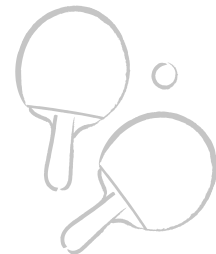

1. The first golf balls were made of chicken or goose feathers wrapped in leather. Later, golf balls were made of wood.
2. The term "birdie" was coined accidentally by Ab Smith who hit a "bird of a shot" in 1889.
3. The first round of women's golf was played in the year 1811 in Musselburgh, Scotland.
4. Golf tees were popularized in the 1920s. Before golf tees, golfers would shape mounds of sand to place the golf balls on.
5. The first 18-hole golf course was on a sheep farm.
6. It Was Once Illegal: In 1457, King James II of Scotland actually banned the game of golf. Why? Because he felt it was a distraction that kept his soldiers from practicing their archery skills! Thankfully, the ban was lifted decades later.

"BETWEEN THE LANES"

This month, we want to answer some of your frequently asked questions...

"How do I inform the Gatehouse about an expected guest or delivery?" Call 863-859-7275 as soon as you know about a planned guest, immediately notify the Gatehouse. Their information will be entered in the Daily Logs and Pre-Logbook up to three months before arrival.

"Why doesn't someone answer my call?" The Courtesy Patrol Team strives to respond promptly. If your contractor or guest is getting a pass in the Visitor Lane, immediate response may not be possible. Kindly provide a detailed message including the name of your contractor or guest, the date of arrival, and your address; this information will be accurately recorded in our Daily Logs or Pre-Logbook, so we know to expect them.

"How should I proceed if my guest's stay exceeds 24 hours?" The 24-hour pass can be extended for up to 3 days. The Multi-Day Pass covers visits lasting from 4 to 29 days. Only the Homeowner is permitted to fill out and sign a Multi-Day Form for these passes; you should request this form at the Gatehouse at least 3 days before your guest's arrival. If your request is for a guest for longer than 29 days, it is considered a rental, and you'll need to complete the necessary paperwork...please contact Administration at 863-859-1431.

"How should I proceed if the phones are inoperative and I am unable to contact the Gatehouse?"

Sometimes both the internet and phone services experience simultaneous outages. In this situation, kindly reach out to Bonnie directly at 863-209-2887. Your guest and vendor details will be promptly communicated to the Gatehouse.

"What happens if my guest enjoys their stay so much that they want to rent my home?" A Homeowner is required to inform Community Management before renting out their home by contacting 863-859-1431.

Prospective renters must be approved before living in Cypress Lakes Village.

Can I rent my home short-term, like an AirB&B? Rentals in Cypress Lakes Village must be at least 30 days. Renting your home as an AirB&Bs for overnight or short-term stays to include advertising in any media, is strictly prohibited.

Going home for the summer? Pick up the application for your FREE Residential House Check. It is available in the Oak Room. CAP embraces the responsibility to provide more eyes watching your property, giving you peace of mind until you return safely in the fall. We'll do a complete perimeter check weekly looking for broken or open windows, holes dug by varmints for under-home access, missing or damaged siding, sprinkler heads needing repair, unauthorized vehicles parked in your drive – anything unexpected or out of the ordinary. We will send you a picture and you decide how to proceed! You may have someone watching your home, including interiors, but be as safe as possible!

As our name indicates, Citizens Assisted Patrol members are residents who are screened through background checks by the Polk County Sheriff's Department. A full day of training is included by PCSO AND in-park training before any patrols can be done. We are monitoring the community for suspicious activity we do not take enforcement action, only observe and report. Our most effective 'weapon'? Immediate cell phone contact to special dedicated phone numbers at PCSO! You'll see us regularly at the North Gate. Often, vehicles other than residents', will attempt to turn in, see our flashing lights and marked Sheriff vehicles, and turn back on to US98 to enter properly at the Main Gate. As posted, it is a 'residential access' gate only. And YOUR safety and security are at risk for those who tailgate in OR out. Don't give them an opportunity!

Considering joining our team? We meet regularly on the second Tuesday of each month at 10 am in the Oak Room. Join us to see what we're all about. Fill out the Volunteer Application on the wall in the Oak Room. You may mail it in directly or drop off in the HOA Office and we will turn it in for you.
