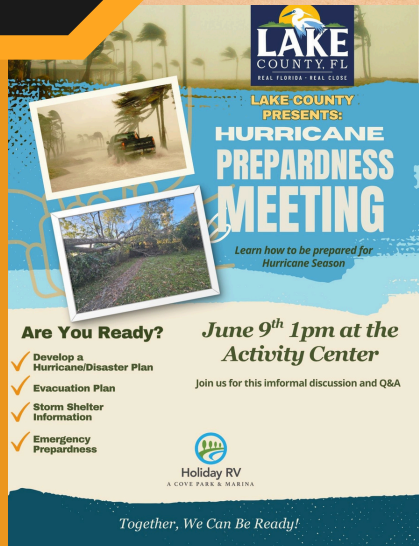

Welcome, June! As we step into this slightly warmer version of May, we look forward to sunny days, blooming gardens, warm friendships, and the many wonderful moments that make our community feel like home. Our hope is that June brings much needed rain, laughter, relaxation, new memories, and plenty of opportunities to connect with neighbors, enjoy community activities, and celebrate the joys of summer together.

June 1st also brings the start of Hurricane Season. Living in an RV, Park Model, or manufactured home is a great place to live, but when storms head our way, we need to be prepared and have a plan in place. Our Activity Center, Ken Jones Building, Library and bath houses are not storm shelters, and in the event of a State/County issued Mandatory Evacuation of RV/Campgrounds/or MH communities the buildings will not be available for your safety. I know this doesn't always make sense, but if we have a Mandatory Evacuation, it isn't safe to stay, and we encourage you to have a shelter in mind, or a plan in place to evacuate to. Please attend our Hurricane Preparedness meeting and pick up our RESIDENT HURRICANE READINESS GUIDE, it has valuable information that is beneficial to being prepared.

There will be a Hurricane Preparedness meeting on June 9th, at 1:00pm in the Activity Center. The Lake County Office of Emergency Management will be on hand with a special presentation, and to answer questions. If you are a new resident of Holiday and to Florida, I would highly recommend that you attend, or if you would like a refresher, a list of helpful information, and list of shelters please join us.

REMINDER and a bit of Trivia: Lightning- Florida has officially been "dethroned" as the Lightning Capital of the US, being unseated by Oklahoma. Long known as the national lightning capital, Florida still averages more than 3,000 cloud-to-ground strikes per day and records the highest number of lightning-related deaths annually. Keep in mind while enjoying our beautiful pool, golf course, or any outside activity, if you hear thunder, you are already within striking distance, please do not wait until the first rain drop, or clouds to get out of the pool, and off the pool deck or seek shelter. Lightning can strike up to 10-20 miles away from the center of a storm, even when skies directly above you appear clear.

The Poolside café renovations started on May 18th and are expected to take 6-8 weeks to complete. As time goes on, I will update you if there are any delays or changes in the schedule. Keep an eye on the calendar and use Campers App to keep up to date on food trucks that will be coming into the community, to give us options due to the closure of the café.

Keep your eyes open for improvements coming this summer, new street signs, WWTP improvements, security cameras, and pool furniture to name a few.

One benefit of summer was that each day we had more light to read by – Jeannette Walls

Recycle:

- Break BOXES down, put on backside of dumpsters for pickup.
- PLASTIC goes in the bins on the backside of dumpsters for pickup.

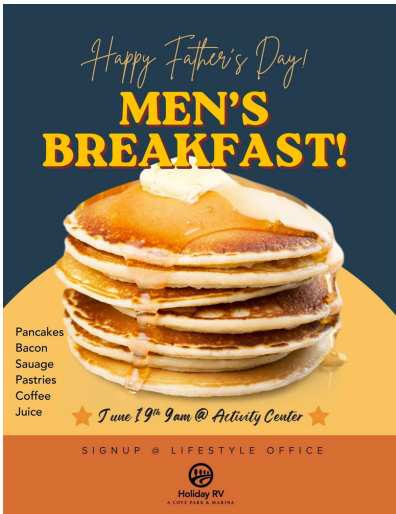

3) please donate ONLY books in good condition and fairly recent issues of magazines. NO cookbooks or health related books. We simply don't have the shelf space.

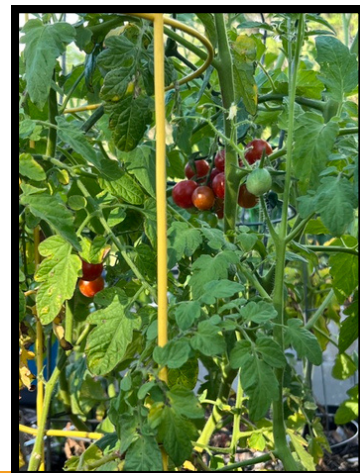

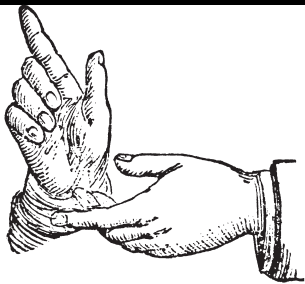
Community Garden

The Community Garden was started in October 2025 - on an empty lot. It now has 13 rectangular raised beds plus several smaller beds, bushes, potted plants, milkweed and flowers.

This is a year round activity at Holiday. We are currently meeting at 5 PM on Wednesdays. Everyone is invited to participate as your schedule and abilities permit - you can join us when we meet as a group and/or pick your time and task to work on individually. We need knowledge of gardening, technical skills (setting up and fixing irrigation, putting beds together, etc.) as well as help weed eating and leaf raking around the garden beds.

Our snowbird gardeners have headed north, so it's a good time for full timers to get involved. Thank you to everyone who donated to and supported the garden - including the Resident Fund Committee. As you pack up, clean out sheds, or prepare to return to Holiday next Fall, please keep the garden in mind should you have any garden supplies you no longer need - such as: hoses, tools, water splitters, irrigation devices, good condition plant pots (all sizes), plant covers / old sheets, fertilizers, seeds, etc. With our infrastructure in place, it would be nice to be able to host plant sales/exchanges or gardening talks on various subjects in the future. This of course will be dependent upon volunteers and community support. Stop by to see what's growing or take a break to enjoy the garden's picnic tables and benches.

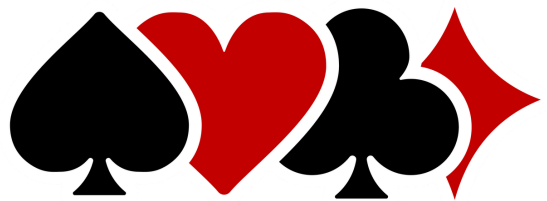

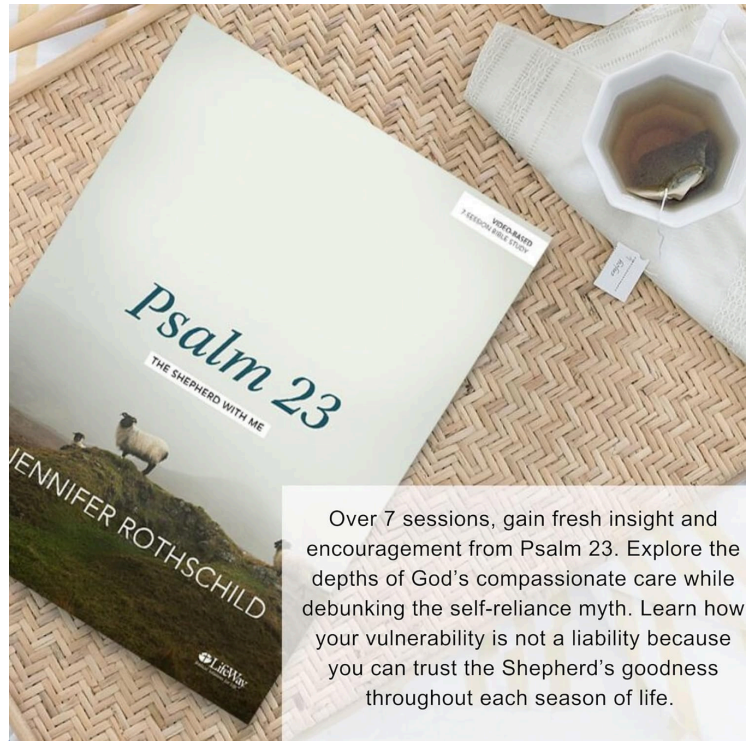
