Note: Give your home/site any needed attention. Now is the time to address outside projects before it gets too hot. Cargo Trailers/trailers are not to be stored on sites. Also, only one RV per site.

## Veteran Spotlight

**Bill Collins**  
**United States Army 1968 - 1970**

Bill is from Susquehanna, PA, graduated high school at age 17 and on his 18th birthday, November 1st, he signed up for the draft and he was drafted into the Army in May of the next year, 1968. He did his Basic Training in Fort Dix, NJ then went to Fort Polk, LA for AIT (Advanced Infantry Training) and was then assigned to the 4.2" Mortar Platoon.

Bill took a 30 day leave then was sent to Vietnam in the 11th ARC (Armored Cavalry) F Troop, all the troops were lettered in 1968-1969. When he arrived in Vietnam, because he was trained, his MOS (Military Occupational Specialty) was 11C, his rank went to E-5 and he was the Mortar Sergeant in charge of 3 guns (vehicles) and 15 men (5 men to a vehicle). Bill was only 18 years old.

Bill was sent back to the States when he had 6 months remaining on his tour. On October 25, 1969, he went home on leave. When he entered the Army, he had a girlfriend and she and her family had the wedding all planned. Bill and Arlene got married November 7, 1969, then went to Fort Carson, CO for the remaining 6 months of his service. They bought a new car, a 1969 Chevy Malibu, off the showroom floor for \$3600. Bill was even given the privilege to drive it off the floor and out of the building.

Bill and Arlene returned to Susquehanna after Bill's discharge as an E-5 Sergeant. Bill joined the Carpenter's Union as his whole family was into carpentry, and he retired from the job after 50 years. Bill built 3 houses, the last he built for he and Arlene on his parents' property, where he grew up.

Bill and Arlene came to Holiday 12 years ago as they had family at Holiday. They are snowbirds.

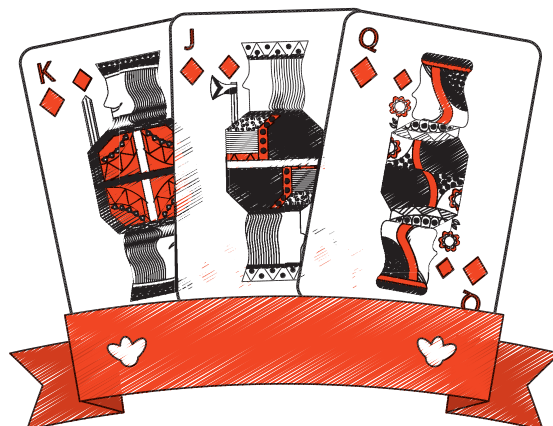
