



## Veteran Spotlight



Billy was born in Indiana, moved to Leesburg, FL when he was six years old then entered the U.S. Army after school. He went to Fort Benning, GA for his Basic training, Sand Hill as it was called, then off to Fort Sill, OK for two months for Heavy Equipment Mechanic Training, ie; Tanks, then to Fort Polk, LA for two months for Wheeled Vehicle Mechanic Training. Once his schooling was finished Billy was stationed in Wurzburg, Germany. While there, Billy got orders for Vietnam. His commanding officer discussed with him whether Billy wanted to go or not, Billy told him if it's possible I'd rather not, so he was ordered to remain in Germany. Billy enjoyed his tour in Germany; said he had some good times. Before his discharge was due, he again received orders to deploy to Vietnam however with only 90 days remaining he wasn't deployed. He finished his Germany tour then was sent to Fort Dix, NJ to begin the discharge process. Billy was officially discharged from the U.S. Army in November 1971 as an E4.

Billy returned to Leesburg, FL and went to work for Jack Green Tile for a couple of years, then he worked for Firestone for a couple of years before moving to Georgia. In Georgia he began working in construction then started his own company. He had his own business for 42 years building commercial properties. Billy was in need of a wallpaper person when he met Brenda. She had her own business. They worked together when needed for several years before getting together. They have now been married for 18 years. Billy retired from construction, and he and Brenda started a seasonal Carnival Food Business for 8 months a year. They did this for 13 years. About 9 years ago they came to Holiday in their RV, two years in a row, for their fair break. They liked Holiday so much that they decided to buy a place.

Billy has one son, 53, and Brenda has two sons.

Billy is now fully retired; he and Brenda are full time residents here at Holiday and enjoy many of the activities here in the park.






Double Deck Euchre will be conducted in November on every Saturday, Sunday, and Wednesday at 7 p.m. in the Leisure Center.
