News from Strawberry Ridge Village Office

I would like to take the opportunity to introduce myself as your new community manager. I grew up in Indianapolis, IN and went on to Purdue University, I graduated with a BS in Hospitality Management. I have 20+ years managing hotels, Airbnb units, RV Parks and MH communities. My door is always open, so feel free to stop in and say hello or express any concerns that you may have.

In my first week on property, it has been a pleasure to meet those of you who I have spoken with. I understand your frustration with the lack of communication from prior management and the length of time that some of the current issues have taken. I have set 3 priorities that I am currently working on to complete. The first of these is the gate issue. As of today, we are waiting on the Fire Marshall to approve the emergency knock boxes that have been installed to gain access to the community. The second of the issues is the condition of outdoor pool and surrounding areas. I have instructed my team that this area is a focus area and that it should be clean and ready for use daily. I am in the process of getting approved for some new furniture for the area. The last of the priorities is the 3 lift stations around the community. Currently, we are having two of the pump motors being rebuilt. We have been loaned temporary pumps until ours are rebuilt. My team will be checking the stations daily to ensure they are functioning properly.

I know there are several other areas that need addressed but this is where I am going to start. I welcome your feedback or suggestions but please understand that managing a park this size, there are lots of opinions and some oppose each other. I look forward to helping make Strawberry Ridge Village a great place to live.

Welcome to the beautiful May!

With summer just ahead I would like to talk a little about "Water Billing". As the temperatures rise and things dry out, I know everyone wants to keep their yards looking beautiful by watering. This is a "double edge" sword, meaning...watering will cost you more money on your bill, but at the same time you want to keep your yard looking wonderful. Please keep this in mind when you get your invoices each month and if your water bill is higher than normal, please assess your situation before calling or coming to the office. Remember, if you do pressure washing, extra laundry, wash your cars...anything that uses your water it will affect your bill. Also, if any of those chores are completed in the previous month, it will show up on your next invoice. Example: If you did these chores in April, it would show up on your May invoice, etc.

I also want to let everyone know you can still sign up for the "Portal". I highly recommend this because you can look at your statement at anytime after it is released. You do not have to pay through the portal if you choose not to, but it is a very nice tool for you guys to use. Just an FYI, we currently have 140 units out of 867 units that now pay through the portal. Check with your neighbors and friends to see if they use it and I bet they will make a believer out of you. CD was rolled over for a 7month maturity with 4.75% interest. Easter lunch cost a total of \$546.57. Treasurer's Report accepted by the membership.

PRESIDENT'S AND BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS:

Stated that March meeting was the Annual meeting as there had been some questions. Annual Report has been filed with Sunbiz. What is C.E.R.T.? It is **C**ommunity **E**mergency **R**esponse **T**eam. Are you a member of the Strawberry Ridge Village CERT Team? If not, why aren't you. Just what does this team do for our residents. Well, in the event of a power failure, the CERT Team will make sure those people affected will have a meal which is prepared by our team. If tree limbs come down, we try to get them out of way so cars can get through. There are many other things we do which is too much to list. Why not come to our meeting and ask and learn more about us. We meet 1 evening each month always the second Thursday of the month at 6:30 pm in the Activity Center. Our next meeting will be on May 9th.

Now do you know how C.E.R.T. got started? Well read the below history and learn more.

History of C.E.R.T.

The CERT concept was developed and implemented by the Los Angeles City Fire Department in 1985. The Whittier Narrows earthquake in 1987 underscored the area-wide threat of a major disaster in California. Further, it confirmed the need for training civilians to meet their immediate needs.

CERT became a national program in 1993. There are now CERT programs in all 50 states, including many tribal nations and U.S. territories. Each is unique to its community and all are essential to building a Culture of Preparedness in the United States. There are over 2,700 local CERT programs nationwide and more than 600,000 people have trained since CERT became a national program.

Now once you have read this, you will want to learn more and join us in caring for our community.

Donations of the mentioned items are also accepted. There are limits on the type of supplies we can accept. We cannot accept respiratory items, diapers, walking boots, medications, stability belts or other disposable items. All that we ask is that when returning borrowed items or donating items please ensure that all items have been cleaned and are fully operational. The volunteer staff does not have the ability to clean or repair any items. Presently, the Lending Closet is in short supply of Rollator Walkers. Any donation of or return of one no longer needed would be appreciated.




