Summary of the restrictions



- . Irrigation is prohibited between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- During daylight saving time (second Sunday in March until the first Sunday in November) irrigation is limited to no more than two days per week on scheduled days.
 - Residential irrigation is allowed on Wednesday and Saturday at addresses that end in an odd number or have no address.
 - Residential irrigation is allowed on Thursday and Sunday at addresses that end in an even number.
 - Nonresidential irrigation is allowed on Tuesday and Friday.
- During Eastern Standard Time (first Sunday in November until the second Sunday in March) irrigation is limited to no more than one day per week on scheduled days.
 - Residential irrigation is allowed on Saturday at addresses that end in an odd number or have no address.
 - · Residential irrigation is allowed on Sunday at addresses that end in an even number.
 - · Nonresidential irrigation is allowed on Tuesday.
- Irrigation is limited to no more than ¾ inch of water per zone per irrigation day.
- · Irrigation is limited to no more than one hour per irrigation zone per irrigation day.
- · Irrigation is limited to only that amount necessary to meet landscape needs.
- When reclaimed water is available for irrigation use, the use of private irrigation wells is not authorized.
- Irrigation limitations apply to water withdrawn from ground or surface water, from a private well or pump, or from a public or private utility.
- Irrigation limitations apply to all landscape irrigation not currently regulated by a consumptive use permit.
 Typically, this includes residential, commercial and industrial establishments.
- Persons irrigating with an automatic lawn irrigation system installed after May 1991 shall install, maintain
 and operate a rain sensor device or switch that overrides the system when adequate rainfall has
 occurred.

We know there is some confusion on events here is a breakdown:

HOA Events

HOA-sponsored events are organized and managed entirely by the Homeowners Association. From planning and ticket sales to set-up, staffing, and clean-up, the HOA oversees every aspect of the event. All proceeds from ticket sales are collected by the HOA and go directly toward funding the event or future community activities.

Private events

Are hosted by individual residents who are fully responsible for the planning and execution of their gathering. This includes all decorations, set-up, staffing, and clean-up. Residents must submit a deposit to reserve the space, which is provided in its current condition ("as is"). These events are not affiliated with the HOA or Cove, and the host is expected to restore the area to its original state following the event.

Cove Events

Cove-hosted events are fully organized and executed by the Cove team. We handle every detail, from the initial concept and promotion to the final clean-up. Residents can simply attend and enjoy without any responsibility for planning or logistics. These events are part of our ongoing commitment to building community and providing engaging, stress-free experiences for our residents.


