PROJECT UPDATE: Indoor Pool enclosure upgrade will start February 16th. As we have all been waiting for these upgrades, I went ahead and took a cancellation time slot, as the upgrades need to be done. This should only be a 2-week upfit and the Lifestyles office is working with the Ambassadors and groups that this will impact.

WIFI: Resident information session will be in the Activity Center, February 16th 1-5:00pm, there will be a presentation from 1-2:00pm and the Kwikbit team will be available for questions from 2-5:00pm. Be sure to come by and learn about these exciting new upgrades.

REMINDER: Community home inspections have officially started. You will be notified by email with information about your inspection, everyone will receive an email pass or fail. These inspections will be based on the outside appearance of your home and lot. If you would like a copy of the Rules and Regulations, they are available at the front desk.

All renters need to be registered with the front office and will be issued a car pass. Your gate code is for your use only when the Courtesy Center Staff step away from the gate to complete readings, lock buildings/pool and check the Comfort Stations. Reminder, the Courtesy Center phone is #352-815-0189. Call to notify them of expected emergency vehicles, quiet-hour visitors and after-hours utility issues. Deliveries are not to be scheduled during quiet hours (11:00 p.m. – 8:00 a.m.) Access into the park will not be granted. For emergencies dial 911.

Reminders:

*Please be mindful of chemicals/cleaners used in the sewer system, this includes both park models and RV's. Cleaners should be labeled "safe for Septic".

*Speed limit is 10 mph for ALL forms of transportation. Observe STOP signs.

*Please wear reflective clothing or carry flashlights if walking after dark.

*Pets – dogs/cats are to be leashed, picked up after and not be a nuisance to others.

Prior to starting any project or change, approval from HRV Management is required. Do not plant trees, bushes or set up sheds without approval. If you do not obtain prior approval, you may have to remove or relocate them. Lake County also requires building permits for most improvements.

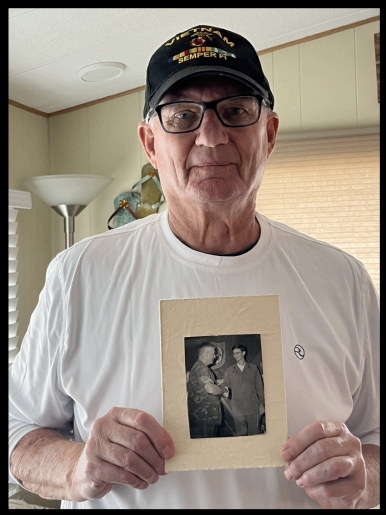

Veteran Spotlight

Robert Harris

US Marine Corp 4/1968 - 4/1971

Bob was born in St. Paul, MN, and after 2 plus years of college with his grades dropping he decided to enlist in the Marines, especially after listening to his high school cross country and track coach, who had been in the Marines, often talk about it during their practices. Bob attended Boot Camp in San Diego for 9 weeks at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot then advanced training at Camp Pendleton for 4 weeks. His MOS (Military Occupational Specialty) was Finance, specifically Disbursing (Payroll). He attended Disbursing School at Camp LeJeune, NC, at graduation he got to choose the duty station based on class rank, he choose Washington D.C., other choices were Kansas City and Vietnam. Bob was stationed there for a year and a half handling the payroll records of the Marine Corps Embassy - Marine security guards stationed at embassies all over the world. Bob enjoyed visiting all the historic sites of Washington D.C. and walking through Arlington National Cemetery. He was promoted to Sgt (E5) and received orders to Vietnam.

After taking leave and further training at Camp Pendleton, Bob was sent to a base near Da Nang, South Vietnam. He found one of the saddest things was getting notice of Marines who died and closing their pay records. While in Vietnam Bob was promoted to SSgt (E6) and was then honorably discharged in April 1971.

Just before returning to the United States he received orders to escort a prisoner back to the U.S. He was a young Marine who was Court Martialed in Vietnam. A Sgt and a Corporal were assigned to accompany Bob. The prisoner was quiet and well behaved and was turned over to the Camp Pendleton Correctional Facility.

Bob returned to St. Paul, MN after discharge from the Marines, returned to college and completed his degree. Bob worked with the IRS (Internal Revenue Service) for 30 years. He married Carolyn in 1975 and they have 3 children and 2 grandchildren. Bob retired in 2006 from the IRS, then worked the next 10 years in part-time jobs of doing taxes, working for school districts at ice arenas, and County Park Systems. Carolyn retired in 2016.

Carolyn's parents bought a place at Holiday in 1988 and her mother continued to come down winters after her father died. Bob and Carolyn bought the place from her mother in 2016 and are snowbirds for January, February and March each year stating they may eventually stay longer once grandchildren get older. Both are active around the park playing tennis and pickleball.

2026 HOLIDAY VILLAGE OLYMPIC RULES

The Holiday Village Olympic Committee established the following rules for the 2026 Olympics. 1. The 2026 Olympics will run from February 11 – February 24. 2. Each event must have at least 3 participants or teams before it can start. If there are not at least 3 participants or teams, the event will be cancelled. 3. Event Coordinators may compete in their own event but may not be a judge. If they are a judge, they cannot compete. 4. Entry in the Holiday Village Olympics is limited to monthly paying residents only. No guests, friends or family outside the park are permitted. 5. All participants must turn off cell phones at the start of their event. 6. There will be a \$1.00 entry fee for each event to be paid before the event begins. 7. There is no limit on the number of events one competitor can enter. They must pay \$1.00 for each event entered. 8. All fees required for outside the park events will be the responsibility of the competitor participating in those events. (Ex: Bowling) 9. All decisions by the Holiday Village Olympic president are final.

Wednesdays 9:30 AM to 10:30 AM Zumba

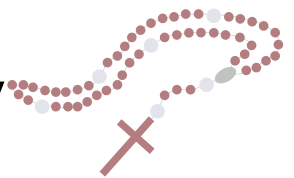
Great music and fun moves to burn calories. Class fee \$1.

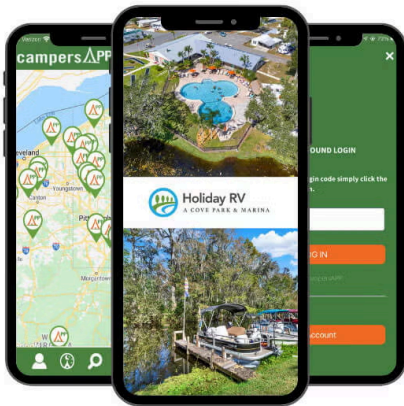

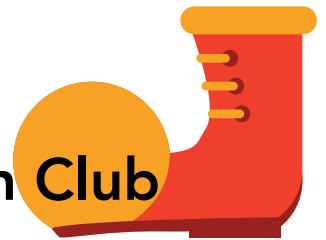
