GOLF MAINTENANCE

For golf courses and surrounding homes, maintaining drainage collection areas, swales, ditches, ponds, and reservoirs is essential for both turf health and overall course performance. Keeping drainage collection areas and reservoirs clean and well-edged protects turf health, improves water management, preserves irrigation capacity, enhances course appearance, and reduces long-term maintenance costs. Regular attention to these features is a critical component of effective golf course management.

Protects Turf Quality

- Saturated soils limit oxygen availability to turf roots and increase disease pressure.
- Proper drainage promotes healthier root development and firmer playing conditions.
- Areas that drain efficiently recover faster following heavy rain events.

Routine inspection, debris removal, and edge maintenance help ensure that drainage systems function as designed, protecting both golf course assets and surrounding homes while maintaining safe, attractive, and playable conditions throughout the year.

Here at Golf Course Maintenance, we maintain thousands of drainage boxes throughout the golf course. Some drainage areas are more problematic than others, requiring immediate attention, so we must prioritize the most critical locations first. As a result, some drains may not be cleaned before the next rain event.

We truly appreciate residents and members who help notify us of clogged drains or drainage concerns. Your observations help us identify problem areas more quickly and improve our response efforts.

We also appreciate any assistance in removing leaves, pine needles, and other debris from drains that directly impact on your property or neighborhood. Keeping organic material out of drainage structures helps maintain proper water flow, reduces flooding potential, and improves the overall effectiveness of the drainage system. Working together, we can help keep our golf course, ponds, drainage systems, and surrounding homes protected from unnecessary flooding and standing water while preserving the beauty and playability of our community.

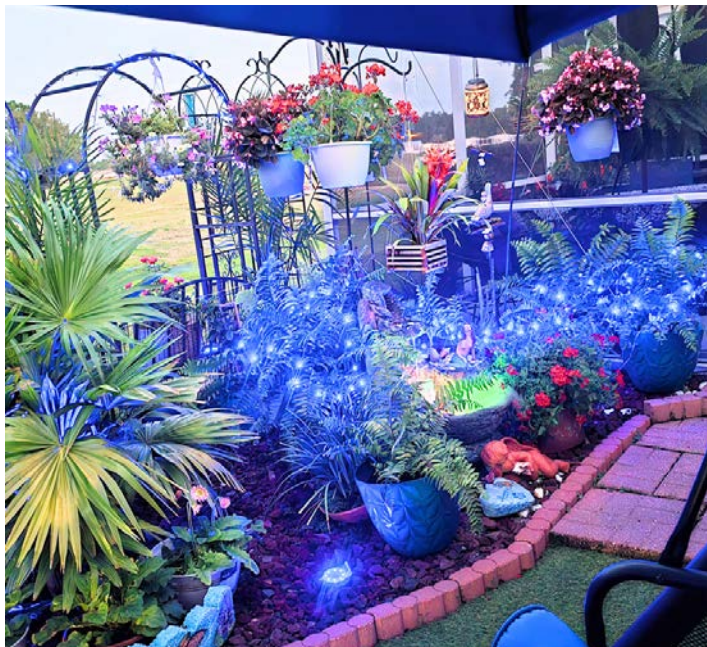

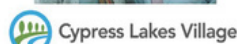

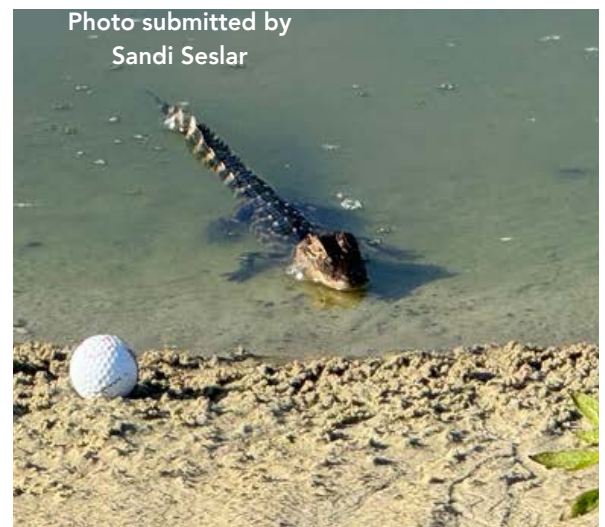

"BETWEEN THE LANES"

"Hi Friends and Neighbors...today, we would like to ask you, "Do you know the difference between what's polite and what's required by law when we drive...to keep us safe and keep the roads pleasant?

What is Traffic Law? Traffic laws are established by state law to ensure safety and are not optional. In our community, this includes stopping at stop signs, driving no faster than 15 MPH, and yielding to pedestrians in crosswalks. What is Traffic Etiquette? Traffic etiquette is about courtesy—the unwritten rules that help make driving more pleasant for everyone. For instance, you might let someone back out of a parking spot near the Clubhouse, avoid blocking driveways, or offer a friendly wave to thank another driver for being considerate.

Why Both Matter...laws keep everyone safe, while etiquette helps us maintain civility. By observing both, we reduce accidents, minimize stress, and create a better driving experience for all—especially as we share the road with pet walkers, cyclists, and pedestrians.

Quick Examples – Four-Way Stop – Traffic Law - First to arrive goes first; if tied, yield to the right Traffic Etiquette - Wave someone through if they seem unsure. Parking – Do not park in fire lanes or disability spots without a disability placard. Traffic Etiquette – Leave enough space to accommodate adaptive equipment for someone with a disability.

Safe Roundabout Travel – Traffic Law – Approaching: reduce speed, observe lane signs, signal. Entering: Use your right turn signal, once in motion, do not stop unless absolutely necessary; merge smoothly. Yield to vehicles to your left; check for pedestrians and cyclists; enter smoothly when there is a gap. Navigating: Stay in your lane while on the roundabout; maintain the speed limit; use your right turn signal before you exit. Exiting: Cautiously follow the lane to your exit; check your mirrors for blind spots as you exit. Use your right turn signal. Traffic Etiquette – Be kind and considerate to motorists who are new to the travel on a roundabout and having difficulty navigating - don't blow your horn unless absolutely necessary.

"Let's consider traffic laws the guardrails that protect us, while etiquette is the handshake that fosters friendliness. By following both, we help create safer and more enjoyable roads for everyone."

CITIZENS ASSISTED PATROL (CAP)

CAP is the eyes and ears of Cypress Lakes, but we are not law enforcement. We observe and report. Our cell phones can be used if we see something suspicious or if help is needed. We are all volunteers who reside in Cypress Lakes, full or part-time, and new volunteers are always appreciated. But if YOU see something suspicious or observe threatening behavior or a dangerous situation? CALL 911 IMMEDIATELY!

When patrolling the community, it is apparent that a number of homes are empty. If it's obvious to CAP patrols that nobody is living there, then it is obvious to others also. We provide House Checks (exterior and perimeter only) for residents who have requested them while they are away from Cypress Lakes. If not us, please make sure that someone is keeping an eye on your property and knows how to contact you.

We'd love your assistance too! North Gate is a prime spot to observe traffic up close and personal. Vendors attempt to enter and exit there, even though the clear and visible sign says 'For Residents Only'. Cars pull in to wait for the next car entering thinking they can piggy-back entry.

Be part of the solution to on-going safety in our community! Applications to join are available in the Oak Room and may be returned directly to the Sheriff's Department or through HOA. Remember there is no regular monthly meeting scheduled for August or September.

CERT

August is here at Cypress Lakes Village, and with it comes the heart of Florida's thunderstorm season. As many of you know, our state leads the nation in lightning strikes each year — and late summer is when activity peaks. A few simple precautions can help keep you and your neighbors safe during these fast-moving afternoon storms.

First, remember the rule: "When thunder roars, go indoors." If you can hear thunder, lightning is close enough to strike. Please avoid being outside during storms, especially on the golf course, walking the dogs, or riding in golf carts. Even brief exposure can be dangerous when lightning is nearby.

Second, once indoors, stay away from windows, plumbing, and corded electronics. Lightning can travel through wiring and pipes, so it's best to avoid showers, sinks, and plugged-in devices until the storm passes. If you rely on medical equipment, make sure you have a surge protector or battery backup in place.

Finally, keep an eye out for neighbors who may be caught outside when storms roll in. A quick call or text can help ensure everyone gets home safely before the weather turns. Florida storms can develop quickly, and a little awareness goes a long way.

Your Cypress Lakes Village CERT team is always working to keep our community prepared — but we need more volunteers to stay strong. No experience is required, just a willingness to help. Please consider joining our team. Thank you!

WHAT are the signs of Heat Stroke in my dog?

Racing Heart, High Body Temperature
Collapsing or Staggering, Seizures, Glassy Eye,
Fearful Expression (on dog NOT you), Heavy Panting,
Excessive Drooling, Red or Purple gums and tongue < Vomiting.

What do I do to protect my dog from Heat Stroke?

Restrict exercise; Walk your dog early morning or late evening when temperatures are normally lower.

NEVER leave your dog alone in a car....**NEVER!!!!**

Ensure your dog has plenty of fresh drinking water available at all times.

Always find a cool shady area for your dog to rest when walking

Let your dog play in water spray.

TOO LATE! My dog is suffering from a Heat Stroke?

Immediately move to a cooler spot. Offer small amounts of TAPID water. Using wet towels, douse your dog with cool water, NOT COLD. Place in the breeze of a fan. Contact your veterinarian or call an emergency pet care center IMMEDIATELY for further directions.
