The United States celebrates its Semi quincentennial (250 years) since the adoption of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. We had a community Hurricane Preparedness meeting with Lake County Emergency Management in June. Due to the interest of residents that are not here during the summer, I will do a refresher on the information in my first Resident meeting in October. One of the biggest issues I have seen while driving around the park is the amount of outdoor furniture, outdoor decorations, and "stuff" that has been left out on lots this year when residents returned to their northern homes. Anything left outside during a major thunderstorm or hurricane becomes a projectile and could hurt someone, or damage your or your neighbor's home when blown around. We are in the process of setting up 6 new park model homes, if you are interested in getting information on any of these homes please contact Kathryn Andrews in our Cove Home Sales office.

Home inspections are continuing throughout the summer. We will be doing our best to inspect quarterly, which means that the team will be inspecting 635 homes 4 times a year, this doesn't include the reinspection's that will be required if the 1st inspection does not pass. We have received several questions about repairs, cleaning, lawncare, or things that need to be addressed when you are not here. The home is required to be maintained whether you are here or not. This was addressed in every resident meeting over the winter. The renovations at the café are still in progress, we have had a couple of delays, dealing with electric change orders, and more in-depth work. I will post pictures on Facebook when the new walls, and things start to take shape, so keep your eyes open. Our Lifestyles office is scheduling Food trucks to help get us through the renovations.

Remember. Have a plan in place for Hurricane season, be prepared. HAVE A WONDERFUL JULY!

# Veteran Spotlight

**Ronnie Sims**

**United States Army 1970 - 1973**

Meet Ronnie, originally from Memphis, Tennessee, he entered the U.S. Army after graduating High School. He attended Fort Bragg, NC for his Basic Training, then Infantry Training at Fort Polk, LA and then to Fort Benning, GA for Airborne Training where he was a distinguished graduate, he got instant rank, a trophy and a letter from the Head of Airborne. All quite an honor. Also of note, Ronnie had 2 years of ROTC in high school. His Drill Sergeant at Fort Bragg was a Green Beret, was Drill Sergeant of the Year and his pregnant wife had toxemia requiring him home more. He used Ronnie's ROTC skills to assist him with his records so he could be with his wife. Ronnie was then allowed to stay in the Drill Sergeant's room in the barracks. When at AIT and they found out Ronnie's status, he was made squad leader.

Ronnie was sent to Fort Lewis, WA for transport to Vietnam. He was assigned to the B,3,503 Infantry 173rd Airborne Brigade. He spent 8 months in the jungles and mountains of Central Highlands. He Started as a Radio Operator then converted to carrying an XM203 as his NATO weapon. He spent all of his time out of LZ Uplift - near Qui Nhon Harbor, Vietnam. He worked with ROK Korean Soldiers and 75th Rangers. The last 2 months in Vietnam he ran a recreation area for the troops coming from their missions, ie; music, pool tables, bumper pool, darts, misc games and a boxing ring. He returned to the United States to Fort Campbell, KY and went to work in a machine room doing dog tags and medical tags for incoming soldiers. Ronnie had his own apartment with another soldier on base and got an early out under President Nixon with a Rank SP4. MOS 11B4P.

Ronnie returned to Memphis, met and married Judy. They have one daughter and one grandson. He went to work for Materials Handling Storage Architect for Lyon Metal out of Aurora, Illinois for 20 years then started his own business "All Warehouse Equipment" out of Jacksonville, FL. Ronnie and Judy have lived in Memphis, TN, Dallas, TX, back to Memphis, Birmingham, AL, Murfreesboro, TN then Jacksonville. They moved to Holiday to be closer to their daughter and grandson. Ronnie continues to do consulting work.

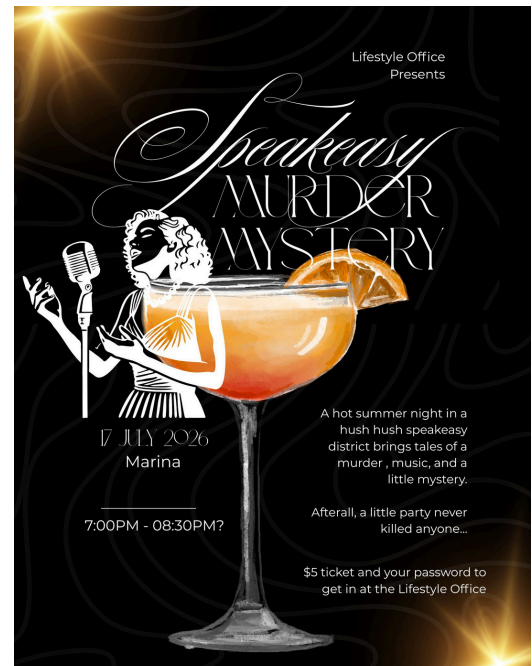

On May 28th, Kathy Erickson had the high series with 547 and Rena Schmidt and Jim Fitzgibbons had the high game of 123.

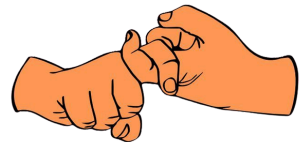
On June 4th Jo Fitzgerald and Sandy Zaffer had the high score of 110 and Sandy had the high series with 539.
