### Veteran Spotlight





United States Air Force 1955-1959

Recently, I spoke with Gerri Kellerman, Dick Kellerman's wife. Dick passed away on August 13, 2025, and she would like me to repost Dick's Spotlight as a memorial.

#### A Memorial Tribute to Dick Kellerman

Dick was from Cincinnati, Ohio, attended Samson Air Force Base for Basic Training in Syracuse, New York then schooled and trained in A & E (Aircraft & Engine) Mechanics for the F100 Super Savers Aircraft - Fighter Jet in Amarillo, Tx. This was the first supersonic aircraft the Air Force had. He was then stationed at Nellis Air Force Base in Las Vegas and did training command for the pilots to go from F86s to F100s.

Dick spent the last 18 months of his military service as Crew Chief on the Air Force Thunderbird Slot #4; this was his aircraft. Dick told me this was the "hardest position of the crew".

In 1958 while in route to a show, the flight carrying the crew chiefs and specialists went down, killing 19 members on board. Dick was scheduled to be on that flight, his mother was informed of his death however just prior to the flight he injured his knee and required surgery, so he was not onboard. He called his parents causing them quite the shock. Dick did have great difficulty when telling this. Then in 1959, just months before discharge, his Pilot "Fish" was killed during practice for a show. During my interview in 2023, Dick still couldn't talk about the incident.

Dick was very proud of his time in the Air Force. Despite the tragic events he was happy to share his experiences. He said his proud moment was when he received the Distinguished Unit Citation, the highest award given in Peacetime to a Unit.

Dick returned to Cincinnati upon discharge. He said he retired around 2000, and he and Gerri came to Holiday for 3 months in a motor home and had planned to travel. However, they enjoyed Holiday so much they returned the next year and bought a place, selling their Ohio home.

Thank you, Dick, for your service in the military and for being a wonderful Holiday RV family member.

Deepest Condolence to Gerri and the Kellerman Family.





#### **Disc Golf**

Disc Golf has officially started here at Holiday RV Park! It started with Twisted Adult Camp Week last month and made a huge hit!

Monday's at 10am are set for anyone wanting to join and learn about Disc Golf and practice playing. Competing has not begun as of yet, but the team is starting to shape up!

There are several other Disc Golf courses in the Leesburg area, and a couple of them have already challenge Holiday RV to play!

Ambassador Bill Lashua, who set up the course and is teaching others how to play encourages anyone who is interested to come on out and give it a try. If you don't have Discs yet, the office has nice sets to barrow, and the bag includes the course layout and game rules.

Regular golf is still able to play the course, like any golf course, players are to be considerate in taking turns and show good sportsmanship.



#### Disc Golf Rules


- 1.Disc Golf is played similarly to regular golf. the object is to finish the course in the fewest throws possible. There is a PAR 9 Hole in BLUE and an 18 Hole in RED. Each Hole starts at the TEE and Ends at the Basket. After each throw, you'll throw again from where your disc landed. Once your Disc hits the chains of the basket and goes into the basket, that hole is completed!
- Teeing off. Each RED and BLUE area is marked for each hole. You must release your Disc from the teeing area. Penalty shot if you don't!
- 3. Putting. Once you are within 10 meters or 32.08 feet of the basket, you must throw facing the basket with your full body. This is a full body stance. If you don't it's a penalty shot!
- 4. Basket. Your Disc must go through the to be consider a point! The design of the target has a tray to catch your Disc. If your Disc does not go through the chains, it's considered a missed put.
- Each throw is counted towards your basket/hole. Once you throw your disc you can place a marker and wait for the next player to throw their Disc. You then continue your throw when it's your turn.
- Lost Disc. You are allowed time to search for your disc and return to play 1. where you find it or 2. from the previous lie (where your disc landed last).
- 7. Courtesy. Please be courteous with other players (Golf & Disc) to share the area. Let's show good sportsmanship, good language, and have a good time!

If you are using Discs for the Holiday RV Office, please return them after playing so others can play.
