#### <u> Aqua Tabata with Wendy & Lynn</u> Wednesday and Saturday at 9:30AM


Spring/Summer Wednesday's and Saturdays will be at 9:30 AM. So far the weather has cooperated.





"A good chipper and putter is a match for anyone."

Put that driver down and grab a putter and a wedge as we get more efficient around the greens.

Improved Chipping in 3 easy steps:

- 1. Set up with hands ahead of ball.
- 2. Swing with shoulders as club travels on an arc (Not a straight line).
- 3. Keep chest moving though contact and into the finish.

And your putts will be much shorter...

This allows the grass to re-grow and gives a better lie for you your golf ball when you are unfortunate enough to land in an "unfilled divot". During our Cypress Classic we installed a "drop zone" on Hole 3 near the red tees. I believe that this worked out really well and that we as a golf community need to address this with our Pro Shop (Allen) to make this permanent.

The summer season is a time of fun, relaxation, and taking an epic adventure! This month we would like to share...summer safety and driving courtesy between the lanes. It's fun to enjoy the sunshine, yet many of us are new to Florida. Let's take proper precautions and talk about how to have a safe and healthy season using good old common sense.

#### What is the weather like today?
