RV Storage

- If you are a renter you are not eligible for a storage site.
- Please bring into the office a copy of the new tag registration and insurance for your RV, trailer, or boat. If you are no longer using your storage site or will be selling your home and have a site, please let the office know so we can assign your site to one of our many waiting residents.

Dogs

- If a dog that bites another dog or person causes damage the owner of the dog is responsible for the medical bills.

Violation Letters

- The majority of violations sent to residents involve the following three Prospectus rules.

1. Unauthorized people living in homes. All individuals must be registered at the front office, with a copy of the application in the homeowner's file.

2. Unleashed and vicious dogs. All dogs and cats must be registered at the front office, with a copy of vaccines in the owner's file. If a dog is not on a lease and attacks another dog or person, Management has the right to have the dog removed from the community.

3. Unacceptable behavior from residents. Nasty, abusive, or harassing behavior will not be tolerated by any resident.

If you receive three violations for noncompliance of the rules, you will be sent to legal for possible eviction. Please read your Prospectus, there are many more rules that if you do not abide by them, you could receive a violation. Let's all enjoy this beautiful community we live in and the wonderful people who live here. Be Kind!

A Reminder

- Everyone living in your home needs to be approved and fill out an application to live in the home. If you are renting your home, they must have a background check done before they can rent.
- When you are paying your rent, please make sure you have your lot number or your address on the check or money order.
- Lot rent is due on the 1st of the month but must be paid by the 10th of the month. If not there's a \$15.00 late charge, then after the 25th of the month there is an additional \$10.00 late charge.

1. Yellow card - printed on the front

INSTRUCTIONS: *1. *2. *3.

- If you are at home, place the "Hurricane Preparedness Complete" sign on the inside of a window that can be seen from the street.
- As soon as the storm passes, flip the sign to show "Thumb Up" if you are OK.
- If you need assistance, flip the sign to show "Thumb Down".
- Fold the card in half and be sure the proper image can be read from the street.

Street Parking

- Parking on the street is not allowed per 911. Please Park your vehicles on your driveway or in the overflow area. Do not park your vehicles on your lawns.

If you have some borrowed books at home that you've finished reading, please return them to the library for other residents to enjoy. We always appreciate the donations from the residents.

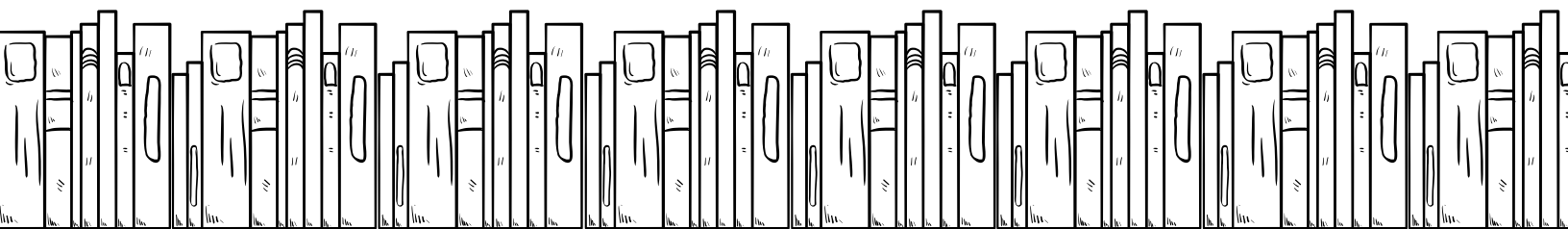
Also, any current magazines would be appreciated.
