



A quick-thinking Swanson salesman saved the day by ordering 5,000 aluminum trays and creating a turkey meal, recruiting an assembly line of workers to compile what would become the first TV tray dinners. The creation was such a success that in 1954, the company would go on the sell 10-million turkey TV tray dinners.
