Mint Julep cocktails history is a bit of a mystery. Some claim it started in the 18<sup>th</sup> century in Virginia as a refreshing Julep drink. It wasn't till the 19<sup>th</sup> century when Kentucky adopted the drink and added bourdon which they are known for, and created the Mint Julep cocktail. Gentleman at the Churchill Downs loved the full rich bodied drink and it became the popular Kentucky Derby drink.

Mock Mint Julep cocktails:

Simple Syrup (1:1 water to sugar cooked till clear and cooled)

Fresh Mint

Ginger ale

Crushed ice

Crush or muddle the simple syrup and mint in the bottom of your glass. Fill glass with ice, add ginger ale. Garnish with a sprig of mint! Cheers!

Inspections are still underway throughout the park. They are progressing slower than I would like, but it has been a busy season. Keep in mind that if your home fails the inspection, the repairs/improvements must still be completed whether you are here or not. As I have said in each Manager/Resident Meeting, plan accordingly, and make sure that when you leave your home, it is ready for inspection. Inspections will take place quarterly. This will be an ongoing process year around.

Please be aware of the water restrictions and any burn bans being issued by Lake County by visiting the Lake County Website. To put things in prospective, in the last couple of months due to the extremely dry conditions, and lack of rain, the state of Florida has had 1,715 wildfires. We will try to keep you updated as things change, but please keep up with current conditions.

Projects we hope to see starting soon are the Café renovations, we will close the café prior to the renovations being started. Currently, I do not have a start date. The next project that will be starting is the installation of security cameras throughout the park. I will follow up on locations and start date as soon as possible.

As there are fewer residents in the park during the summer, check on your neighbors, be aware of your surroundings and any changes if you know your neighbors aren't home. REMEMBER, if you see something say something. Don't be a bystander and regret not saying something when you have a chance.

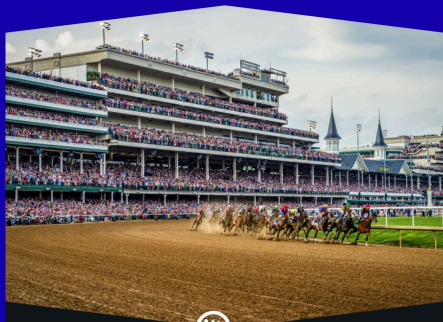

## Veteran Spotlight

**Bill Miller**

**United States Navy 1968-1971**

Bill, from Dearborn, Michigan, graduated high school at 17 and attended junior college. Being in the "time of the draft", Bill did get a draft notice but decided to enter the Navy instead in February 1968. Bill went to Chicago, Illinois to attend Great Lakes Navy Boot Camp, took leave then returned for 3 months of schooling for Gunner Mates. Once finished he was transferred to Little Creek, Virginia to LSD 21 (Landing Ship Dock) Fort Mandan, the ship's name has since been changed to LDS (Landing Dock Ship) for a year and a half. The ship was then decommissioned.

Bill was then shipped to Vietnam for 5 months, transporting river boats only to find they were not needed. Bill then returned to Little Creek, Virginia serving in the ALCU (Assault Landing Class) in Shore Duty to take care of Small Arms. Bill was discharged from the U.S. Navy in December 1971 as an E-4.

Bill returned to Dearborn, Michigan and worked at Greenfield Village, the Henry Ford Museum for 46 years as the printer for the museum.

Bill married Nancy in 1974. They have two children, a son, who also joined the Navy, a daughter and one grandson. Bill retired in 2018.

Bill and Nancy came to Holiday to visit with Nancy's parents Bob and Marilyn Richardson at their place in the park. Once Nancy retired they would come and stay in their camper, then they decided to purchase a place in 2020 because Bill didn't want to haul the camper back and forth anymore. Currently they are snowbirds.
