HELLO SEPTEMBER!!! I realized when typing this letter, how fast time moves as the years go by. We tend to start moving slower, but time moves faster. This summer has just flown by! Schools are back in session, and the school buses are running. You can start to feel the change in the air.

It has been an unusually hot and dry summer, water levels are down quite a bit, which has caused the boat ramp to be closed, obstacles that have previously been underwater in the rivers and lakes are now exposed to boat traffic. Please use caution when out enjoying our lakes. The last measurement of the low water was around 14" down. Lake County is still under a Phase III Water shortage declaration. This limits our watering to once per week. It is starting to rain a little bit more each day, so hopefully we will start getting that much needed rain.

Please remember that if you have a maintenance issue or have a question regarding an issue you have noticed in the park, please contact the office to put in a work order so it can be addressed. Please don't post it on Facebook and expect it to be addressed.

Site Inspections are ongoing and will be completed quarterly. Please address any known issues at your site before your inspection is completed. Remember even if you are not on property, it is your responsibility to make sure your property is well maintained. Understanding and commitment in addressing these items and presenting your site/home at its best is greatly appreciated. Our maintenance team is busy cleaning the exterior of the buildings, painting, and doing general repairs to help with beautification of our community.

Projects: Café rehab is once again moving forward, and the hope is, it will be completed quickly. The WWTP is in the process of having extensive upgrades and repairs. We have installed new streetlights in some areas of the community in the low light areas around the outer parkway, new lights have been put in at the mini golf. New ceiling fans installed at the marina outdoor area. Interim repairs are being made on the boat docks for safety, until the replacements take place. New Pool furniture and Marina outdoor seating furniture have been ordered. Comfort station roof replacements and the cornhole umbrella installs are still in progress, there are several other projects that are in the initial stages and updates will be provided as they become available.

Our Lifestyles office has been busy bringing in Food Trucks, and keeping us moving this summer, scheduling dances, shows, and excitement for the upcoming season.

We are all excited to have our friends and neighbors return for the 2026/2027 season, the park will be filling up before we know it.

Veteran Spotlight

Salvatore "Sal" Coriale
United States Army 1978-1981

Sal is from Utica, NY and entered the U.S. Army in 1978 after graduating high school at 17 years old. He went to Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri for his Basic Training and AIT, Heavy Equipment and Truck Driver Training. From there he was stationed at West Point, NY for the 528th Engineer Detachment - supporting Basic Operations like building fire breaks at Bear Mountain, plowing roads, Honor Guards at State Fairs, summer Basic Training for the Plebs (first year Cadets), supporting Cadets during their first year field training, preparing for USO shows and building the stage at Michie Stadium.

Sal remained at West Point until his discharge in 1981 as an E4 and he returned to Utica. Sal married in 1982, together he and his wife had 3 children and 5 grandchildren. He worked in the family funeral home business until 1993 then moved to Florida and continued working in local funeral home businesses. Due to his wife's health, Sal retired in 2020, caring for her until her passing in 2022. They had been married 40 years.

Sal moved to Holiday in 2023. Grieving his wife, family friend and former coworker Pam was a "Godsend" to him says Sal. Their companionship grew and Pam moved to Holiday in 2024 with him. They enjoy attending the park dances and Veterans events.

Preemptive

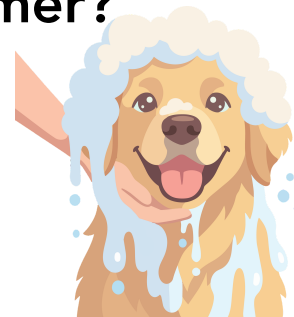
Our Community Health Nurse is available onsite here at Holiday RV every 3rd Monday 1-4pm at the Sports Center, (September 21).

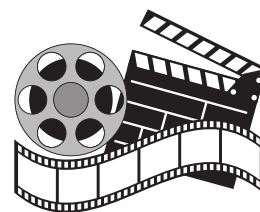
