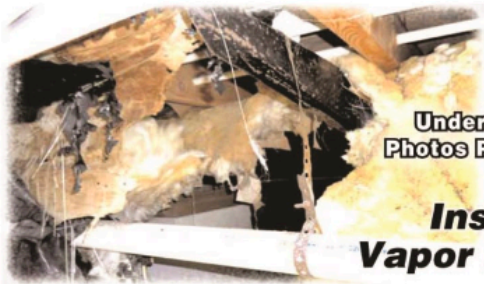

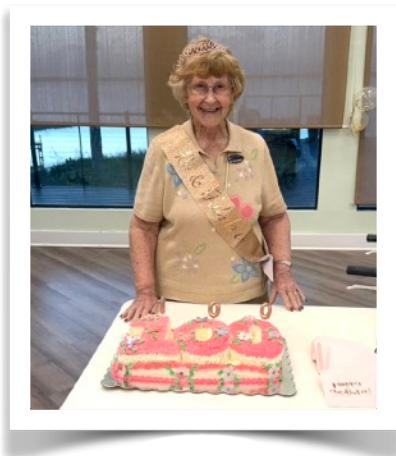

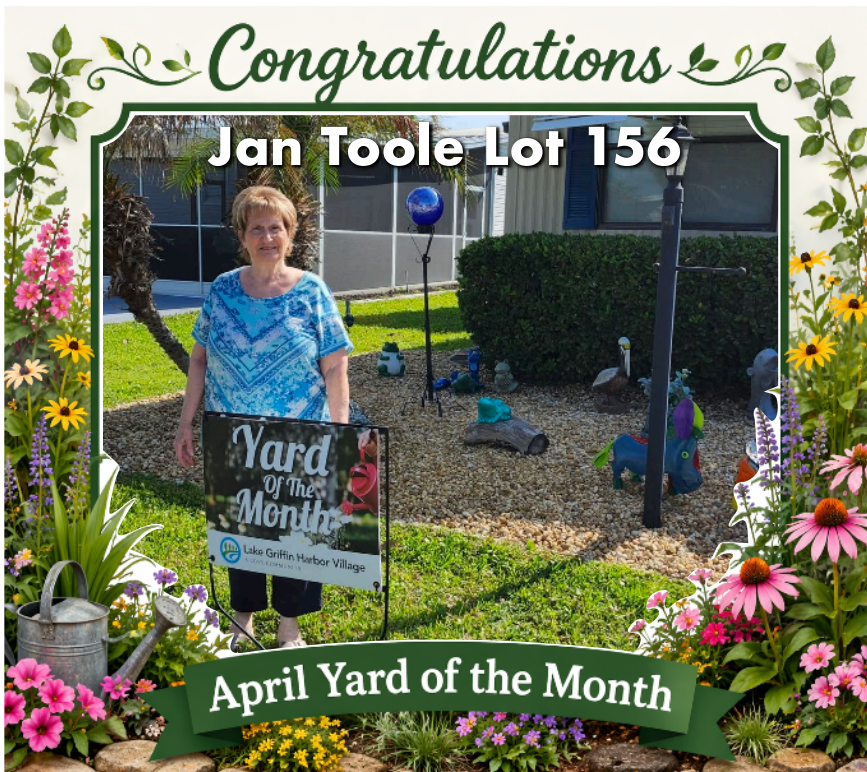


For those who are new to the park, I'd like to let you know about the Caring Closet located in the Card Room at the Clubhouse.
