Aqua Tabata with Wendy & Lynn Wednesday and Saturday at 9:30am

APRIL WEDNESDAY'S AND SATURDAY'S WILL BE PUSHED BACK TO 9:30 AM.

Come join us for Aqua Tabata at 9:30 APM for the Spring and Summer months.

What is Aqua Tabata you ask? Wendy or Lynn will lead on Wednesday's and Saturday's at 9:30 am. Each class lasts about 45 minutes. The first set of 8 exercises are warm-up. Exercise is in the form of Tabata – ten sets of eight 20 second rounds of an exercise with a 10 second rest between.

We do use water weights, but it is not necessary to have them; as you can use your hands or a noodle for resistance. We encourage everyone to bring water with them as we do take a water break about ½ through. This is held in the walk-in pool closest to the Fitness Center.

This class (like any outdoor class) is weather permitting and if we are going to cancel, we do send out an email on the CL Groups.io and two of the Facebook pages. Typically, we check to be sure that the temperature is going to be about 70 degrees at class time.



PACE OF PLAY AT BIG CYPRESS GOLF CLUB

<u>Living with Alligators - Information from Florida Wildlife</u>

Conservation Commission (FWC)

Alligators are an important part of Florida's landscape and play a valuable role in the ecology of our state's wetlands. Alligators are predators and help keep other aquatic animal populations in balance. A better understanding of the facts and information regarding these creatures will help ensure that people and alligators can continue to coexist.

Alligators & People

Alligators are a fundamental part of Florida's wetlands, swamps, rivers, and lakes, and they are found in all 67

counties. Florida continues to experience human population growth. Many new residents seek waterfront homes, resulting in increased interactions between people and alligators. Although most Floridians understand that we have alligators living in our state, the potential for conflict exists. Because of their predatory nature, alligators may target pets and livestock as prey.

**PLEASE KEEP YOUR PET ON A LEASH AND NEVER

LEAVE PETS UNATTENDED

[**Note from CL Management per the Community Rules

and Regulations]

In the past 10 years, the Florida FWC has received an average of nearly 16,000 alligator-related complaints per year. Most of these complaints deal with alligators occurring in places such as backyard ponds, canals, ditches and streams, but other conflicts occur when alligators wander into garages, swimming pools and golf course ponds. Sometimes, alligators come out of the water to bask in the sun or move between wetlands. In many cases, if left alone, these alligators will eventually move on to areas away from people.

Generally, alligators less than four feet in length are not large enough to be dangerous unless handled.

Give yourself some peace of mind and fill out the House Check form in the Oak Room and turn it into the HOA Office. We'll alert you to any trouble issues.

What about your HOA membership? If your membership expires between your departure and January 2026, it's a good idea to pay your membership dues before you leave. It's not normally the FIRST thing you think of when you return, and you need to be a member in good standing to attend the Annual Membership meeting January 2026. Stop in the HOA Office during posted hours to double-check your expiration date. Or contact any Board member. As a bird lover, I love my various bird feeders. Niger seed for the finches. Sunflower seeds for the cardinals. Yes, the squirrels get their share too. But remember feeding the wild life in Florida is prohibited and broadcasting seed or corn for ducks and sandhills brings the added nuisance of rats scavenging the leftovers. It also attracts possums and armadillos, both of which are nocturnal and will try to get into enclosed, dark areas during the day (think: under your house!) where they can create havoc with ductwork, vapor barriers and insulation. Caution is the order of the day for your own protection and your neighbors.

The mission of Courtesy Patrol is to provide a secure, quick and pleasant entry experience into Cypress
Lakes Village for our residents, guests, visitors and contractors, with accuracy and accountability and an
emphasis on safety with our Rover Patrol.

As we head into the Spring ...we would like to ask, "Did you know..."

•the Gatehouse 863-859-7275 is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. We have a new name Courtesy Patrol with the same delivery of service. Call us at any time day or night, to let Courtesy Patrol (CP) know you have a guest or contractor coming to your home. We have a Daily Pre-log Book and we can register your guests, contractors and vendors ahead of time for up to 3 months.

·health care workers such as Physical Therapists, Home Health Aids, Nurses, Hospice, to name a few are admitted upon arrival for the convenience of the resident who is ill.

•guests are individuals coming to your home that you are expecting and have been called-in to the Gatehouse. Visitors are individuals coming to your home who are unexpected. When a visitor arrives who has not been called in to the Gatehouse, the CP staff on duty will call for permission to let them come to your home.

our Preferred List is stored in our computer in the Gatehouse. This list is confidential and allows each resident to name 3 families or individuals who visit frequently. This is convenient for residents as these individuals don't have to be called in every time and we can pass them quickly. You can obtain a Preferred List Form from the Gatehouse, Administration or the Activities Office. Contractors and vendors always need to be called in ahead of time. A great tip is when you make your appointment, call the Gatehouse right away.

•the Gatehouse delivery hours for our community are 8 am to 10 pm. We can accommodate a special delivery with prior notice from the resident if it is outside customary delivery times. There is a newer type of Amazon delivery called Flex Delivery that has an additional charge for immediate service that may fall outside our customary delivery times, so please be sure to call these deliveries into the Gatehouse or we will have to turn them away.

·upon entering the Gatehouse drive, residents with a sticker have the absolute right to pass calmly and without hesitation or stopping through the Resident Lane. The Stop Sign at the Gatehouse is for the Visitor Lane only. Most of the time a friendly wave is nice...but if the CP staff is attending the Visitor Lane, do not stop for a wave plus this is the lane for emergency vehicles, so it is necessary to keep the lane always moving and clear. It is the prime accountability of the AC staff to notice that you have your sticker and sometimes a wave from the CP staff is just not possible because their focus is as it should be, on the Visitor Lane and they are extremely busy issuing passes to your guests, visitors and contractors.

·when you see someone lurking around your street or home, please call the Polk County


Sheriff's non-emergency number 863-298-6200 immediately. Although we do have Rovers who drive around the community from 11 pm to 4 am; they secure Cove community properties and drive our streets as the eyes and ears for the Sheriff for suspicious behavior. The Sheriff has requested that whoever sees the issue should be the one to make the call. They are on-call to our community for these issues and will come at a moment's notice. I am always at your service at 863-209-2887.

·a Multi-day Pass is issued for your guest for up to a 29 day stay. These forms can be obtained from the Gatehouse. One Multi-day Pass is issued per stay. If you have a guest staying longer than 29 days, you must go to the Sales Office and obtain a Renter's Pass for them. A background check will be done and there is no expiration date on the pass. Cypress Lakes expressly prohibits one night rental stays. Advertising for this type of one night stay should cease immediately. Bed & Breakfast type arrangements are expressly prohibited
