LIVING WITH ALLIGATORS – INFORMATION FROM FLORIDA WILDLIFE

CONSERVATION COMMISSION (FWC)

Alligators are an important part of Florida's landscape and play a valuable role in the ecology of our state's wetlands. Alligators are predators and help keep other aquatic animal populations in balance. A better understanding of the facts and information regarding these creatures will help ensure that people and alligators can continue to coexist.

Alligators & People

Alligators are a fundamental part of Florida's wetlands, swamps, rivers, and lakes, and they are found in all 67 counties. Florida continues to experience human population growth. Many new residents seek waterfront homes, resulting in increased interactions between people and alligators. Although most Floridians understand that we have alligators living in our state, the potential for conflict exists. Because of their predatory nature, alligators may target pets and livestock as prey.

****PLEASE KEEP YOUR PET ON A LEASH AND NEVER LEAVE PETS UNATTENDED**

[**Note from CL Management per the Community Rules and Regulations]

In the past 10 years, the Florida FWC has received an average of nearly 16,000 alligator-related complaints per year. Most of these complaints deal with alligators occurring in places such as backyard ponds, canals, ditches and streams, but other conflicts occur when alligators wander into garages, swimming pools and golf course ponds. Sometimes, alligators come out of the water to bask in the sun or move between wetlands. In many cases, if left alone, these alligators will eventually move on to areas away from people.

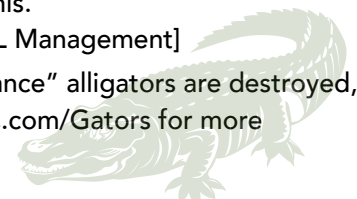
Generally, alligators less than four feet in length are not large enough to be dangerous unless handled.

**One of the best things about Cypress Lakes is the wildlife... However, SAFETY FIRST, Always! Residents should educate their guests.

If you feel an alligator is aggressive or has lost its fear of humans, please call the Cypress Lakes office and Management will address this.

CULTURAL PRACTICES

As part of our ongoing commitment to maintaining healthy turf and high-quality playing conditions, the Golf Course Maintenance Team will be performing routine cultural practices on the course over the coming months.

What to Expect

These practices may include:

- Aerification (small holes in turf to improve root growth)
- Topdressing with sand
- Fertilization and soil amendments
- Mowing pattern changes
- Light rolling or brushing
- Irrigation adjustments

Why This Is Important

Cultural practices are essential for:

- Improving turf health and root development
- Enhancing drainage and soil structure
- Preventing disease and stress
- Ensuring safe, consistent playing surfaces year-round

While these practices are routine, you may notice:

- Maintenance equipment operating during daytime hours
- Temporary changes in turf appearance
- Minor noise during operations

All work is conducted using industry best practices and environmentally responsible products in accordance with local and state regulations.

Golf Cart Safety Guidelines for "Happy Travels"

Golf carts are increasingly popular in retirement communities such as Cypress Lakes Village. As a result, ensuring safety while operating your golf cart is essential:

- Review your owner's manual thoroughly.
- Avoid golf carts and golf during lightning.
- Check state laws for license requirements.
- Confirm your insurance covers golf carts.
- Make sure each passenger is seated.
- Drivers must be 16 or older; children are not permitted to drive.
- Never permit someone to stand in a moving cart.
- Do not walk pets on a leash while driving.
- Operate from the driver's seat only.
- Keep legs and arms inside the cart when moving
- Always engage the brake when parking.
- Remove the key when leaving the cart.

Drive Responsibly - obey traffic laws, stop at signs, maintain 15 MPH, and yield to people, animals, and crews. Operating the cart while under the influence of alcohol is not permitted. Although laws are evolving in Florida and the property is private, the rules established by the FDOT are followed with an emphasis on safety.

Golf Course Rules for "Carts on the Course" ...

According to Allen Tener, Director of the Pro Shop, "There has been an increase of riding the course during business hours. With daylight savings, golfers are out later finishing their rounds":

- There is no fishing in ponds on the course until all golf play is completed.
- Walking on the course is not permitted at any time.
- Dog walking is not permitted at any time.
- Please do not ride during the day at any time.
- Golf Cart Paths are exclusive to the golfers during active play.
- Riding off Golf Cart Paths is strictly prohibited.

Course Riding is 30 minutes "BEFORE":

- 7:00 am during summer months defined as Sunrise and/or
- 8:00 pm during summer months defined as Sunset

FEDERATION OF MANUFACTURED HOMEOWNERS (FMO)

Though FMO is a member-funded organization, most of the things they do affect every manufactured home owner in Florida. They are our only legislative advocate! Think about it, thousands of people are supporting an organization whose accomplishments benefit over one million others who don't. We hope you will consider being part of this organization for your own benefit! The latest information you may have received directly from FMO via a WatchDog (if you are an FMO member) or posted to groups.io by Caprice Temple, one of our community representatives.

Property taxes on mobile home parks create a unique situation because they are assessed and taxed as commercial property which now permits an increase in the assessed value of up to 10% each year. These property taxes are legally passed on to the home owners via pass-through assessments.

Section 4 in House Bill 7031 provides that if the park qualifies, mobile homeowners will pay property taxes at the residential rate of 3%, rather than the commercial rate. The House language will hold the annual increase to no more than 3%. If passed, this can be a huge help to us since we pay the property tax bill!!

Check the FMO bulletin board in the Oak Room for details on what representatives to contact and how to structure your request in support of this potentially powerful legislation. Do it now!

And while you're at it, it sure makes sense to join the Federation of Manufactured Homeowners. They are the ONLY ones watching out for our interests in Tallahassee! Current annual membership is only \$40, a fraction of its worth. If this legislation passes, you could save more than that EACH MONTH from your lot rent payment! Applications are in the Oak Room. You can join on line or fill out the application and mail it in, or give it to one of the community representatives and they will mail it for you. *Gwen Snook 517-937-2921 Richard Szarowicz 716-984-4236*

CITIZENS ASSISTED PATROL (CAP)

The Cypress Lakes House Check Program has begun and we have several crews trained for the summer to handle the perimeter checks of those snowbird neighbors who sign up for the program! We'll trade off a month at a time for the summer but all will be using Polk County Sheriff carts with the flashing lights and, as always, CAP members patrol in their uniforms. It's not too late to sign up if you're going to be gone more than two weeks! We are prepared for a full complement of nearly 50 homes to be checked. House Checks must be performed by two people, with one staying at the vehicle in full view of the other person doing checks along each side and back of the dwelling. If problems are discovered, we contact the owner to address loose siding, holes dug by animals, unlocked doors, air conditioner noises, etc.

We welcome several new members to our roster: Carole Mason, Sue Tydings and Bill & Pat Reynolds have joined our roster after PCSO and in-park training. We appreciate all our volunteers who have immediate access via PCSO phones to assistance if needed on their patrols. All vehicles are equipped with water and we watch for walkers who may be overcome by heat or dehydration so that we may assist, as necessary.

Our next regular meeting is Tuesday, June 9, at 10 am in the Oak Room. Join us! Applications are in the Oak Room and volunteers are trained by the Polk County Sheriff Department after background checks are completed. We are all ready to patrol and to observe and report!

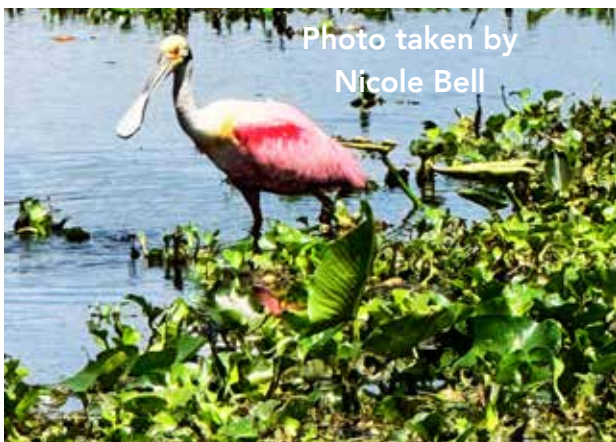

Check your Hurricane "GO" Bag to ensure it includes updated medications, important documents, chargers, and basic supplies. If you rely on medical equipment, confirm you have a backup power plan.

Second, take a moment to walk your property. Trim any loose branches, secure outdoor items, and look for anything that could become airborne in high winds. Inside your home, verify that your flashlights work, your weather radio has fresh batteries, and your emergency contacts are posted where neighbors or responders can easily find them.

Finally, please remember that preparedness is a community effort. Check in on neighbors, especially those who may be new to Florida or who travel frequently. A quick conversation can help ensure everyone is ready long before a storm is on the radar.

Your Cypress Lakes Village CERT team stands ready to assist if needed — but we need more helping hands. No experience is required, just a willingness to support your community. Our next meeting is Wednesday, July 29, 2026 at 7:00pm in the Oak Room. We hope you'll consider joining us.

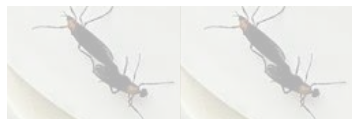

LOVE BUGS

To trap love bugs without toxic chemicals, use the white bowl and baby oil method. Love bugs are highly attracted to light-colored surfaces and bright light.

1. Set the Trap: Fill a bright white bowl, bucket, or pan halfway with water.
2. Add Oil: Pour a few spoonfuls of baby oil or vegetable oil into the water. You can also add a few drops of citrus dish soap.
3. Place Strategically: Set the bowl near entryways, on a porch, or in the yard where love bugs are swarming. The bugs are drawn to the white color and light reflection, will dive in, and become trapped by the oil.
