The year is flying by, and it will soon be time for some to head home for the summer. Before you leave, be sure to let the office and mailroom know your departure date. Update or confirm your contact information and lawn care provider with the office. Pickup and secure items on your site that may become projectiles during a storm. If you have an irrigation system, make sure the settings are set to summer schedule.

The Holiday Poolside Café will be extending the Wednesday night dinners into March for 2 additional weeks, March 4th and March 11th. Sign-up sheets are available in the café. Limited spots are available so don't delay. Thank you for making this a huge success!

PROJECTS UPDATE: Indoor pool is back open, the addition of the new windows, doors, and fans look wonderful. There will be a replacement of 2 doors on or around March 10, this will not require the pool to close, just be mindful of the workers. Café renovations are tentatively scheduled to start April 1st, this will close the café for a period of time.

WIFI: The Resident Information Kwikbit meeting in February was a HUGE success, as of 2/24 we had 124 residents signed up. There will be a Kwikbit follow-up event on March 18th from 2-4:00pm in the Activity Center, more information will follow.

REMINDERS: This is a common and repeated issue here at Holiday. Please slow down, this is for all manner of vehicles including ALL bicycles. Stop signs are put in place for a reason. When pulling out onto any street please slow down, stop and look before someone is severely injured. Thank you to all that drive slowly, stop at stop signs, and are aware of your friends/neighbors when out and about in the park.

Prior to starting any project or change, approval from HRV Management is required. Do not plant trees, bushes or set up sheds without approval. If you do not obtain prior approval, you may have to remove or relocate them. Lake County also requires building permits for most improvements. If you have contractors working on your home, please make sure they don't block the roadways. They must park on your lot, or on an approved (by the office) location.

The Courtesy Gate phone is #352-815-0189. Call to notify them of expected emergency vehicles, quiet-hour visitors and after-hours utility issues. Deliveries are not to be scheduled during quiet hours (11:00 p.m. – 8:00 a.m.) Access into the park will not be granted. For emergencies, please call 911.

No Parking signs on outer parkway. If you have guests or friends coming that will need to park on the outer parkway because of space on your site, please have them stop at the office for a temporary car pass, if the office is closed, they will be available at the Courtesy Gate. These passes are different from the ones already being issued for day visitors. If you do not have one of these passes on your dashboard, your car will be towed at your expense.

Recycle:

Veteran Spotlight

Tom Koons

United States Air Force 1975-1994

Tom is originally from Montpelier, Indiana and after graduating from high school he joined the USAF in January 1975, attending his basic training at Lackland AFB in San Antonio, TX then to Fort Bliss, an Army Base in El Paso, TX for Security Training. His first orders were for F. E. Warren AFB in Cheyenne, WY for 4 1/2 years where he guarded missiles next was sent to Hellenikon Air Base in Athens, Greece working in law enforcement providing security.

Tom then returned to the U.S. to Wichita, KS on McConnell AFB for the next 6 years. There he crossed trained into heavy equipment, working wherever needed on base and was also on search and rescue. Tom's next assignment was to Kadena Air Base in Okinawa, Japan as a Project Planner. He was on the rescue team for typhoon weather. He also learned Scuba diving while there.

Tom's last orders were to Grissom AFB in Peru, IN, in charge of heavy equipment. Tom retired from the USAF in January 1994 with the rank of E6 Tech Sargent. Of note, the Grissom AFB was closed in July 1994.

Tom moved to Royal Center, Indiana and worked at Federal Mogel for 2 years, they made fuel pumps for cars, then Whallon Machinery for the next 6 years making palletising equipment for the food industry. Tom worked for 10 years at the Bell Corporation making aluminum cans , retiring officially 4/1/2020.




Please join us as we live-stream services for Discovery Church each Sunday at 10:00 a.m. in the Marina.

- Players will be paired with a different partner for each of their first 4 (round robin) games.



The Billiard Room
