

TRASH COMPACTOR

ELECTRONICS PICKUP

Each month, on the first Friday, The Meadows has an Electronics Pickup for recycling your electronics or metal. Any appliance with a cord is picked up. If you have a question on whether your item qualifies, contact Matt Simentaris.

Please have your items at the end of your driveway by 9am.



YARD WASTE RULES

Yard waste pickup is every Tuesday and Friday unless they fall on a holiday. ONLY organic material such as branches and plant material will be picked up but must be in plastic garbage bags or tied together in bundles and left at the curb or end of your driveway.

POOL RULES - HOURS 9AM - DUSK FOOL

- 1. No cups of any kind on the wet deck.
- 2. No glass in the pool area.
- 3. No smoking.
- 4. Pool ropes must be returned in place after lap swimming.
- 5.Please do not apply lotions or oils immediately before entering the pool. Let it get absorbed into your skin before you get in.
- 6. No running on the pool deck.
- 7. No jumping or diving into the pool at any time.
- 8. You are not allowed to save or reserve chairs and tables around the pool. It is strictly first come; first served.

DOG PARK RULES - HOURS 8AM - DUSK

- 1.Do not leave any toys at the dog parks. For safety's sake, they will be thrown away.
- 2.PLEASE pick up after your dog!
- 3.Do not let your dog dig holes.





COLLABORATION GETS THINGS DONE AT THE MEADOWS

This year The Meadows' HOA decided to have a fall picnic for all its members. After meeting, it was suggested that they invite the Veterans Club since they had successfully collaborated on projects in the past. After talking with the Vets, the Veterans Club asked if the HOA could also invite ALL The Meadows' veterans, even if they didn't belong to the club. Of course, the HOA agreed. When the HOA found out there was no Veterans Day dinner planned, they decided to move the picnic to an evening meal, and include the veterans and their families, along with all HOA members.

ramp to be able to access his house and come home from the hospital. He also needed it to be able to attend intensive physical therapy. Dave said the Veterans Club was looking to donate \$1000, and an individual veteran had also pledged another \$1000. Eldri said she

would contact the HOA board immediately to get their opinion. They agreed to donate to the Veterans Club fundraiser, matching the Club's donation up to \$1000. On November 11th, the club held their Veterans Day Ceremony at Veterans Park, featuring the Anclote High





School ROTC color guard. At noon, they planned to hold a free hot dog "sale," asking for donations to raise money for their various projects. They decided to divert any money raised from the hot dog fundraiser to fund the ramp. The Meadows' manager, Matt Simanteris, graciously donated the hot dogs and paper supplies. As word spread throughout the community, excitement grew that maybe, working together, we could raise the entire amount needed and do it all within a week. The HOA donated all the food and drinks for the dinner, with Matt donating the plates, napkins, and flatware. The club put out several donation jars. At the end of the night, between the hot dog fundraiser and the donation

jars, they realized they were only \$20 short of their goal! It didn't take long for that \$20 to magically show up!

A huge thanks goes out to Marcia Milligan, who prepared all the food, and to her husband, DJ Darrel, for playing patriotic music during the event. Britt Procter came through at the last minute, putting together an amazing slideshow along with snapping pictures throughout the evening, with Sal Grano taking the picture of the presentation of the check to Marie Schaller, Kevin's fiancée.
