Cypress Lakes Village- Rental Guidelines for Homeowners

Everyone needs to fill out an application if they are going to live in Cypress Lakes Village.

All renters must complete a Residency Application and be approved prior to arrival. *Fill out application, pay the fee (\$50 US Citizen/\$150 non-US Citizen) and provide required income verification. *All renters must be at least 55 years old. Per the community rules and regulations there are no rentals allowed within the community for less than 30 days. Upon arrival your renter will need to stop at the Sales & Administration Office to obtain a car pass for the length of their stay. It is the homeowner's responsibility to call the front gate with the renter's information to gain access to the community. Renters do not get issued north gate cards. Renters are required to follow all the community rules and regulations. A copy can be picked up at the Sales & Administration Office.

Residents' Concerns:

1. Speeding is always number one.
2. Please pick up after your pet.
3. No bottles or glass at the pool.
4. Please do not put items at the end of the driveway, this is not allowed.



PACE OF PLAY AT BIG CYPRESS GOLF CLUB

We are proud of our Pace of Play at Big Cypress. Most days we move around the course very smoothly and without delay now and then, we do get backed up. Let's all do our part to keep play moving every day. Let's remind all to use the Buddy System with the carts.

Don't wait in the cart while your cart partner hits and then ride to your ball. With common sense, casually walk to your ball and get ready to play your next shot. Your cart partner can now pick you up. It is also appropriate to drop someone off at their ball and then proceed to your ball in preparation for your next shot. Proper Pace of play does not require golfers to "Hurry", just be ready to hit when it is your turn.

REMINDER: PLEASE PROTECT THE CUPS

When removing your golf ball from the hole, please do so by hand. Avoid using the flagstick or the head of your putter to pry the ball out, as this can damage the cup and affect the integrity of the hole.

To help preserve playing conditions, protective rings have recently been added to the top of the cups on the South Course. These rings are designed to maintain the shape and quality of the hole. Rings will be added to the North Course in the future. Thank you for your help in keeping our courses in top condition—we appreciate your cooperation and care for the course.

We then use that sign-up sheet Tuesday evening to create pairings for the 9-hole scramble on Wednesday evening starting at 4:00 PM. The cost is the same as last year; if you are a member, you will pay a \$2.00 weekly entry fee per person. If you are not a course member, you can pay a one-time league fee of \$90.00 (which is a great deal) for the entire season or pay \$15.00 per week per person to the clubhouse to play, in addition to the \$2.00 weekly entry fee. The \$90.00 fee should be paid before you play your first evening of golf with us and can be paid at the clubhouse that evening prior to golf. If you choose to pay weekly, the \$15.00 must also be paid at the clubhouse before you play each night.

We will be checking in all players around 3:30 and have our \$20.00 drawing before we play at 4:00 PM each night. The \$20.00 and the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners will be paid out of the pot from the \$2.00 fee paid by everyone who plays each night. The first sign-up sheet will go up the week of April 6th in the pool room at the clubhouse. This is a fun league for anyone wanting to play some no-pressure golf with spouses or friends, and it's a great way to meet people in the community.

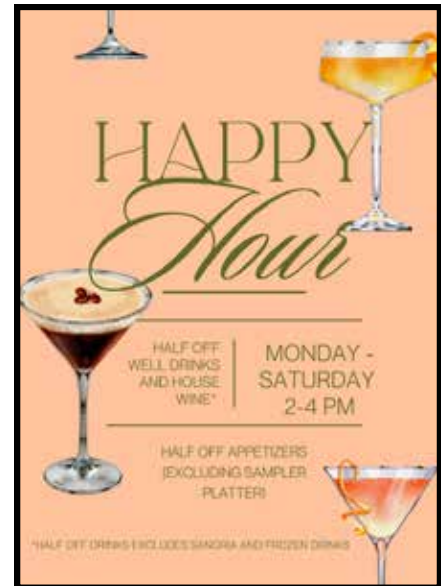

LIVING WITH ALLIGATORS – INFORMATION FROM FLORIDA WILDLIFE CONSERVATION COMMISSION (FWC)

Alligators are an important part of Florida's landscape and play a valuable role in the ecology of our state's wetlands. Alligators are predators and help keep other aquatic animal populations in balance. A better understanding of the facts and information regarding these creatures will help ensure that people and alligators can continue to coexist.

Alligators & People

Alligators are a fundamental part of Florida's wetlands, swamps, rivers, and lakes, and they are found in all 67 counties. Florida continues to experience human population growth. Many new residents seek waterfront homes, resulting in increased interactions between people and alligators. Although most Floridians understand that we have alligators living in our state, the potential for conflict exists. Because of their predatory nature, alligators may target pets and livestock as prey.

****PLEASE KEEP YOUR PET ON A LEASH AND NEVER LEAVE PETS UNATTENDED**

[**Note from CL Management per the Community Rules and Regulations]

In the past 10 years, the Florida FWC has received an average of nearly 16,000 alligator-related complaints per year. Most of these complaints deal with alligators occurring in places such as backyard ponds, canals, ditches and streams, but other conflicts occur when alligators wander into garages, swimming pools and golf course ponds. Sometimes, alligators come out of the water to bask in the sun or move between wetlands. In many cases, if left alone, these alligators will eventually move on to areas away from people.

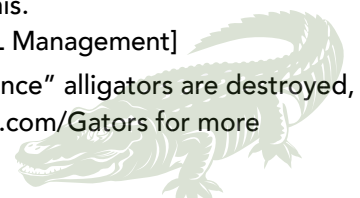
Generally, alligators less than four feet in length are not large enough to be dangerous unless handled.

HORSESHOE PITCHING LEAGUE

The CanAm Games Horseshoe Tournament took place on February 25th, with fourteen pitchers participating—four from Canada and ten from the United States. Each team competed in their own double elimination rounds to decide who would represent their nation in the 2026 CanAm Championship, which will be decided by a best-of-three games match!

With just four Canadians, it only took six games to decide who would play in the Championship matches. Last year's CanAm champion, Cecile Bedard, narrowly escaped an early loss by beating Hugh McDonald in overtime with a ringer after their match ended in a tie. Vicki Bassett, in the loser's bracket after a 2-point loss to her husband Steve, fought her way back to take on Cecile and vie for the Canadian title. In their keenly fought finals match, Cecile edged out Vicki by a single point, 59-58, and secured the Canadian title. She would go on to face the top American player in the Championship round.

The American team saw some early upsets and an unexpected leader. Bill Spencer, age 82, was that player. He scored an outstanding 75 points, with six ringers in his first match, then advanced through the winners' bracket undefeated, only left to play the loser's bracket victor for the American title. Mike Provost, in the loser's bracket after his 2nd round loss, pitched his way back to ultimately face Bill for the American title. It took him two games and an overtime tiebreaker to do it, but Mike claimed the American title and would go on to face the top Canadian player for the overall CanAm Championship.

Cecile Bedard (Canada) and Mike Provost (USA) faced off in a best-of-three championship final. The first game ended in a scratch tie, but Mike grabbed the first win 63-62, secured by a one-point handicap advantage. In the second game, Cecile made a strong comeback, winning the game 64-58, preventing Mike from sweeping the series. The final and deciding match was highly competitive, with both competitors taking the lead at various points in the game. In the closing moments, with only six shoes remaining, Cecile delivered five consecutive ringers—with two successive doubles—to claim a 71-65 win and take her second consecutive Can-Am Horseshoe Pitching Championship.
