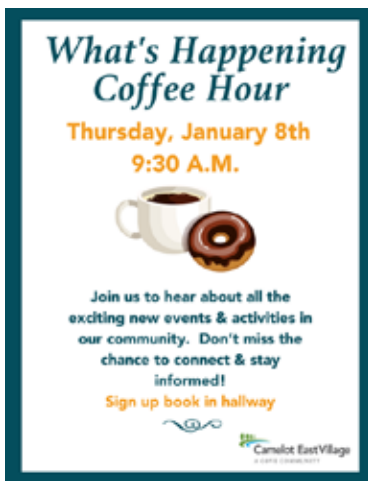

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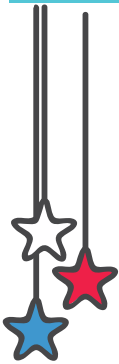

From the desk of your HOA President

As we move into the New Year, we do so with many positive things to reflect on from 2025. No Hurricanes this past season was a blessing also.

I would like to thank our HOA members who joined in 2025 for their continued support to our Association. We would not exist without your commitment!

To our non-member residents, thank you for purchasing tickets to our HOA social events and volunteering your time and creativity to support them. I hope to see many of you who did not join the HOA in 2025, do so in 2026. The price of Membership for the new year remained at \$40 annually. The dues collected are deposited into our General Fund Account which supports the payment of our annual HOA expenses, insurance, and fees as an association. These dues do not pay for our social events. Memberships can be purchased using the membership drop box in the west hallway of the clubhouse. They are also sold before the General Meeting and weekly events such as Bingo on Tuesdays. Our goal is 300 members this year.

You should have received in the mail your 2026 rent notifications which will be applied starting in January. Rent increased 5.25% over your 2025. This is part of the 3-year agreement that was negotiated last year. 2027 will be the final year of this agreement and your rent will increase by 5% next year.

During the November General Meeting, we discussed the continuation of the Vintum/Neigbrs system that was implemented in 2025 with our members. We reviewed its capabilities, the community activity in using it them, and the cost to renew the system for 2026. A motion was made for the residents to vote if they wanted to continue with the system or to not renew our agreement. The residents voted to not renew and we terminated our agreement.

Many of our members approached me and other board members thanking us for bringing the approval vote to the membership. The Board will continue to work for our members and residents on community improvements, amenity maintenance and repairs, and cost control of the money that we budget and spend within the HOA.

I am proud to be your President and work with a Board that is committed to you are members. We look forward to the New Year and creating lasting memories and relationships within our community!

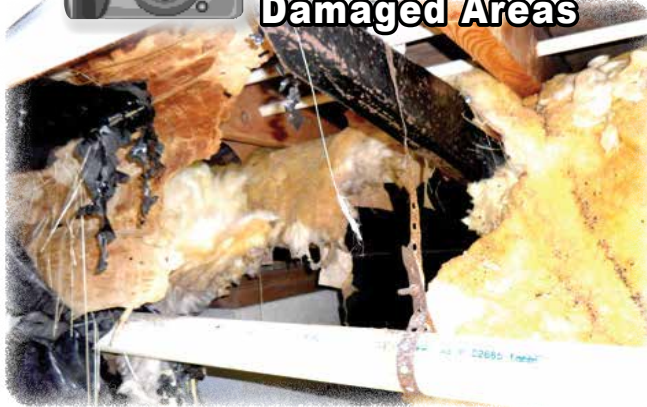
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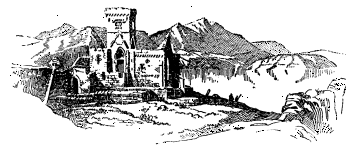
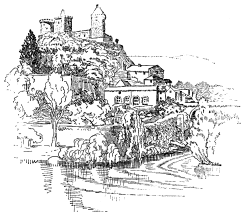


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CAMELOT LADIES BOWLING

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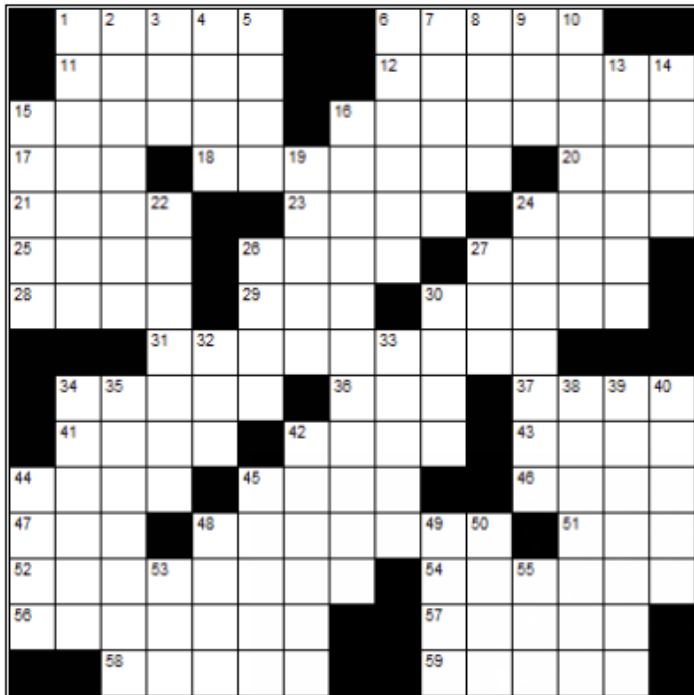

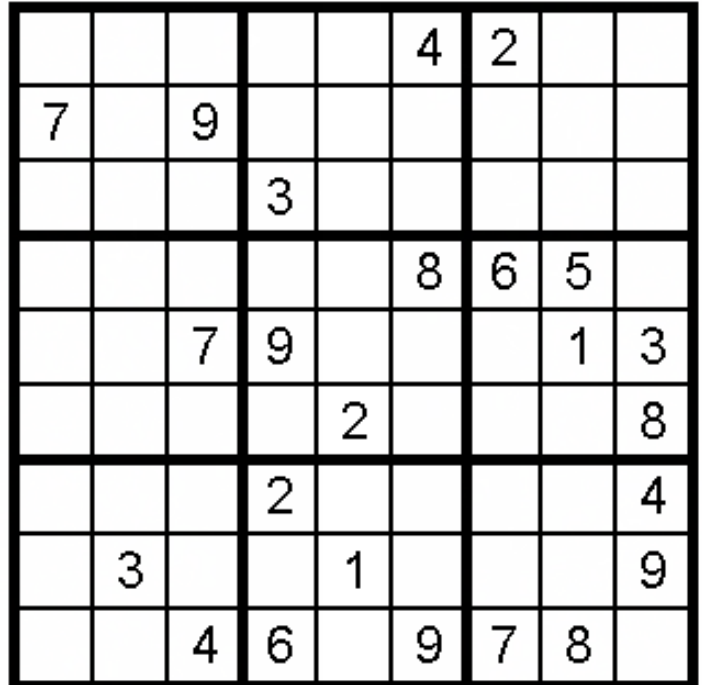

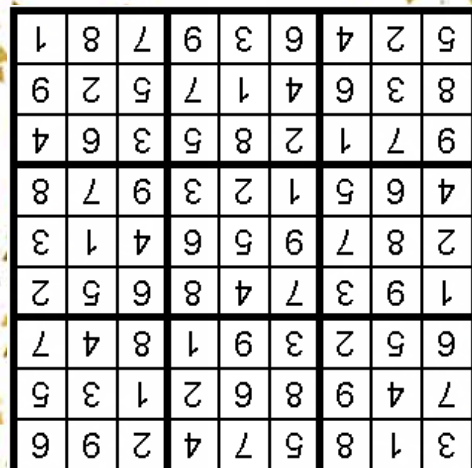
