his tour of duty at Lincoln AFB and was discharged from the USAF in April 1964 as an Airman 2nd Class.

Wally and Barbara returned to Streator, Illinois and he started working for Owen's Illinois Glass, worked for them 18 months then went to Technical School in St. Louis for one year for Gas and Diesel Mechanics. He was hired by Commonwealth Edison of Chicago. He worked in one of the Illinois branches and moved to Kankakee, Illinois. Wally retired from there after 31 years.

Wally and Barbara have one son, Glen, he was born while Wally was on the East Coast during the Cuban Crisis. They also have two grandchildren and six great grandchildren.

Wally and Barb have traveled to Arizona, Texas and Florida. They came to Holiday 28 years ago as they had seven friends that were snowbirds here. Both Wally and Barb are active in the park.
