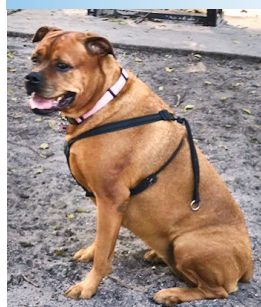

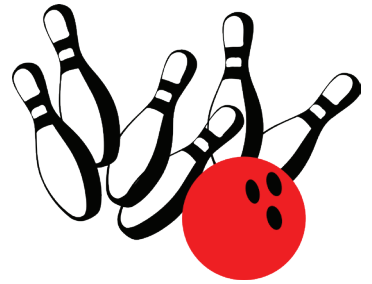
Hello Residents! Have you joined the FMO? What is FMO? FMO is the Federation of Manufactured Home Owners. Why should you join? FMO is the

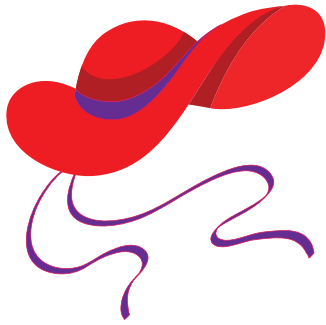
Site Improvements

Residents wanting to make any exterior home or yard improvements or alterations must have written approval. This is required for:

- Exterior painting
- Tree trimming, tree or shrub planting or removal
- New or expanded landscape beds or gardens
- Roof replacement
- Carport fencing
- Room additions
- Concrete work including driveway expansions
- Patio blocks or pavers
- Other exterior work (call office)

Please come to the Office to pick up an updated SITE IMPROVEMENT APPLICATION. Exterior work MUST BE APPROVED before any work is to

begin. Be sure to list the estimated start and end dates of your project and allow at least 10 business days for the Architectural Control Committee (ACC) to schedule a visit. Exterior painting: Stop by the Office to see our color board. These are approved base colors for siding. For all other exterior painting (trim, shutters, doors, etc.), please attach a color sample of your choice. **Residents are responsible for maintaining all the trees on their lot. Storage containers are allowed under the carport only (not in yards).** NOTE: In addition to completing Bear Creek's Site Improvement Application, many homesite alterations require a permit from the City of Ormond Beach, including electrical or plumbing work, room additions, decks, new roof, new windows, etc. Please visit www.ormondbeach.org, then click on Departments > Building/Permits for more information.

Recipe of the Month: Shrimp Scampi with Linguini



Ingredients

- 1 pound linguini
- 1 pound shrimp (uncooked), peeled and deveined
- ½ cup dry white wine
- ¼ cup parsley, finely chopped
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 4 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for drizzling
- 2 shallots, finely diced
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- Juice of 1 lemon
- Pinch of red pepper flakes
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper

Directions

1. For the pasta, put a large pot of water on the stove to boil. When it has come to the boil, add a couple of tablespoons of salt and the linguini. Stir to make sure the pasta separates; cover. When the water returns to a boil, cook for about 6 to 8 minutes or until the pasta is not quite done. Drain the pasta.
2. Meanwhile, in a large skillet, melt 2 tablespoons butter in 2 tablespoons olive oil over medium-high heat. Sauté the shallots, garlic, and red pepper flakes (if using) until the shallots are translucent, about 3 to 4 minutes.
3. Season the shrimp with salt and pepper; add them to the pan and cook until they have turned pink, about 2 to 3 minutes. Remove the shrimp from the pan; set aside and keep warm.
4. Add wine and lemon juice and bring to a boil. Add 2 tablespoons butter and 2 tablespoons oil. When the butter has melted, return the shrimp to the pan along with the parsley and cooked pasta.
5. Stir well and season with salt and pepper. Drizzle over a bit more olive oil and serve immediately.
