### Community project updates:

Asphalt Repair and sidewalk replacement: Work has been finalized and awaiting schedule: (tentative for Mid to late July, early August)

- Complete overlay and milling of Axminster Rd.
- Completion of the remaining portion of sidewalk along Kingsbridge.
- Asphalt repair of depression located at the intersection of Kingsbridge Maryport.
- Several small areas within the community for asphalt depression .
- Center sewers drain along Kingsbridge Drive from the sewer grate to the end of the gutter.

Ballroom Flooring: Completed on June 27, 2025.

Cabanas and Pool Furniture: One of the Cabanas has been installed, and pool furniture is in transit for delivery (tentative for furniture setup, Mid-July).

Irrigation: Finalized and prepping for scheduling: (Tentative within 2 to 3 weeks).

Lake Erosion: Scheduled for third week in July.

Solar Blinds (Ballroom): Installed on June 24, 2025.

Perimeter Fencing (Seven Oaks): Finalizing quotes and final approval of vendor.

Clubhouse Upgrades: Demo and concrete have been completed awaiting plumbing and electrical inspection.

## **Fourth of July Facts**



- The Declaration of Independence was adopted on July 4, 1776, by the <u>Continental</u> <u>Congress</u>: This marked the formal declaration of independence from Great Britain.
- The first official Fourth of July celebration took place in <u>Philadelphia</u> in 1777: This included a parade, fireworks, and cannon salutes.
- Congress made Independence Day an unpaid federal holiday in 1870 and a paid federal holiday in 1938.
- The Liberty Bell in Philadelphia is tapped 13 times every Fourth of July: This honors the original 13 colonies.
- Three U.S. presidents died on July 4: John Adams, Thomas Jefferson, and James Monroe.

#### **Traditions and Celebrations:**

- Fireworks are a major part of Fourth of July celebrations: They have been part of the tradition since the very first celebrations.
- Americans consume a large number of hot dogs on the Fourth of July: It's the biggest hot dog holiday of the year.
- · Parades, picnics, and patriotic displays are also common:
- The American flag is a prominent symbol of Independence Day: .

- The average age of the signers of the Declaration of Independence was 45:

- The first state to recognize July 4th as a holiday was Massachusetts in 1781:

  written largely by Jefferson. Though the vote for actual independence took place on July
  2nd, from then on the 4th became the day that was celebrated as the birth of American
