Reminder

Swing Tip of the Month

What is your critical error? What is it about your set up or swing that starts in motion a series of compensating moves that makes golf hard? The most common Critical Errors that we see are poor alignment and a late turn/weight transfer. Why do we all want to aim to the right? Open up, aim more left and watch that ball sail higher and "righter". Aim Left Swing Right could be your new mantra. An open stance is so much easier to finish facing target and promotes a natural weight transfer. No more swinging up on the ball and falling back after contact.

What Does the 90-Degree Rule Actually Mean? If you see a sign that reads "90-degree rule in effect today," or something similar, the meaning is really not as ominous as it may seem. All this sign, or the helpful attendant at the pro shop, means is to please keep your golf cart on the path, except for a right angle turn across the fairway directly toward your ball and back. Rather than drive directly to your ball, it's asked that you drive straight back to the path and repeat the process each time. This helps to limit the stress on the fairway.

CERT

Welcome to March! Your Cypress Lakes Village CERT met at the end of January and will meet again this month. Meetings are the last Monday every other month at 6:30pm in the Arts and Crafts Room of the Clubhouse. March's meeting will focus on triaging and assessing the injured after an incident. Even someone with no medical training can learn these basic techniques, so come join us!

As we inch closer to the severe weather season (not sure it really took a break this year), it is important to always have a plan. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) has some tips for mobile home residents.

Before severe weather, we should all identify a safe place to evacuate to, and know multiple routes to that location in case of road closures. Remember that our clubhouse is not approved as a shelter, so a place outside the community should be considered. Be "weather aware" at all times, checking local weather forecasts and having weather apps on our phones that will sound when weather threatens. The day before the severe weather is the time to prepare to execute your plan. Make sure vehicles are filled up with fuel, or secure transportation with family or friends. Help neighbors prepare and verify your safe place will be open/accessible. Also make sure to coordinate with family and friends to synch up all plans.

If the weather is severe enough to cause a tornado watch and storms are headed for the area, this is the time to execute your plan. Stay informed of updates to the weather, especially all watches and warnings. Communicate with family and friends so they know your situation and status. If a tornado warning is issued and you haven't evacuated, it may too late. Last resort options from NOAA include "...driving away (seatbelt on) to a sturdy structure or moving to a protected area outside shielded from potential debris or flooding" Stay safe and "Weather Alert"! "BETWEEN THE LANES"

This month Courtesy Patrol would like to address questions you might ask when communicating with Courtesy Patrol...

<u>"How do I notify the Gatehouse I have a visitor or</u> <u>delivery coming to my home?"</u> The Gatehouse phone number is 863-859-7275. Please call and notify us as soon as you know there is someone from the outside public coming to your home or the clubhouse to attend your meeting/function/event. We have Daily Logs to note this information plus a Pre-log Book to note your contractors, deliveries, guest list for your future meeting/function/event, guests, and visitors as far away as 3 months.

<u>"Why doesn't someone answer my call?"</u> The Courtesy Patrol Team will make every effort to answer your phone call "with a smile in welcoming style" but sometimes if they are issuing a pass for your contractor, vendor, or guest in the Visitor Lane, this is impossible. Please leave a complete message with the name of your contractor, vendor, or guest and your address so we can be prepared to note this on our Daily Logs or in the Pre-Log Book..

<u>"What do I do if my visitor is staying longer than 24 hours?"</u> The 24-hour pass can extend for 2 days. The Multi-Day Pass encompasses a visit from 3 to 29 days. A Multi-Day Form must be obtained from the Gatehouse to be completed and signed by the Homeowner for these passes. The pass does take some time to prepare, so the Courtesy Patrol Team asks that you request the pass at least 3 days prior to their arrival. The pass will be completed and waiting for them in the Gatehouse.

<u>"What do I do when the phones are down, and I</u> <u>cannot get through to the Gatehouse to call in my</u> <u>visitor or contractor?"</u> Sometimes the internet goes down and when this happens, the phones go down. You may call me, Bonnie, on my cell phone at 209-2887 and be assured that I will pass your guest and vendor information to the Gatehouse immediately. <u>"What do I do if my guest wants to extend their stay</u> <u>past 29 days?"</u> Contact me, Bonnie, on my cell phone at 209-2887 to see what the circumstances are behind this decision.

<u>"What if my guest loves it here and want to rent my</u> <u>home?"</u> Homeowners who want to rent their home need to give Community Management notice of such intention prior to the intended start of the rental. An Application for Residency, eviction history, and background check must be completed and approved by Community Management with applicable fees paid and upon approval, a prospectus and a copy of the Rules and Regulations delivered with a Rental Agreement signed prior to the renter residing in your home within Cypress Lakes Village.

<u>"What if I want to rent out my home for short term</u> <u>stays such as an Air B&B?"</u> The rental of your home in the community must be for a minimum period of 30 days and this is strictly enforced. Homeowners are prohibited from advertising in any media, including web-based media, offers to rent their home for periods of less than 30 days.

Living with Alligators - Information from Florida Wildlife **Conservation Commission (FWC)** Alligators are an important part of Florida's landscape and

play a valuable role in the ecology of our state's wetlands. Alligators are predators and help keep other aquatic animal populations in balance. A better understanding of the facts and information regarding these creatures will help ensure that people and alligators can continue to coexist.

Alligators & People

Alligators are a fundamental part of Florida's wetlands, swamps, rivers, and lakes, and they are found in all 67 counties. Florida continues to experience human population growth. Many new residents seek waterfront homes, resulting in increased interactions between people and alligators. Although most Floridians understand that we have alligators living in our state, the potential for conflict exists. Because of their predatory nature, alligators may target pets and livestock as prey.

**PLEASE KEEP YOUR PET ON A LEASH AND NEVER LEAVE PETS UNATTENDED

[**Note from CL Management per the Community Rules and Regulations]

In the past 10 years, the Florida FWC has received an average of nearly 16,000 alligator-related complaints per year. Most of these complaints deal with alligators occurring in places such as backyard ponds, canals, ditches and streams, but other conflicts occur when alligators wander into garages, swimming pools and golf course ponds. Sometimes, alligators come out of the water to bask in the sun or move between wetlands. In many cases, if left alone, these alligators will eventually move on to areas away from people.

Generally, alligators less than four feet in length are not large enough to be dangerous unless handled

... However, SAFETY FIRST, Always! Residents should educate their quests.

If you feel an alligator is aggressive or has lost its fear of humans, please call the Cypress Lakes office and Management will address this. [**Note from CL

Management]

Please be aware that "nuisance" alligators are destroyed, not relocated. Visit MyFWC.com/Gators for more information.




