HOA NEWS

Great News! The HOA has opened an escrow account with corporate attorney, Bradford Tropello, Judicious Law, P.A. of Ocala. Mr. Tropello advised that RGV HOA has no authority to approve or contest golf fees as fees are detailed in the prospectus. Tropello encouraged residents to consult personal attorneys regarding conflict with consumer protection laws. Accordingly, the HOA will remain silent on the issue. If golf fees are unreasonably increased in the future, the board of directors could request negotiation at that time.

December's new directors Rick Scott, Tim Masters and Bob Wroblewski completed the FMO training conducted on February 7th. Bob Senge completed the refresher course since his service as HOA director.

HOA President, Dianne Wieckert will attend the Marion County Sheriffs' 7 week Citizens Academy Program to develop a better working relationship with the Sheriffs' Office on behalf RGV. Deputies do much more than respond to traffic accidents and arrest criminals, and the course will provide the board with knowledge of varied services.

Four members of the HOA were appointed to serve as Rolling Greens representatives to our local FMO district, which is steadily decreasing. The decrease is a concern as we rely on FMO advocates in Tallahassee to assist in pushing desired legislation or objections to adverse legislation as it effects residents of 55+ mobile home parks.

Charles Pennington, Mike Loewenstein, Rick Scott and Dianne Wieckert will attend the monthly meetings held at various mobile home parks, providing RGV valuable information and dialogue with local MH parks.

The FMO is our voice in Tallahassee so we encourage all RFV residents to pay the \$30/year dues to help prevent unwanted changes. An application form is included in this issue of the newsletter. You will need 5 scores in to have an accurate handicap. For all leagues, in the Pro Shop on the back table, we have sign-up sheets where you need to write your name down to play for each league. The morning of the league, you will sign in at the back table. There will be a person who is running the league who will get you set-up.

This past month we took a group to play a Home vs. Home match to Big Cypress in Lakeland. The golf course was in great shape, the greens at speeds that most guys were not accustomed to. Overall, everyone had a great time, and staff there could not have been nicer. The sad part is that we came up a little short and lost by 5 points. A lot of members and guests are showing up in denim, which is not appropriate golf attire, so golf staff has been instructed to refuse you the right to play. It is in the rules and regulations. Please don't be that person! Several golfers are taking advantage of the cart rules. Unless you have a handicap flag on your cart, it is cart path ONLY on par 3's and 90 degrees on par 4's. A handicap flag doesn't permit you to drive up on the back of tee boxes on the apron of the green. Even with a handicap flag, there are specific rules. You must stay at least 6 feet for any tee box and green apron.
