



**THE CUPS**

When removing your golf ball from the hole, please do so by hand. Avoid using the flagstick or the head of your putter to pry the ball out, as this can damage the cup and affect the integrity of the hole.

To help preserve playing conditions, protective rings have recently been added to the top of the cups on the South Course. These rings are designed to maintain the shape and quality of the hole. Rings will be added to the North Course in the future.

Thank you for your help in keeping our courses in top condition—we appreciate your cooperation and care for the course.

**South Course Flag & Pin**

**Position Update (Under Review)**

We are currently investigating moving to a single flag color on the South Course. This change would allow for greater flexibility and consistency in pin placement across the greens. If this approach is pursued, each green would be divided into numbered pin areas, and pin position sheets would be made available to members. This type of system is widely used at many golf courses.

**How it would work:**

- Each green would have multiple designated pin areas
- All pins would be set to the same position number on a given day
- Golfers could reference the pin position sheet to easily identify the general location of the pin on each green before or during play
- Flagsticks would continue to have Prisms attached for use with yardage laser finders

### FRIENDLY REMINDER




As we head into Spring ...we would like to ask, “Did you know” your Courtesy Patrol Gatehouse, 863-859-7275, is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Please Note: Be sure to notify Courtesy Patrol any time, day or night, to inform us of a visitor, contractor or delivery coming to your home. “A great tip” call the Gatehouse as soon as you make your appointment or arrange a delivery. Gatehouse delivery hours for our community are 8 am to 10pm. We can arrange special deliveries outside regular hours, including Amazon Flex, if notified in advance. Please call the Gatehouse about these deliveries, or they may be turned away. “Oh, no...the internet is down”—this means the Gatehouse phone is disabled, but all calls are routed to me for prompt notification to the Gatehouse. “Hosting an event?” If you’re hosting an event at your home or in the Clubhouse with over four guests from the general public in attendance—such as a party or dance, church dinner, car show, club meeting, pickleball tournament, or golf outing—please email [bbinns@covecommunities.com](mailto:bbinns@covecommunities.com) with your guest list. I will prepare a special pass and provide an alphabetical list for the Gatehouse to keep traffic flowing smoothly. “No Unauthorized Entry!” We have introduced procedures to prevent unauthorized entry as we manage traffic...the gate arm at the Main Entrance is lowered at dusk. The new gate arms for the North Gate key card entrance and exit are in process to prevent public tailgating. Also, we have software with a Preferred List stored on our computer in the Gatehouse. This confidential list enables each resident to designate up to three families or individuals who regularly visit streamlining access. These visitors do not require repeated authorization and can be granted entry expeditiously. Preferred List Forms are available at the Gatehouse and Administration.
