MEET YOUR NEIGHBOR

Jimmie Wong (Wong Kun Tu)

I should re-title this article "Meet MY Neighbor," as Jimmie Wong lives in my neighborhood. Jimmie Wong was born in a small village outside of the city of Dinghai, China 103 years ago. Jimmie was one of eight children. His parents were prosperous owners of a grocery store. Jimmie's education consisted of about three years of high school before his family decided he should go to the U.S. because communism was taking over. At about 16 years of age Jimmie came alone, via a freighter from Shanghai to NYC. He came through immigration on Ellis Island. Jimmie recalls that it was a tough trip. Unfortunately, he never saw his mother again.

After reaching NYC, Immigration directed Jimmie to a church in what is known as "China Town" today. The church was instrumental in helping him find his uncle who was living in NYC, and also helped him enroll in a school where he learned English. His uncle worked as a chef in a restaurant, and he got Jimmie hired as a dishwasher at night. After about six months he was moved up to working as a cashier.

After a year of living in the states he was drafted into the Army. He received his US citizenship just before leaving the army. Jimmie then worked in a kitchen in a private boarding school in Rhinebeck, NY. He visited NYC often, which is where he met his wife, Chen Zit. They were happily married for over 42 years and raised four successful children (Steve, Jeff, Richard and E'Ling). They eventually settled on Long Island to raise their family. He and his wife enjoyed throwing big parties for the 4th of July with relatives and friends. This became quite an event every year.

Jimmie then worked at a tungsten manufacturing plant, first as a maintenance foreman and then worked his way up to manager of Machine Maintenance Operations. He worked in this plant for 33 years before retiring. Jimmie and his wife were planning to move to Florida soon after she retired. Unfortunately, she got sick with cancer that took her soon after she retired at the age of 64. Jimmie did make the move to Florida a couple of years later.

Jimmie has lived in Florida for many years now, and currently resides in Strawberry Ridge with his son, Richard. If you're lucky you may catch him sitting in his carport enjoying this beautiful spring weather. It's so nice to have him as part of our community here at Strawberry Ridge!

Before you purchase any necessary Durable Medical Equipment:

Check with the Strawberry Ridge Village Lending Closet, located at the Clubhouse, which provides medical equipment to our residents upon request. Call us and one of our volunteers will be happy to assist you by providing many of your needs on an available basis. This service is at no cost to our residents, is a great cost-saving measure, and the loan of the equipment has no time limit. You may keep the equipment if it is necessary.

We have wheelchairs, transfer chairs, crutches, canes, walkers, bed rails, potty chairs, and shower chairs. These items are available for all our residents to borrow. Donations of the mentioned items are also accepted. There are limits on the type of supplies we can accept. We cannot accept respiratory items, diapers, walking boots, medications, stability belts or other disposable items. All that we ask is that when returning borrowed items or donating items please ensure that all items have been cleaned and are fully operational. The volunteer staff does not have the ability to clean or repair any items. Presently, the Lending Closet is in short supply of Rollator Walkers. Any donation of or return of one no longer needed would be appreciated.




