

Online ordering is now available for the Poolside Café, for instructions, or QR code please stop by the office. This will make ordering easier for our residents and guests and can be used poolside while enjoying the sun. Payments must be made by CC online when order is placed.

REMINDER:

For those residents just returning, please be sure that you have your new 25/26 car sticker, and it is adhered to the left side of your windshield. Your car sticker is for your use only and is not to be given to renters. All renters need to be registered with the front office and will be issued a car pass. Your gate code is for your use only when the Courtesy Center Staff step away from the gate to complete readings, lock buildings/pool and check the Comfort Stations. Reminder, the Courtesy Center phone is #352-815-0189. Call to notify them of expected emergency vehicles, quiet-hour visitors and after-hours utility issues. Deliveries are not to be scheduled during quiet hours (11:00 p.m. – 8:00 a.m.) Access into the park will not be granted. For emergencies dial 911.

REMINDER:

*Please call the office for work orders, DO NOT STOP our maintenance team when they are out and about in the park, as this may delay not only what they are working on but getting someone to address your issue as well, also please do not enter the maintenance yard for your safety.

*Please be mindful of chemicals/cleaners used in the sewer system, this includes both park models and RV's. Cleaners should be labeled "safe for Septic".

*Boat Slips cannot be sublet, and they DO NOT transfer when boat or home is sold.

*Be courteous and respectful to people and property.

*Speed limit is 10 mph for ALL forms of transportation. Observe STOP signs.

*Pets – dogs/cats are to be leashed, picked up after and not be a nuisance to others.

Please do not park on open sites or allow your visitors to park on open sites. There is nothing more frustrating to a weary traveler after a long day's travel to pull up to their site and find it blocked. Be considerate of others.

Prior to starting any project or change, approval from HRV Management is required. Do not plant trees, bushes or set up sheds without approval. If you do not obtain prior approval, you may have to remove or relocate them. Lake County also requires building permits for most improvements.

Hours of operation: Monday thru Friday 7:00am-3:15pm, includes work orders and repairs done during these business hours.

Recycle:

- Break BOXES down, put on backside of dumpsters for pickup.
- PLASTIC goes in the bins on the backside of dumpsters for pickup.
- Rolling Dumpsters (parked by Comfort Stations) are for BAGGED HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE ONLY
- YARD clean-up material put in a container or bag for pick-up.
- METAL items can be taken to the metal only dumpster in the maintenance area.
- NONMETAL items go into the other dumpster in maintenance area.

Veteran Spotlight

Randy Reeves US Coast Guard 11/1979 - 11/1983

Randy was born in New Jersey however moved to Orlando, FL as an infant, living there until he entered the US Coast Guard in November of 1979. He attended Basic Training at Cape May, NJ and was then stationed at New Bedford, MA on the US Coast Guard Cutter Bibb (named after George M. Bibb U.S. Treasurer Combat Cutter) for Drug Patrol in the Caribbean and Fishing Patrol in the North Atlantic. Upkeep on the boat was a big part of his duties while onboard. Was onboard when the Bibb did a Courtesy Boarding Check/Verification in the Caribbean of a Columbian Registered Fishing Vessel. While onboard officers could identify the odor of marijuana. They obtained permission from the Columbian government to seize the Vessel, there was 13 Tons of marijuana onboard.

During the Cuban Freedom Flotilla, known as the Mariel Boatlift, there was a mass exodus, approximately 125,000 Cubans from Mariel Harbor to the U.S. between April to October 1980 and for about a month Randy was on Patrol aboard a 41ft boat from Miami Beach to the Keyes. He received a Humanitarian Ribbon for this. Randy spent a total of 8 months on the Bibb. He stated that the Bibb was originally used to ram U-Boats.

Randy then attended Track School on Governors Island in Manhattan, NY. He studied Electronics and worked on Radar, Radio Transmitters and Receivers for 3-4 months. He then went to the Electronic and Engineering Center in NJ where he worked on the LORAN-C (Long Range Navigation-C). This was used before GPS. Randy traveled to Greenland and worked on a Dual Rated Station for Navigation for the LORAN-C, whereby making one station a dual rated station.

Randy was discharged from the U.S. Coast Guard in November 1983 as a 2nd Class Electronic Technician and a 2nd Class Petty Officer, and states he was told that this also makes you a Federal Officer.

Randy said that being in the U.S. Coast Guard allowed him to see places that he wouldn't have seen otherwise like Sweden, Copenhagen, Puerto Rico and Greenland.

Randy remained in NJ after discharge and worked as an Electrician for 8 years. He then returned to the Orlando area in 1991, attended ITT, received his Associates Degree in Electronics then returned to complete his Bachelor's Degree. He then worked for Transcor, they maintain the Tolls. He started with installation then moved on to maintenance. Randy moved to Holiday RV Park, to be closer to family. He married Kelly 4 years ago with the ceremony being held in the Holiday Marina. Randy retired in April 2025. He and Kelly love to fish, be outside in nature and are hoping to get more active in the community.

In closing Randy mentioned that the U.S. Coast Guard Cutter Bibb is now an Artificial Reef in Key Largo.




Holiday Quilt Club




