



Manager's Corner - Jeff Belle



Hello, Camelot East Residents and HELLO SUMMER!!!!!

June is officially here, and projects for the community are either underway or starting this month. I am certain that once complete, we will be the envy of our neighboring communities! Our main project, remodeling of the clubhouse, is now a month into full swing, and we have made great progress! Looking forward to the final completion which is currently on schedule for Mid-October. For our residents that are utilizing the fitness center during the day while the work is being done, we simply want to remind you that the side door nearest the fitness center is not in use and is being utilized by our construction team. We recommend that you utilize either the front entrance of the clubhouse or the side of the building, near the main kitchen for access into the clubhouse to ensure your safety. More detailed information will be provided once we get closer to the milestones set for each specific phase of the project.

Next up on our list, is the restoration of our Lake bank along the side of the tennis courts! The Lake Doctors has this work scheduled for mid-June where we will address the erosion and restore shoreline to its original state. This work will most likely take a few weeks to address, but I can guarantee you will be amazed

once the work has been completed.

Next up on the list, Asphalt Milling and Overlay, in addition to the completion of the sidewalk along Kingsbridge. The work is being finalized, and the schedule of work will be as follows:

Complete overlay and milling of Axminster Rd.;

Complete the remaining portion of sidewalk along Kingsbridge;

Asphalt repair of depression located at the intersection of Kingsbridge & Maryport;

Several small areas within the community for asphalt depression;

- Center sewers drain along Kingsbridge Drive from the sewer grate to the end of the gutter.
 Irrigation has been an issue in the community for quite some time and with the implementation of replacing irrigation along Wellfleet and the surrounding streets, we will begin this task of ensuring prospering irrigation has been resolved for this area. This work will consist of:
 - Rewiring and replacing wiring to ensure all homes located along Wellfleet and surrounding streets have working consistent irrigation;

Trenching new lines for piping and wiring;

 Replacing old, outdated sprinkler heads with commercial grade heads to cover more landscaping equally in this area;

Updating all timers to ensure they are working effortlessly and efficiently;

- Replacing several controllers with one main controller that will interact with the new timers being installed;
- Sod replacement for home in this area once the system has been updated;

Providing an irrigation schedule that will be followed.

Next on the list is Ballroom flooring, and solar blinds replacement which should be completed by the end of this month. Both materials for each project have been in production to be installed within the next two to three weeks. We will provide a schedule at least a week out, once installation is ready. Last, but certainly not least, the new pool furniture and cabanas have been ordered and await delivery! We have provided an overview of the new chaise lounges and cabanas and new umbrellas that will be installed over the summer. We have already replaced and updated the saunas in the men's and women's outdoor bathrooms, so please feel free to get your sweat on!

The summer also bring the new rules that go into effect as of June 1, 2025. Please makes sure you are

aware of the rules, especially as it relates to parking on the street overnight.

June also brings us rainy season and another Hurricane season! We will be holding a resident class on hurricane preparedness in July so please be on the lookout! We want to make sure we provide the most up to date information for our community as it relates to any upcoming storms, how we prepare the community, our steps and what part you play in preparing for inclement weather.

As we continue to enhance our community, please feel free to reach out if you have any ideas that you

would like to discuss. We are always open to your ideas and suggestions!

In closing, my quote for this month is dedicated to my dad, who would have turned 74 this month. In honor of all the Dads, Pops, Fathers, Paw Paws, Grandfathers, and Grandads, Happy Father's Day and thank you for all you do to be the rock, the glue, and the heartbeat of the family!



June 5 is World Environmental Day—a day meant to raise environmental awareness across the globe.

June 11 is this month's Full Moon. The full moon in June is often referred to as the "Strawberry Moon," a name derived from Native American traditions, specifically the Algonquin tribes, who used it as a signal to gather ripening strawberries. This full moon, which occurs closest to the summer solstice, can sometimes appear with a reddish hue. This phenomenon is due to the moon's lower position in the sky during this time of year, causing its light to pass through more of Earth's atmosphere, scattering shorter wavelengths and allowing the longer red wavelengths to dominate. The Strawberry Moon is a striking celestial event, symbolizing the transition from spring to summer and marking a period of agricultural significance.

June 14 is Flag Day (U.S.). Flag Day in the United States is observed on June 14th, commemorating the adoption of the Stars and Stripes as the nation's official flag by the Second Continental Congress in 1777. The resolution defined the flag's design, specifying 13 stripes and 13 stars to represent the original colonies. President Woodrow Wilson officially established June 14th as Flag Day in 1916, and later, in 1949, Congress designated it as National Day of Observance. Though it is not a federal holiday, many Americans honor the day by displaying the flag, holding parades, and participating in patriotic ceremonies that celebrate the country's heritage and values.

June 15 is Father's Day.

June 19 is Juneteenth (also known as Freedom Day or Emancipation Day). On this day in 1865, Union General Gordon Granger read the Emancipation Proclamation aloud in Galveston, Texas, effectively liberating enslaved people in the state, which had thus far been beyond control of the Union Army.

Longest Day: The June solstice, which typically occurs around June 20th or 21st in the Northern Hemisphere, marks the longest day of the year, known as the summer solstice. On this day, the tilt of Earth's axis is most inclined towards the sun, resulting in the maximum duration of daylight. Cities near the Arctic Circle experience continuous daylight, a phenomenon known as the "midnight sun."

Shortest Day (Southern Hemisphere): In the Southern Hemisphere, June 20th or 21st marks the winter solstice, the shortest day of the year with the least amount of daylight. On this day, the tilt of Earth's axis is such that the Southern Hemisphere is tilted furthest away from the sun. June's birth flowers are the rose and the honeysuckle. A rose, in general, indicates love or desire. Specific roses may relay other messages. For example, a white rose may mean "silence" or "new beginnings," while a yellow rose signifies "jealousy." The honeysuckle denotes the bonds of love, or generous and devoted affection.

June Birthstones: Pearl, Alexandrite, and Moonstone Pearls are associated with purity, honesty, and calmness. If you dream of a pearl ring, expect romance.

Gemini and Cancer are the June zodiac signs in astrology. The astrological sign of Gemini is in effect from May 21 through June 21, while Cancer is in effect from June 22 to July 22.

Once, June was the fourth month of the year. The month of June used to be the fourth of the year. A year had barely 10 months until Julius Caesar came to power.

Start of Hurricane Season (Atlantic): The Atlantic hurricane season officially begins on June 1st and lasts until November 30th, a period during which the conditions in the Atlantic Ocean are most conducive to the formation of tropical storms and hurricanes. This season peaks in late summer and early fall, when sea surface temperatures are at their highest. The National Hurricane Center and other meteorological agencies monitor and predict storm activity, issuing warnings and advisories to help communities prepare and respond. The start of the hurricane season signals the need for vigilance and preparedness in coastal regions prone to these potentially devastating weather events.

The Origin of Father's Day



Some attribute the first Father's Day observance to the 1907 Monongah, West Virginia mining disaster that killed 361 men—250 of them fathers— and which left more than a thousand children without a dad. Grace Golden Clayton, whose father was killed in the tragedy, suggested a service of commemoration to the pastor of her local Methodist chapel. But it never really caught on as an annual observance.

Two years later, in May of 1909, a woman named Sonora Louise Smart Dodd of Spokane, Washington, heard a Mother's Day sermon by Reverend Dr. Henry Rasmussen in her hometown church and thought a similar day should be set aside to honor fathers. Her own father, William Jackson Smart, a Civil War veteran, raised six children as a single parent. On June 6, 1910, Dodd approached the Spokane Ministerial Association and the local Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) with her petition outlining the idea for an annual observance, and she received overwhelming support. Spokane's held its first Father's Day celebration on Sunday, June 19, 1910, with moving speeches by her own pastor and those from other area churches.

The first US President to celebrate it was Woodrow Wilson in June of 1916, who opened the church services by telephone to Spokane from the Oval Office. Wilson liked the idea so much of a day of observation for fathers that he pushed to make it a national holiday (he had just made Mother's Day official in 1915), but members of Congress resisted, fearing that such a day would take away support from the Mother's Day holiday, and commercialize the day for fathers, causing more harm than good.

Undeterred, Dodd took her mission on the road and spoke publicly to fathers to gain their support. But she was met with hard criticism. According to The Spokesman-Review, they laughed at her and said they didn't want a Father's Day. "A national fishing day would be better," they told her.

The effort to formally recognize a day for fathers met with even more hurdles over the years. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge urged states to observe the day nationwide but refused to issue an official proclamation for the holiday, and by the 1930s there was an effort to combine Mother's Day and Father's Day into a single "Parent's Day" holiday. Even the newly formed "Father's Day Council," made up (and funded by) of members of men's clothing retailers, couldn't get the holiday recognized by 1938, only succeeding in getting calendar makers to mark the third Sunday in June with tie and pipe illustrations. And the general public had no interest in buying cards or gifts for dad that he probably didn't need.

Maine's US Senator, Margaret Chase Smith, had her own thoughts on the matter. When the holiday efforts reached another stalemate in Congress, Chase-Smith penned a harsh memo in which she declared, "Either we honor both our parents, mother and father, or let us desist from honoring either one. But to single out just one of our two parents and omit the other is the most grievous insult imaginable."

More than 50 years after Dodd's initial efforts, Father's Day was recognized as a holiday to be celebrated on the third Sunday of June by President Lyndon Johnson's Executive Order in 1966. But it was still not officially recognized as a federal holiday until six years later, in 1972 when, during his re-election campaign, <u>Richard Nixon signed an official proclamation</u> setting Father's Day permanently on the third Sunday in June nationwide.

So when you're picking out that special gift and card for dad, remember Sonora Smart Dodd and her efforts to get fathers the recognition they deserve.

In 1978, Mrs. Dodd died at the age of 96. Her grave at Greenwood Cemetery in Spokane reads:






