Cypress Lakes Village- Rental Guidelines for Homeowners

Everyone needs to fill out an application if they are going to live in Cypress Lakes Village.

All renters must complete a Residency Application and be approved prior to arrival.

*Fill out application, pay the fee (\$50 US Citizen/\$150 non-US Citizen) and provide required income verification. *All renters must be at least 55 years old. Per the community rules and regulations there are no rentals allowed within the community for less than 30 days. Upon arrival your renter will need to stop at the Sales & Administration Office to obtain a car pass for the length of their stay. It is the homeowner's responsibility to call the front gate with the renter's information to gain access to the community. Renters do not get issued north gate cards.

Renters are required to follow all the community rules and regulations. A copy can be picked up at the Sales & Administration Office.

We also wanted to make sure everyone knows because of our liquor license we cannot have any liquor, beer or wine on premises that is not bought through the grill and because Department of Business Regulation and liability all food must be purchased from the grill or a licensed vendor that carries a certificate of insurance.

Residents' Concerns:

1. Residents not cleaning drains on the back of their house causing potential drainage issues.
2. Speeding is always number one.
3. Please pick up after your pet.
4. No bottles or glass at the pool.
5. Please do not put items at the end of the driveway, this is not allowed.

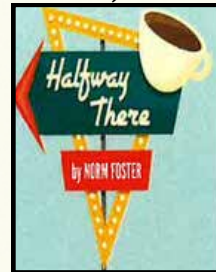

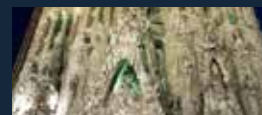

Tips for Clearing the Water on Hole #15

You can see the green, but there's one challenge standing between you and the flag: water. Hole #15 may be reachable in one well-executed shot, but the water hazard can make even a short approach feel intimidating

The key is to stay focused, trust your swing, and avoid letting the water become the center of your attention. Keep these simple tips in mind the next time you face this shot:

1. Pick a clear target on the green and focus on where you want the ball to land, not on the water in front of you.

2. Take a breath and stay relaxed. Accept the challenge, commit to your shot, and deal with the result only after the ball is in the air.

3. Keep your head down through impact. Lifting up too early can pull your body out of position, open the clubface, and reduce the distance of your shot.

4. Make a smooth, confident swing and stay committed from start to finish.

With the right mindset and a steady approach, Hole #15 becomes less about avoiding trouble and more about trusting your swing.

The summer season offers many opportunities to enjoy the Florida sunshine. This month, we would like to focus on safety in the high heat temperatures and courteous driving. Many residents are new to our community, so let's take proper precautions using common sense to help ensure a safe, healthy, and enjoyable season for everyone. What is the weather like today? Check the weather forecast before making plans for the day to be prepared for changing conditions and high temperatures. Dressing in layers can help you stay comfortable throughout the day. It is also a good idea to check whether any medications you take may increase sensitivity to sunlight. Plan your outdoor schedule to avoid the hottest parts of the day. Apply and take breaks in shaded or air-conditioned areas. Watch for symptoms in yourself, your teammates, and visitors for signs of heat-related illness, including heat exhaustion and heat stroke.

High Temperatures are Dangerous for Pets! Heat safety tips for pets: Don't walk them during peak sun hours (10 am to 4 pm) early morning or late evening is cooler and safer. Use the "touch test": slip off your sandal, place your foot on the pavement for 7 seconds...too hot for you then too hot for your pet! Keep your pet hydrated: bring water on walks and offer it regularly. Never leave your pet tied up outside at your home, or alone in a car or golf cart —"How Hot Is Too Hot for a Walk?" 60-70°F Safe; 75°F Walk in Grass; 80°F+ Asphalt Burns Your Feet and Paws! Take Those Photos! Your family member may experience memory impairment or dementia. A great and effective tip: take a photograph each day for someone who is at risk of wandering to provide an accurate reference for identification! Arrange for a "neighborhood buddy" to visit and spend time with them at scheduled times to encourage social interaction. Look to our wonderful Neighbor-to-Neighbor group for suggestions. This is the perfect time to double-check your preparedness plans and make sure everything is in order. First, take a moment to review your emergency supplies. Batteries, flashlights, medications, pet items, and bottled water should all be refreshed and easy to access. If you created a Hurricane "GO" Bag earlier in the season, make sure nothing inside has expired and that your important documents are still up to date.

Second, please verify your communication plan. Make sure neighbors know if you are traveling, and ensure your emergency contact information is posted somewhere visible inside your home. A simple printed sheet near the front door can help responders tremendously if they need to assist you during a storm or medical emergency. Finally, remember that preparedness is a shared responsibility. Check in on neighbors who may be new to Florida or who live alone. A quick conversation can help ensure everyone is ready should a storm approach. Even small steps — securing outdoor furniture, clearing debris, or charging devices — can make a big difference. Your Cypress Lakes Village CERT team remains committed to keeping our community informed and prepared. We are always looking for new volunteers, and no experience is required — just a willingness to help your neighbors. Our next meeting is Wednesday, September 30, 2026 at 7:00pm in the Oak Room. Living with Alligators – Information from Florida Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC)



Alligators are an important part of Florida's landscape and play a valuable role in the ecology of our state's wetlands. Alligators are predators and help keep other aquatic animal populations in balance. A better understanding of the facts and information regarding these creatures will help ensure that people and alligators can continue to coexist.

Alligators & People

Alligators are a fundamental part of Florida's wetlands, swamps, rivers and lakes, and they are found in all 67 counties. Florida continues to experience human population growth. Many new residents seek waterfront homes, resulting in increased interactions between people and alligators.

Although most Floridians understand that we have alligators living in our state, the potential for conflict exists. Because of their predatory nature, alligators may target pets and livestock as prey.

****PLEASE KEEP YOUR PET ON A LEASH AND NEVER LEAVE PETS UNATTENDED**
[**Note from CL Management per the Community Rules and Regulations]

In the past 10 years, the Florida FWC has received an average of nearly 16,000 alligator-related complaints per year. Most of these complaints deal with alligators occurring in places such as backyard ponds, canals, ditches and streams, but other conflicts occur when alligators wander into garages, swimming pools and golf course ponds. Sometimes, alligators come out of the water to bask in the sun or move between wetlands. In many cases, if left alone, these alligators will eventually move on to areas away from people.

Safety Tips

- Generally, alligators less than four feet in length are not large enough to be dangerous unless handled.
- Be aware of the possibility of alligators when you are in or near fresh or brackish water. Bites may occur when people do not pay close enough attention to their surroundings when working or recreating near water.
- Do not swim outside of posted swimming areas or in waters that might be inhabited by large alligators.
- Alligators are most active between dusk and dawn. Therefore, avoid swimming at night.
- Dogs and cats are similar in size to the natural prey of alligators. Don't allow pets to swim, exercise or drink in or near waters that may contain alligators.
- Leave alligators alone. State law prohibits killing, harassing or possessing alligators. Handling even small alligators can result in injury.
- Never feed alligators – it's dangerous and illegal. When fed, alligators can overcome their natural wariness and learn to associate people with food. When this happens, some of these alligators have to be removed and killed.
- Observe and photograph alligators only from a distance. Remember, they're an important part of Florida's natural history as well as an integral component of aquatic ecosystems.

****One of the best things about Cypress Lakes is the wildlife ... However, SAFETY FIRST, Always! Residents should educate your guests.** If you feel an alligator is aggressive or has lost its fear of humans, please call the **Cypress Lakes Office** and Management will address this. [**Note from CL Management]

Please be aware that "nuisance" alligators are destroyed, not relocated.
