The Divisions:

- Catch your prized fish, but remember, it's catch and release only! We won't tell if you keep a fish that's within the appropriate Florida regulations.

- Take a photo of your catch with the approved resort ruler and submit it within 1 hour or as soon as you get cell reception.

Rules and Regulations:

- All competitors must have a valid Florida fishing license.
- Only registered competitors can submit catches.
- Stay within tournament boundaries and launch from our dock.
- No fishing from docks, piers, or fixed structures.
- All decisions made by Chokoloskee Island Resort are final.



Prizes and Awards:

Prizes will be awarded based on the total length of catches in the Inshore, Women's, Kids, and Kayak divisions, while the Trash division will reward the most impactful cleanup efforts. Don't miss the 100 Days in Chokoloskee Awards BBQ on September 7th at 5pm, where winners will be celebrated!



On The Water Report:

Happy July everyone. Well we wanted it, and we got it. RAIN, and plenty of it, over 20" last week and now, the afternoons. So I think the rainy season has started. It was effected the bite, especially the bait. The only bait that has been around are finger mullet and a few Thread Fin Herring. Pilchards just started coming back around some outer islands. The Snook bite has been hit or miss. Most of the Snook have been caught on soft plastics or swim baits. Rattle Traps have been working great on Snook, quite a few overslot were being caught as well. The Redfish have been scattered and are being caught as well on artificials. Seatrout have been caught on the same bait. Quite a few Tarpon have been around the marina, and throughout the islands. Small ones to really big ones have been fooled by artificials, along with cut bait. Also if you can make it offshore the fish are there: Snappers, Groupers, and Mackerals, and they're hitting live bait, flutter jigs, and cut baits. So watch the weather and the wind and get out there with the family. Don't forget to sign up for our 100 Days of Chokoloskee fishing tournament. It ends August 31st, and has great prizes. 
