

Helpful Tips for Summer Golf

Summer is arguably the best season for golf, with an abundance of sunshine and daylight hours. It's also hot on and off the golf course. Perhaps very hot. Following is a handful of tips for dealing with the heat and enjoying golf to the fullest in the good old summertime.

<u>Drink lots of water to stay hydrated</u>-It's essential to drink plenty of water in hot weather. Remember, water is the best fluid for your body, hands down. Playing in the summer heat will suck the moisture right out of you, bring plenty of water with you and take advantage of the water stations around the course. It will help you to stay hydrated and keep your body cool. Another smart tip: Start drinking water before you arrive at the golf course.

<u>Wear sunscreen</u>-Protect your skin from harmful UV rays by slathering on sunscreen. For sunny, hot, and humid days, the American Academy of Dermatology recommends a sunscreen with an SPF (sun protection factor) of at least 30. Reapply sunscreen at the turn or every hour or two. Protective lip balm is also a good idea. Don't forget your sunglasses, your eyes can get a sunburn too!

<u>Carry a towel</u>-Sweat happens. Keep a towel handy to wipe the perspiration from your hands and grips so the clubs don't slip mid swing. You can also wet the towel and use it to keep your neck and head cool in extreme heat.

Be aware of how you feel-Heat stroke is dangerous. Know the signs of dehydration and heat exhaustion: weakness, headache, muscle cramps, irritability, nausea, vomiting, light-headedness, feeling hot on head and neck, dry and sticky mouth, tiredness, lack of sweating and rapid heartbeat. Have a cell phone handy in case of an emergency.

<u>Avoid Lightning</u>-Find shelter or simply get off the golf course when lightning is in the area. Golf carts and trees are not safe spots during thunderstorms <u>Be social</u>-Play lots of summer golf with your friends. And make new ones.

Tip of the month for July

To make more putts, try this little drill. Find a putt that you can make ten in a row. It may be only a foot long

but hopefully 2 to 3 feet from the hole. Practice that putt until you can make ten in a row consistently. Now use that stroke for all putts simply lengthening the backswing slightly for longer putts. Get in the habit of making ten in a row before each round of golf and before each practice session. The repetition will train your mind to deliver that stroke while playing in your big match. Once confident that you can make several in a row, one becomes very easy. Good Luck!

1.Tee. One player on the tee at a time. Stand even with the ball well outside of the teeing ground, left or right, while each player hits. This also applies to golf bag and equipment placement around the tee. It is a breach of etiquette to stand behind a golfer on the tee, or anywhere else on the golf course. (See Section I: The Rules of Golf) No golf-er should have to ask you to move out of the way anywhere on the course, but especially on the tee, where players are concentrated like nowhere else. If you are a following foursome and arrive at a tee already occupied by the group in front, wait well off the tee for your turn. Joining them on the tee to watch the shots is a breach of etiquette, but if you do, follow the positioning rule above, at the very least. Always, remove your peg from the tee after the ground or to leave it embedded in the teeing ground.



There have been several reports of people speeding and passing cars and carts on the left creating a very dangerous situation. Please slow down and stop at stop signs. The 98N project is well underway and remember the speed limit is 45 MPH and fines are doubled in work areas. Please remember that you and only you can make CLV a better place to live and enjoy life.

"The Heat is On" Cypress Lakes Village! As we are in the heart of summertime, activities will transition to early morning and evening.

It is important to stay hydrated (with water, LOL) while outdoors. According to the US National Academies of Sciences, Engineering and Medicine, the recommended daily water intake for adults is 11.5 cups (2.7 litres) for women and 15.5 cups (3.7 litres) for men. However, you can also estimate your water needs by dividing your weight in pounds by two. For example, if you weigh 150 pounds, you should drink about 75 ounces.(slightly more than 9 cups) of water daily. But note that in this heat, your body will need more than the recommended amounts.

In the event of emergency situations, weather events or critical community alerts, county officials will call you! Fill out this card, available in the Oak Room, and stay in touch with important information emailed, texted or called to your cell phone or land line! There is a second card to fill out for our community only information. This card is also in the Oak Room and can be returned to the HOA Office.

Though our seasonal residents are gone, there's still plenty of traffic and the need for you to exercise caution and good judgment while driving. Don't pass on curves or when it's specifically marked. Please proceed slowly and when passing parked vehicles at the clubhouse, as well as, abiding by the 15 mph speed limit signs. Remember that stop signs apply to cars and golf carts. Bicyclists should always be aware of their surroundings. Walkers should walk single file in the roadways and wear reflective clothes.

The regular monthly Cypress Lakes CAP meeting will be Tuesday, July 9 at 10 am in the Oak Room. House Checks continue through the summer months and several teams are prepared to do perimeter checks once weekly. We have reviewed our first aid and safety supplies and have prepared our short list of roster members who will be on site during the summer months. Though CAP is only activated through the CERT program, we are instrumental in support of their efforts for community safety in case of storm emergencies. Make sure YOU are prepared, as well! "BETWEEN THE LANES"

The mission of Courtesy Patrol is to provide a secure, quick and pleasant entry experience into Cypress Lakes Village for our residents, guests, visitors and contractors, with accuracy and accountability and an emphasis on safety.

As we enter the "dog days of summer", we would like to ask, "Do You Know Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety?" Many Cypress Lakes Village residents and visitors enjoy bicycle rides. Unfortunately, pedestrian and bicycle injuries and fatalities remain high. According to the GHSA's (Governors Highway Safety Association) annual Spotlight on Highway Safety Report, in 2023, many pedestrians and bicyclists were killed while walking or crossing roadways nationwide. Courtesy Patrol would like to raise awareness of the dangers to both the pedestrians, bicyclists and the driver while providing tips to keep everyone safe. Everyone Is a Pedestrian!

We all have different preferences when it comes to transportation, but at one time or another, everyone is a pedestrian! When walkers practice safety tips and drivers maintain safe speeds and practice other safe driving behaviors, safer walking environments are created for everyone in our community.

Safety Tips for Walkers:

- > Follow the rules of the road and obey signs and signals.
- > Walk facing traffic and stay out of the path of oncoming traffic.
- > Cross streets at crosswalks or intersections. Look for vehicles in all directions, including those turning left or right.
- > If a crosswalk or intersection is not available, locate a well-lit area where you have the best view of traffic. Wait for a gap in traffic that allows enough time to cross safely; continue watching for traffic as you cross...especially when walking your pet.
- > Wear high visibility clothing and carry a flashlight when walking your pet after dark.
- > Watch for cars entering or exiting driveways or backing up in parking lots.
- > Avoid alcohol and drugs when walking; these impair your abilities and your judgment. Safety Tips for Bicyclists in Florida:
- > Make sure all equipment on the bicycle is in working order (brakes, gears, tires, etc.).
- > Wear a helmet if you are under age 16.
- > Wear appropriate shoes (such as sneakers).
- > Be seen wear bright colors and reflective clothing at night and have a light on your bicycle
- > Ride in the same direction as traffic and stay as far to the right as possible.
- > All bicyclists must obey traffic controls, signs and signals. Do not cycle through stop signs or expect vehicles to give you the right of way!

Safety Tips for Drivers of Vehicles and Golf Carts:

- > Look out for pedestrians and bicyclists everywhere, always...especially dog walkers.
- > Use extra caution when driving in low visibility conditions, such as nighttime or foggy bad weather.
- > Observe the 15 mile per hour speed limit and stop at all stop signs.
- > Do not pass on double yellow lines, particularly over our bridges and at our crosswalks...look for pedestrians crossing a bridge, maybe admiring the wildlife.
- > Slow down and be prepared to stop when entering a crosswalk such as in front of the Grill.
- > Yield to pedestrians and stop far back from a crosswalk to give other vehicles an opportunity to see the crossing pedestrians so they can stop, too. Pedestrians should never have to run to get out of your way!
- > Never pass a vehicle stopped at a crosswalk. There may be people crossing where you can't see. Be patient and stay in your lane.
- > Never drive under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs; these impair your abilities and your judgment.
- > Be extra cautious when backing up out of driveways and at our community buildings. Look for pedestrians and dog walkers.

Let's have a safe and happy summer...as we share our roads, "between the lanes."
